Finality of Prophethood

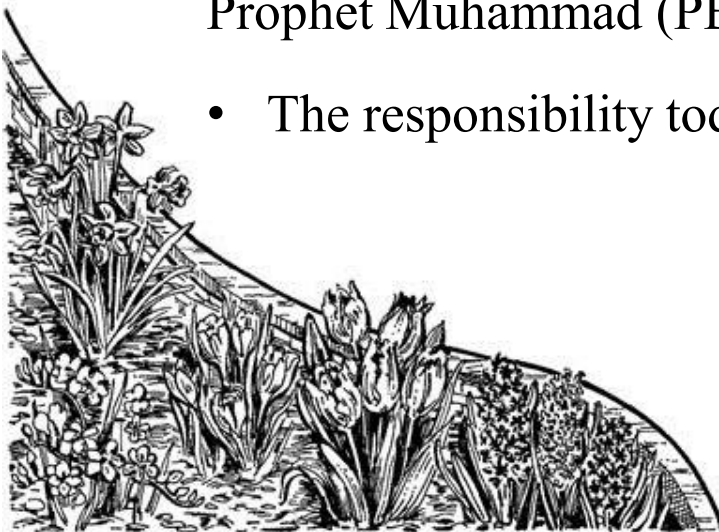
- Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) is the final Prophet of Allah.
 - His Qur'an and teachings have been preserved.
 - His message is complete and universal, for all people and all times.
 - The Qur'an describes him as Khatam an-Nabiyyin — the Seal/Last of the Prophets.
 - Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) said: “There will be no prophet after me.”
 - Therefore, there is no need for a new Prophet after him.
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Why No New Prophet?

- Earlier Prophets' teachings were limited to particular peoples or periods and later altered.
- The guidance brought by Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) is preserved and complete.
- Islam provides guidance for both this world and the Hereafter.
- Its principles are timeless while ijtiḥād allows their application to changing circumstances.

Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) was sent as a Messenger to all humanity.

- The responsibility today is to follow, preserve, and convey his message.
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
