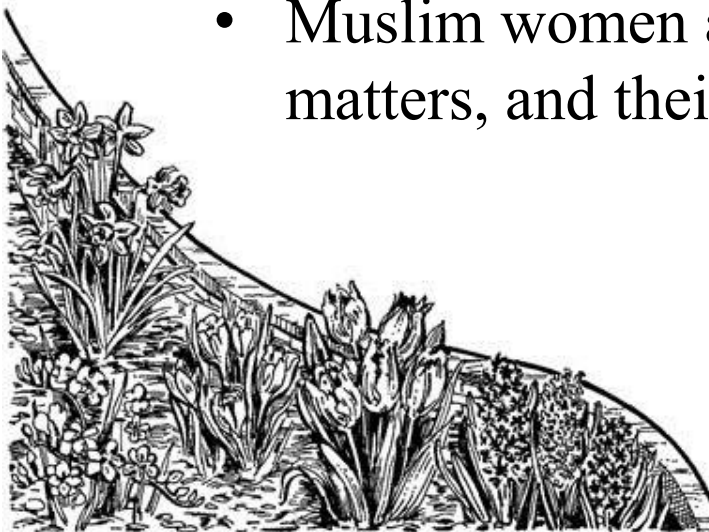
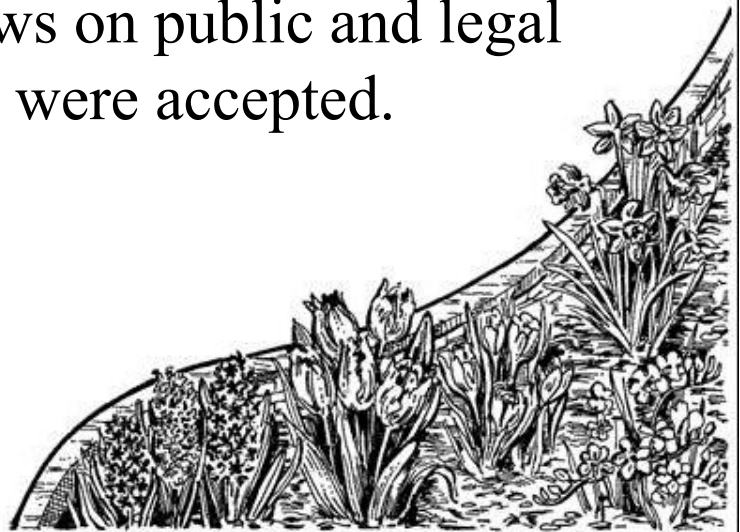


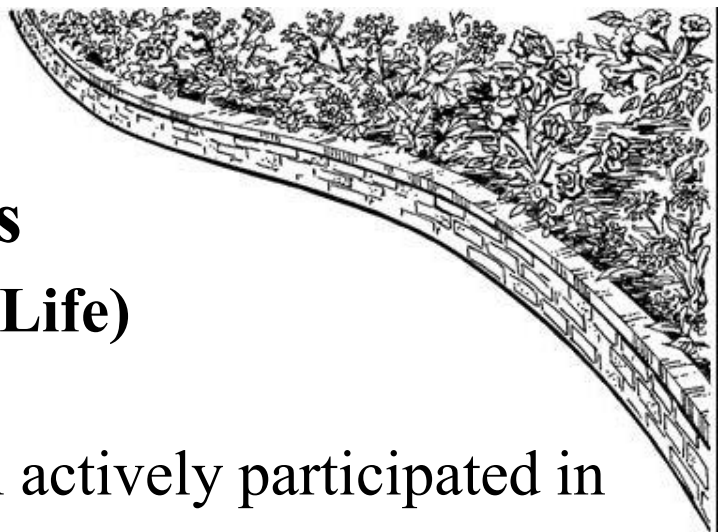
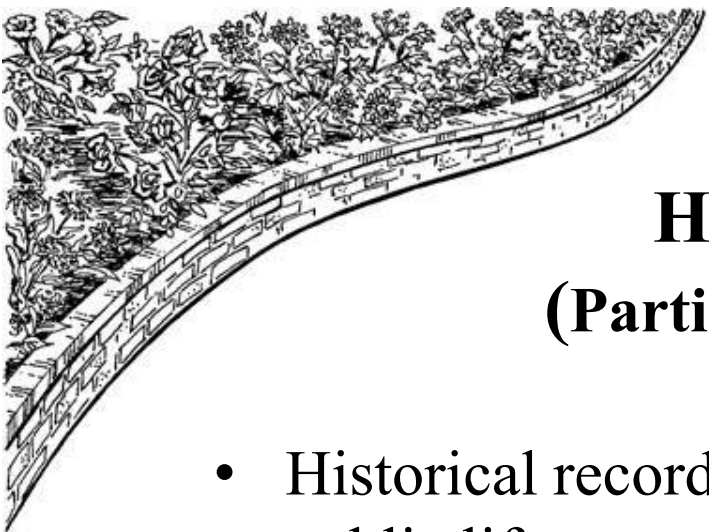
Pursuit of knowledge and education

- Islam gives women and men equal opportunity to seek knowledge and education.
 - The command to pursue knowledge applies to both males and females.
 - Muslim women throughout history actively pursued education and contributed to society.
 - Seeking knowledge is considered an important responsibility for every Muslim.
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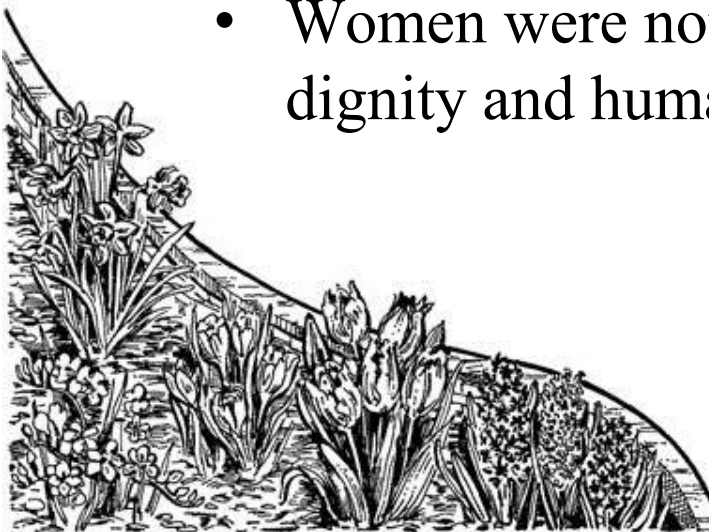


Freedom of Expression

- Women have the right to express their opinions and participate in discussions.
 - Their views should be considered based on the strength and soundness of their arguments, not their gender.
 - Women participated in serious discussions with the Prophet (PBUH) and Muslim leaders.
 - Muslim women also expressed views on public and legal matters, and their sound arguments were accepted.
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Historical records (Participation in Public Life)

- Historical records show that women actively participated in public life among the early Muslims.
 - During battles and emergencies, women helped by nursing the wounded and preparing supplies.
 - They also supported and served the Muslim armies when needed.
 - Women were not considered worthless or deprived of their dignity and human worth.
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
