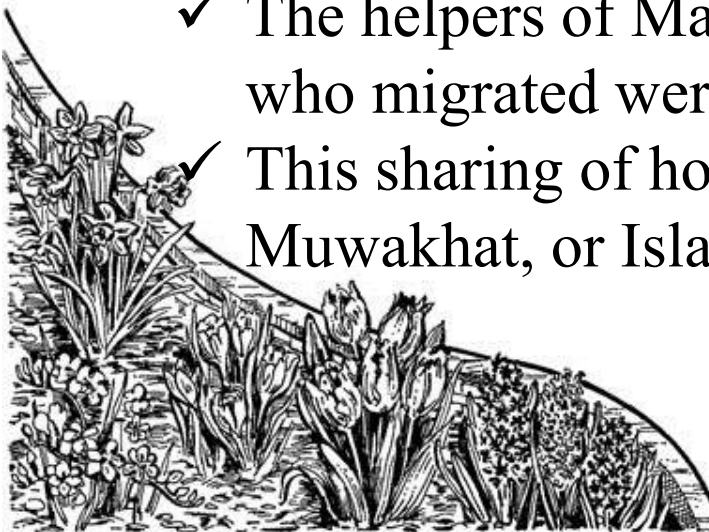
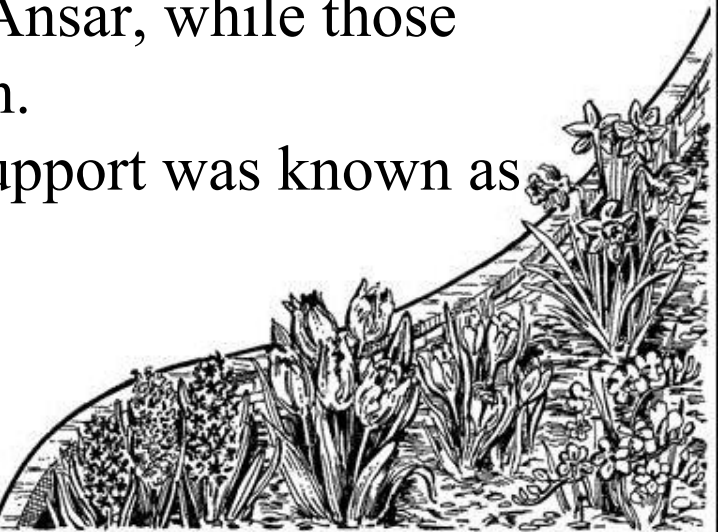
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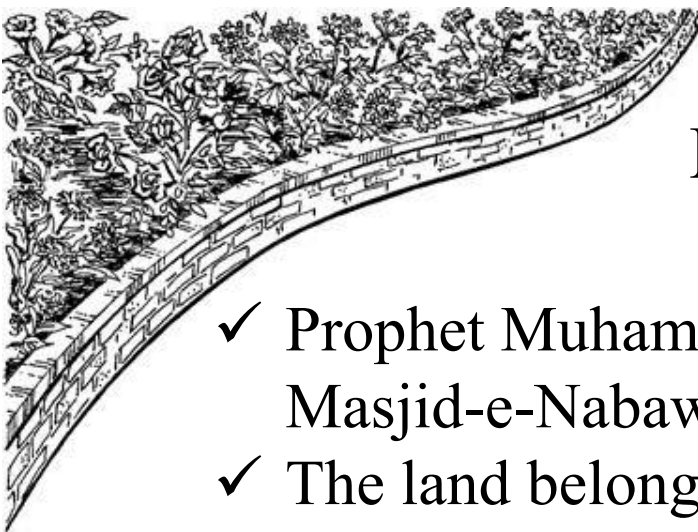
Explain the settlement of Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) in Madinah, the role of the Ansar, and the construction of Masjid-e-Nabawi.



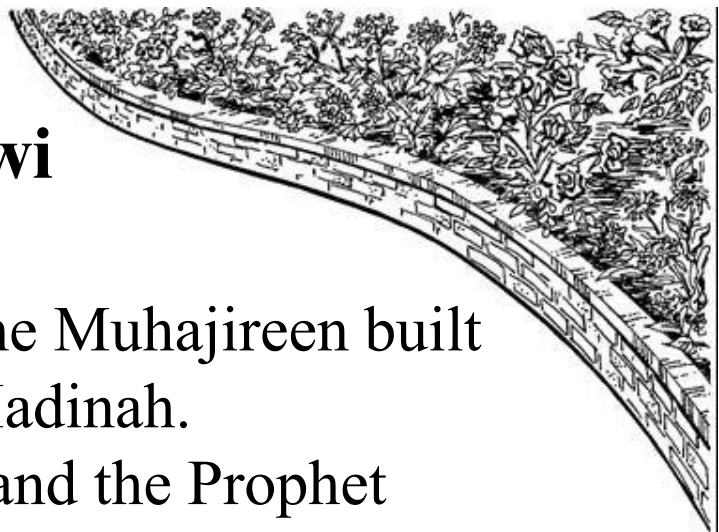


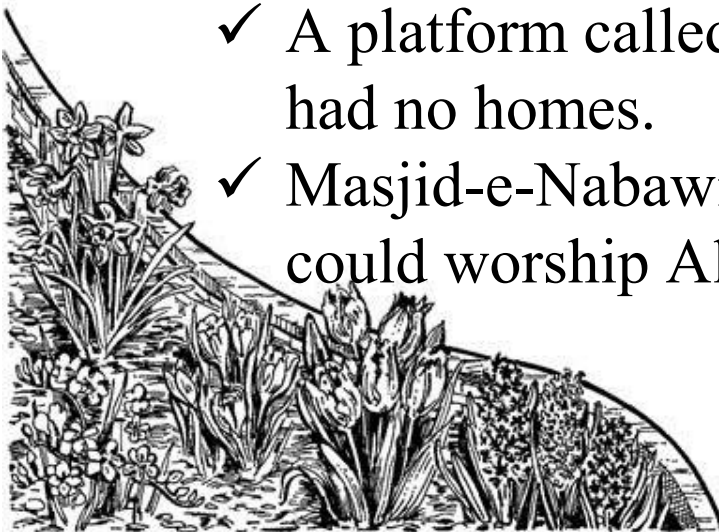
Arrival to Madinah

- ✓ On entering Madinah, Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) led the first Friday (Jumu'ah) prayer with about 100 worshippers.
 - ✓ His camel, Qaswa, stopped at a site belonging to two orphans of Banu Najjar.
 - ✓ Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) stayed at the home of Hazrat Abu Ayyub Ansari (RA).
 - ✓ The people of Madinah welcomed and supported the Muslims who had migrated from Makkah.
 - ✓ The helpers of Madinah were called Ansar, while those who migrated were called Muhajireen.
 - ✓ This sharing of homes, wealth, and support was known as Muwakhat, or Islamic brotherhood.
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Masjid-E-Nabawi



- ✓ Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) and the Muhajireen built Masjid-e-Nabawi after settling in Madinah.
 - ✓ The land belonged to two orphans, and the Prophet (PBUH) purchased it from them.
 - ✓ The Prophet (PBUH) and his companions worked together in its construction.
 - ✓ The Masjid had simple mud-brick walls and a palm-tree roof.
 - ✓ A platform called Suffah provided shelter for Muslims who had no homes.
 - ✓ Masjid-e-Nabawi became a peaceful place where Muslims could worship Allah freely.
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
