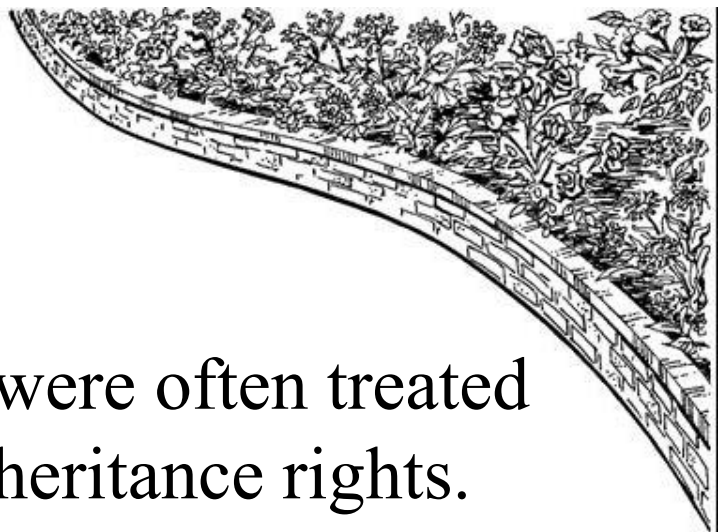
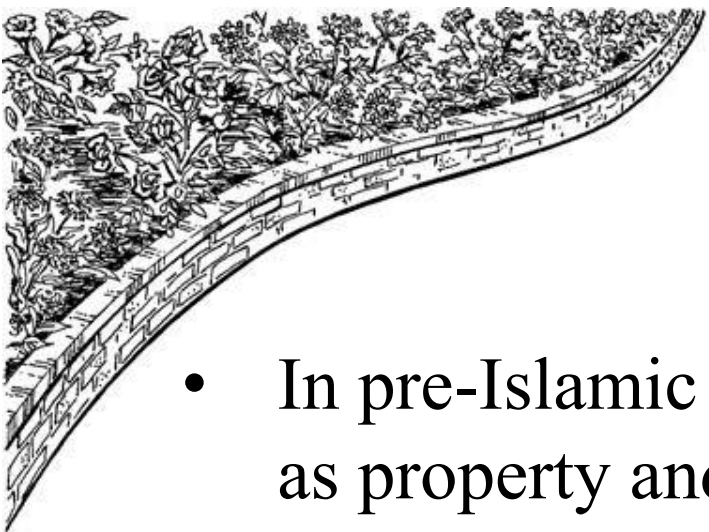
Understand that Islam grants women equal rights to men while recognizing their distinct roles and individuality.





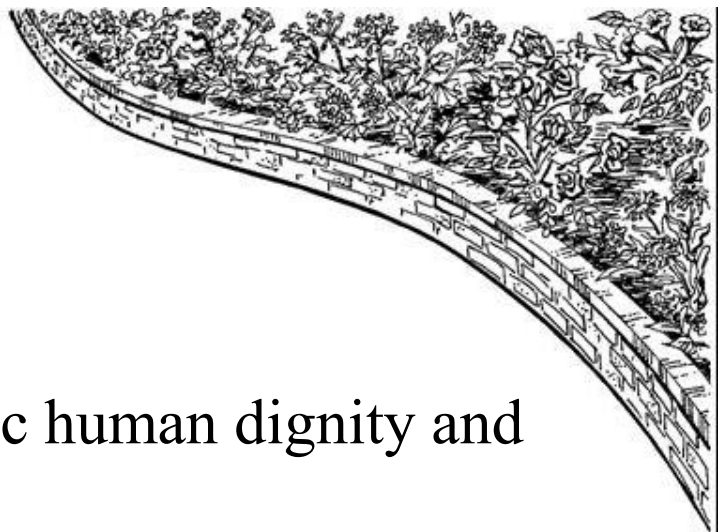
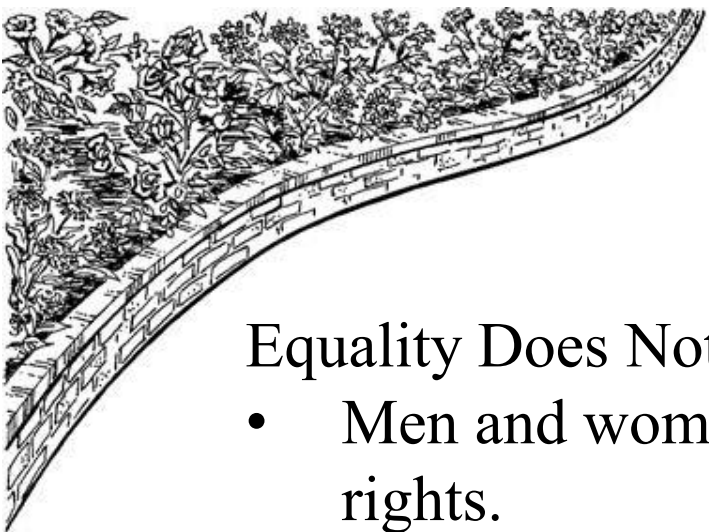
Introduction

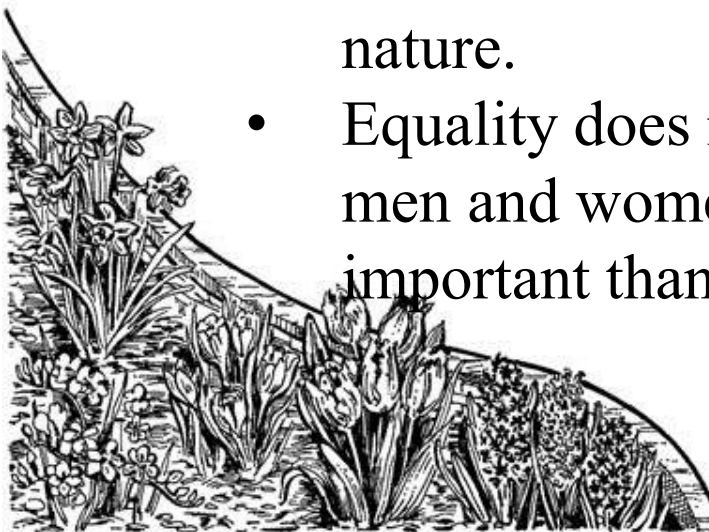
Introduction

- In pre-Islamic Arabia, women were often treated as property and were denied inheritance rights.
 - Female infants were sometimes buried alive, reflecting the severe injustice faced by women.
 - Islam restored women's dignity, humanity, and legal rights, including inheritance.

Introduction

Equality Does Not Mean Sameness

- Men and women are equal in basic human dignity and rights.
 - Equality does not mean that men and women are identical or the same.
 - Their different natural characteristics, responsibilities, and roles are recognized.
 - Islam seeks a balance between equality and their distinct nature.
 - Equality does not mean sameness; differences between men and women do not make one inferior or less important than the other.
