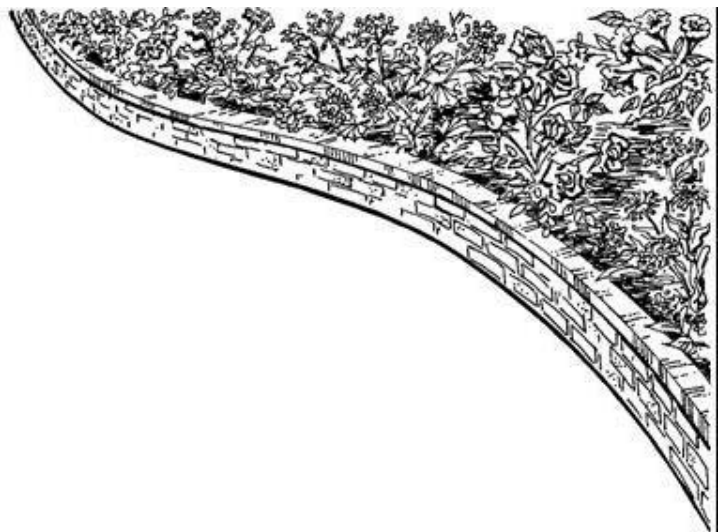
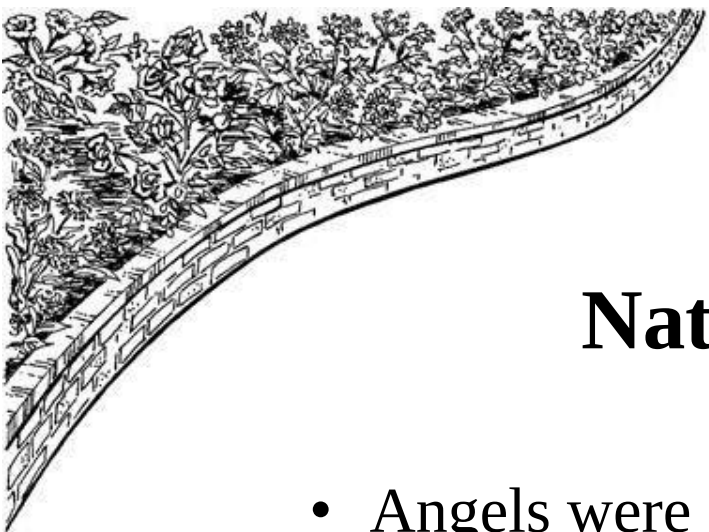
Believing in the existence and role of God's angels as His obedient servants, who carry out His commands and record human deeds without possessing any divinity.



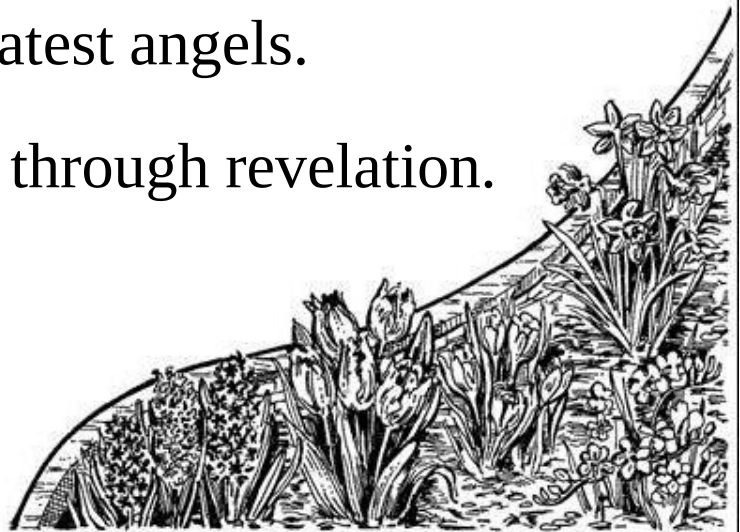


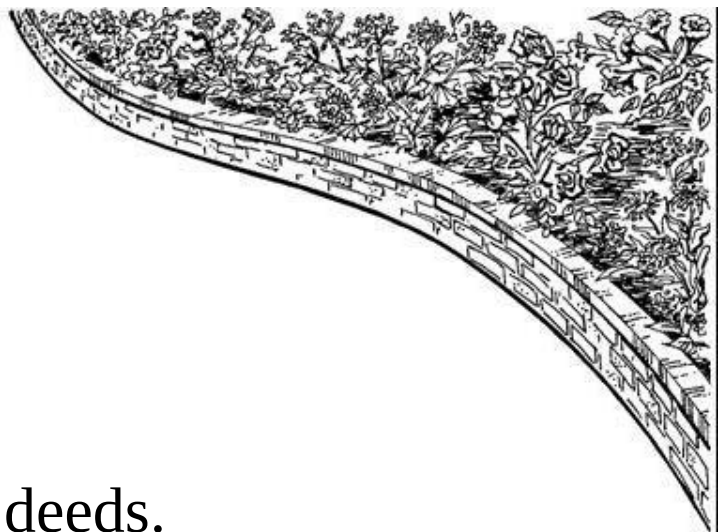
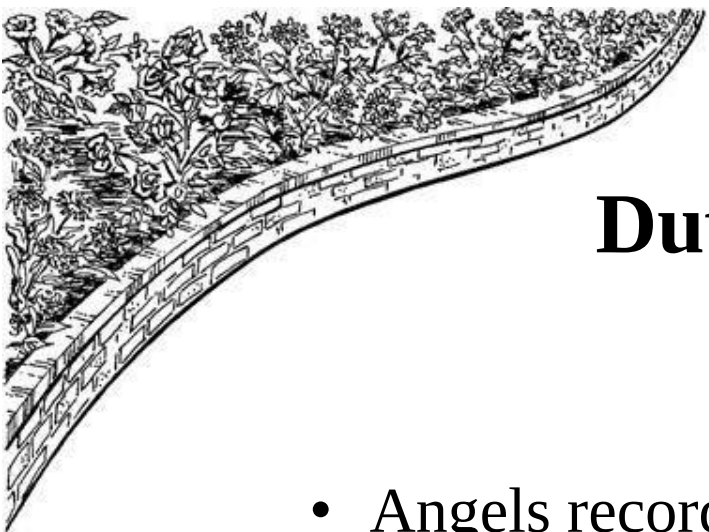
Belief in Angels

 - They should never be worshipped.
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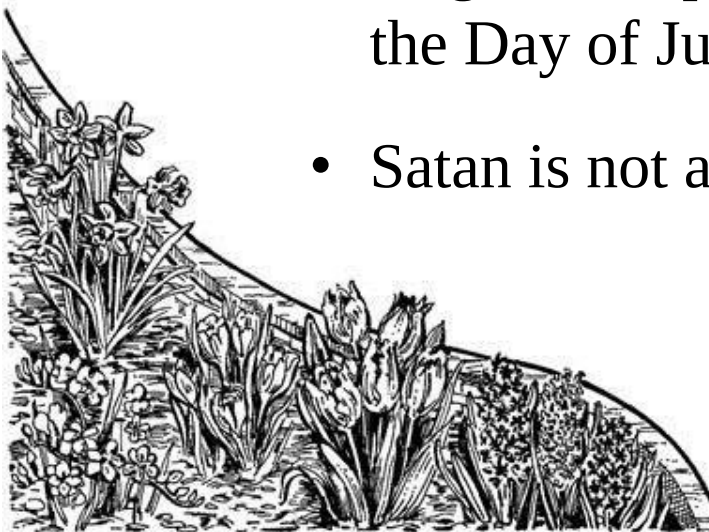


Nature of Angels

- Angels were created from light.
 - They do not eat, drink, or become tired of worshipping Allah.
 - They constantly praise and obey Allah.
 - Jibril (Gabriel) is one of the greatest angels.
 - Their true nature is known only through revelation.
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Duties of Angels

- Angels record our good and bad deeds.
 - They carry out Allah's commands.
 - Some angels seek forgiveness for believers.
 - Angels will present the record of human deeds on the Day of Judgment.
 - Satan is not an angel; he is from the Jinn.
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
