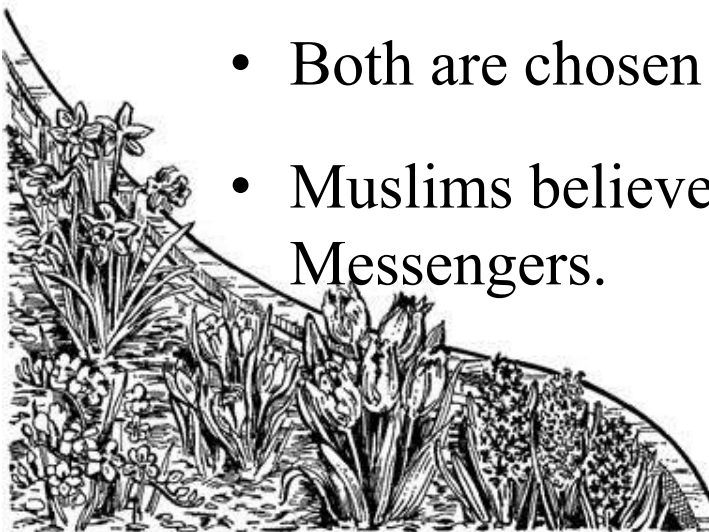
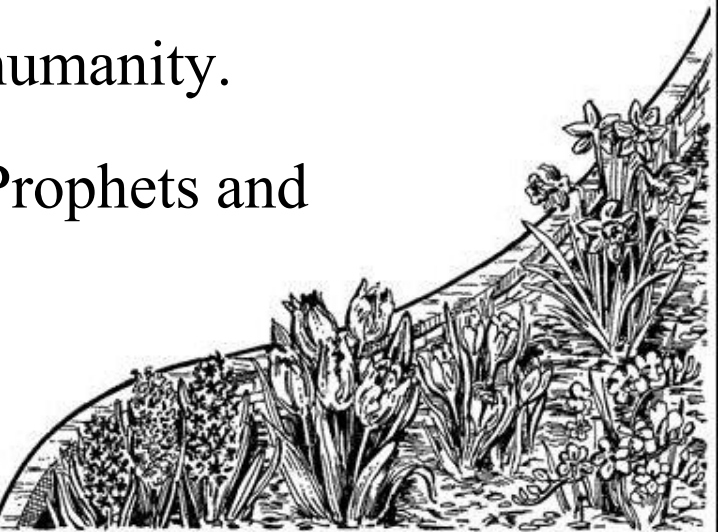
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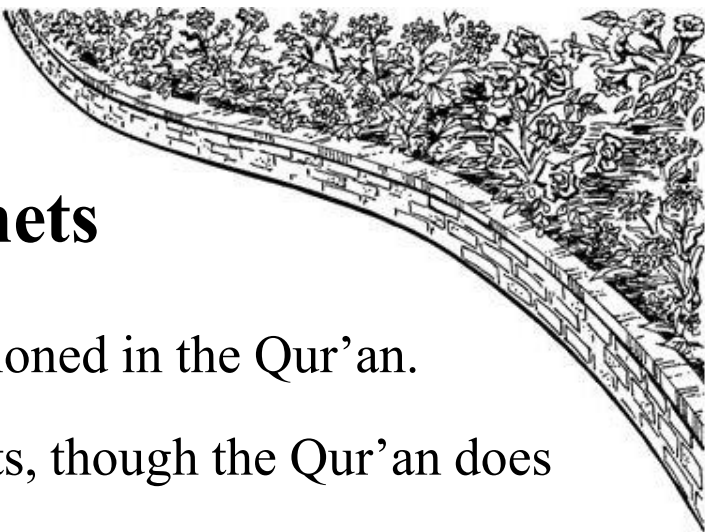
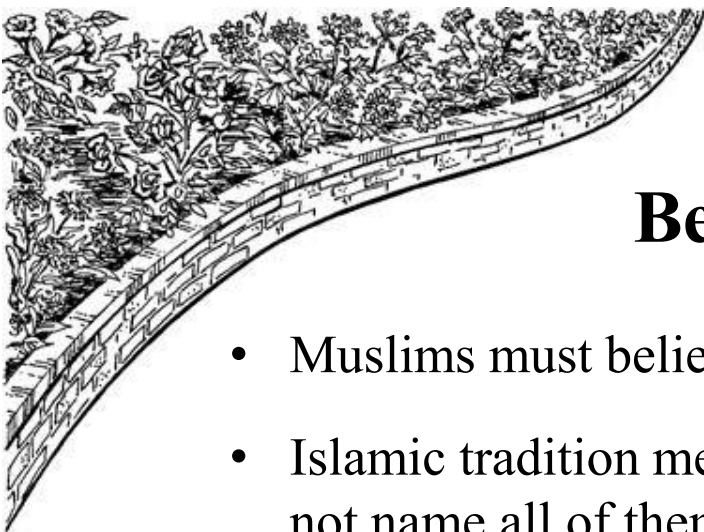
Explaining the differences between a Rasool and a Nabi, including their roles, revelations, and signs, and understanding the necessity of believing in all Messengers of God.



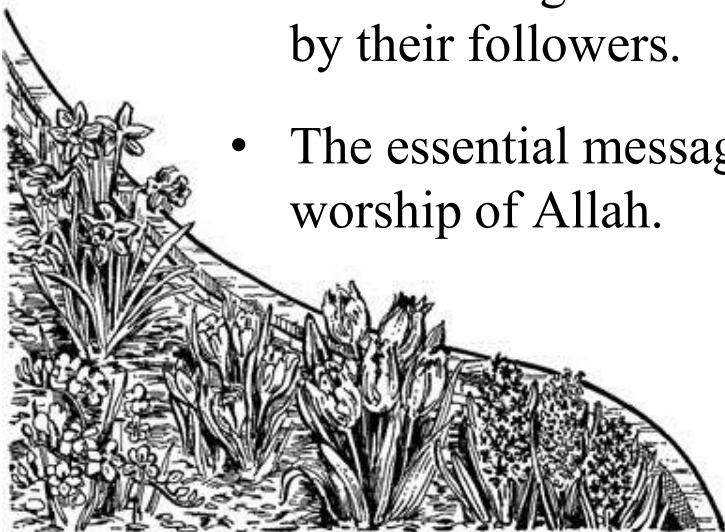


Rasool and Nabi

- Rasool: Receives a new Divine Book and Sharī‘ah and calls people to Allah’s guidance.
 - Nabi: Does not receive a new Book but follows and establishes the revelation and law given before him.
 - A Rasool may be given miracles and direct revelation through an angel.
 - Both are chosen by Allah to guide humanity.
 - Muslims believe in and respect all Prophets and Messengers.
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Belief in All Prophets

- Muslims must believe in all Prophets mentioned in the Qur'an.
 - Islamic tradition mentions 124,000 Prophets, though the Qur'an does not name all of them.
 - We believe that Allah sent Prophets to different peoples and regions.
 - We should not reject or insult religious figures who may have been Prophets.
 - The teachings of earlier Prophets may have been changed or corrupted by their followers.
 - The essential message of all Prophets was guidance toward the worship of Allah.
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
