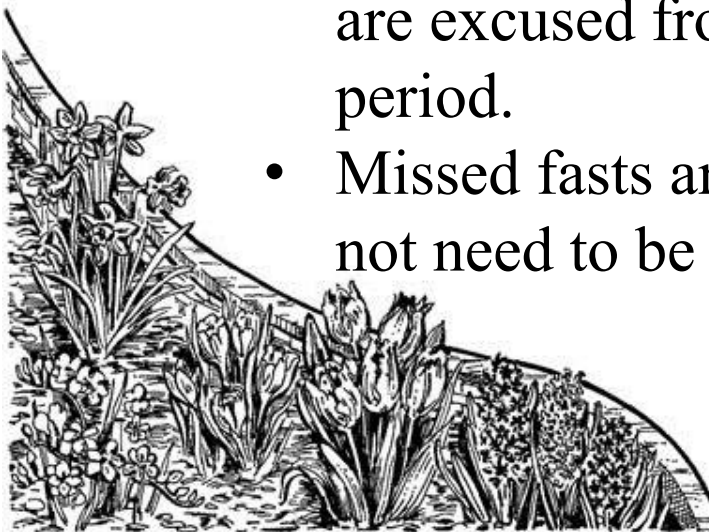


Equality in Basic Humanity

- Islam teaches that men and women come from the **same human origin**.
 - The Qur'an states that Allah (SWT) created humanity from a single person and his spouse (**Qur'an 4:1**).
 - Women are not considered the source of sin or evil.
 - Men and women are the **two complementary genders** of humanity.
 - **Prophet Muhammad (PBUH):** *“Women are the twin halves of men.”*
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Equality in Religious Obligations

- Men and women are both accountable to Allah (SWT).
 - Both are required to fulfill the Shahadah, Salah, Zakah, Fasting, and Hajj.
 - Islam provides exemptions in certain circumstances to ease hardship.
 - For example, menstruating and postpartum women are excused from prayer and fasting during that period.
 - Missed fasts are made up, while missed prayers do not need to be made up.
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
