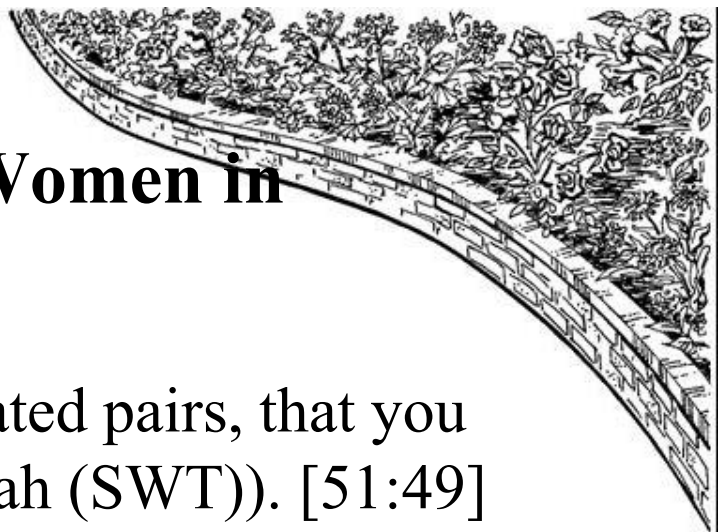
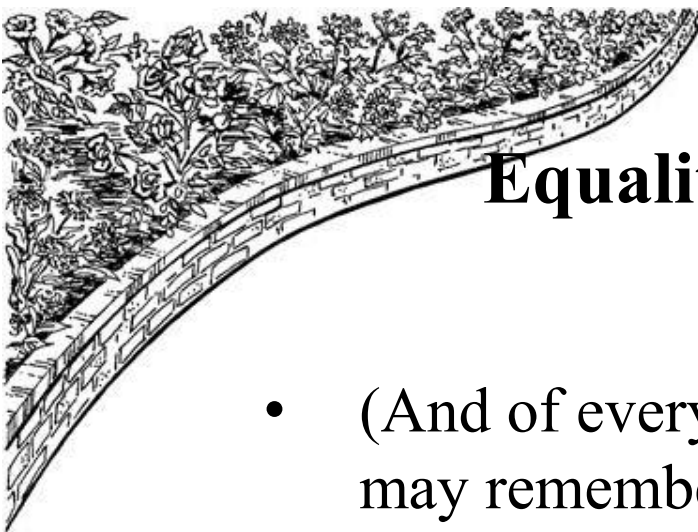
Recognizing that Islam acknowledges men and women as spiritually equal while assigning complementary roles based on their inherent biological differences.



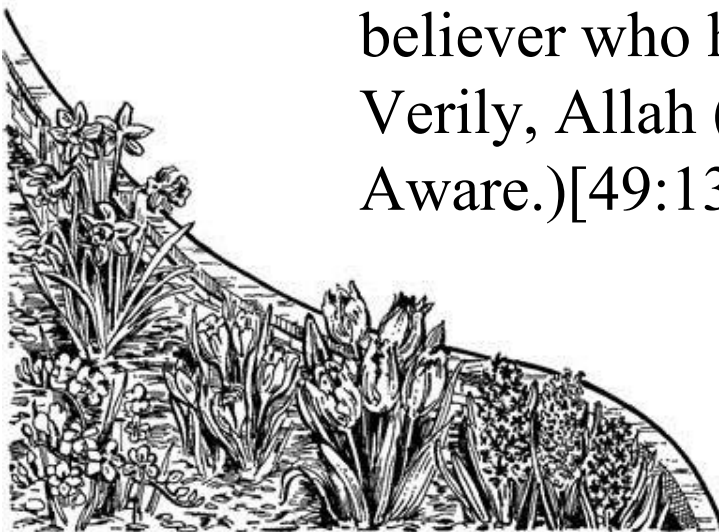
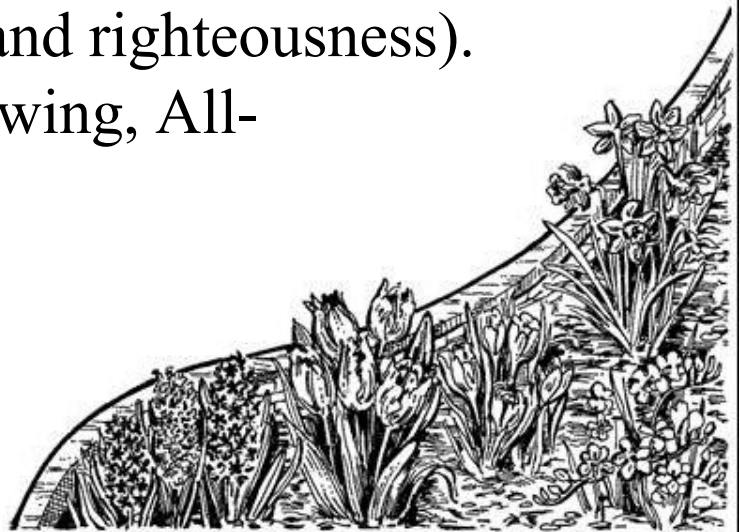


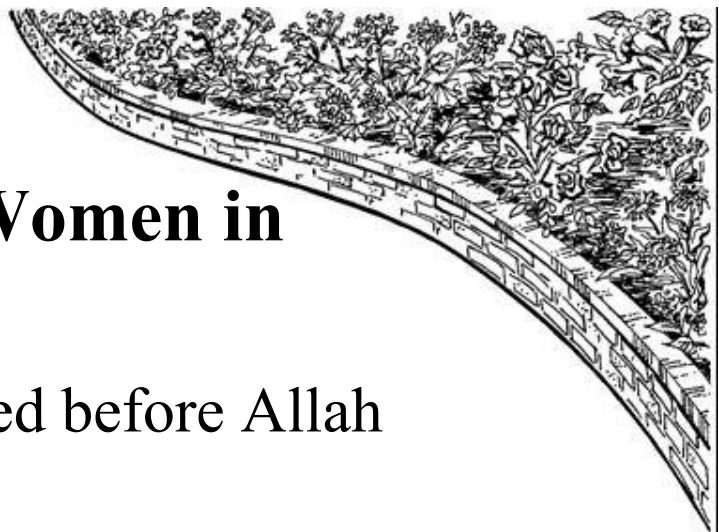
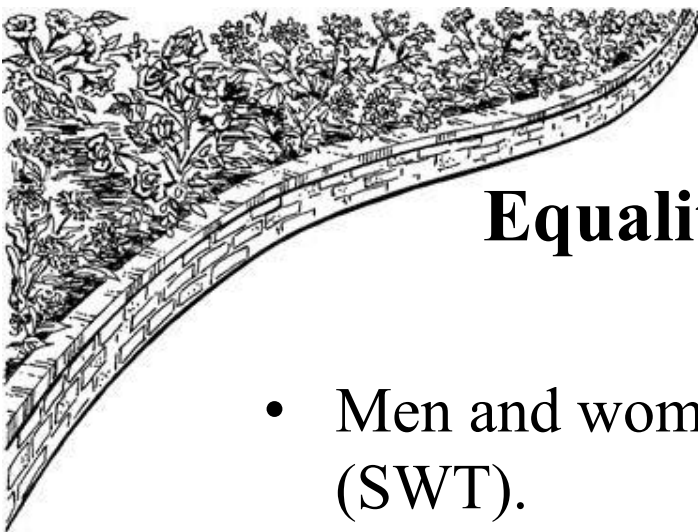
Equality of Men and Women in Islam

 - True fulfillment is found through mutual love, respect, companionship, and responsibility between spouses.
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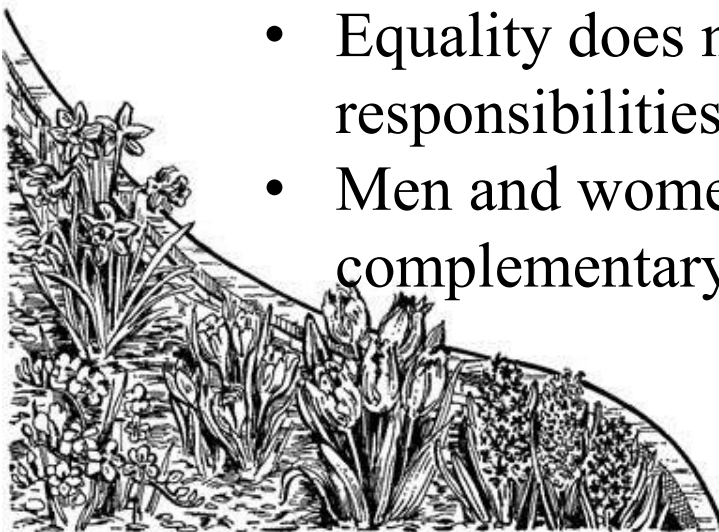


Equality of Men and Women in Islam
