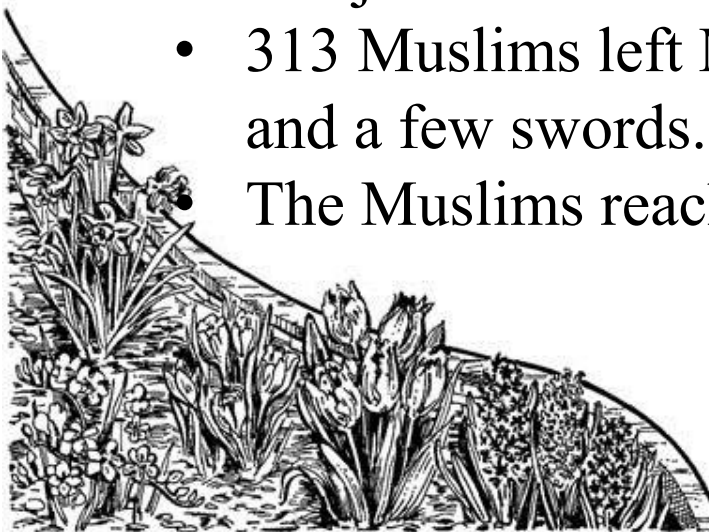
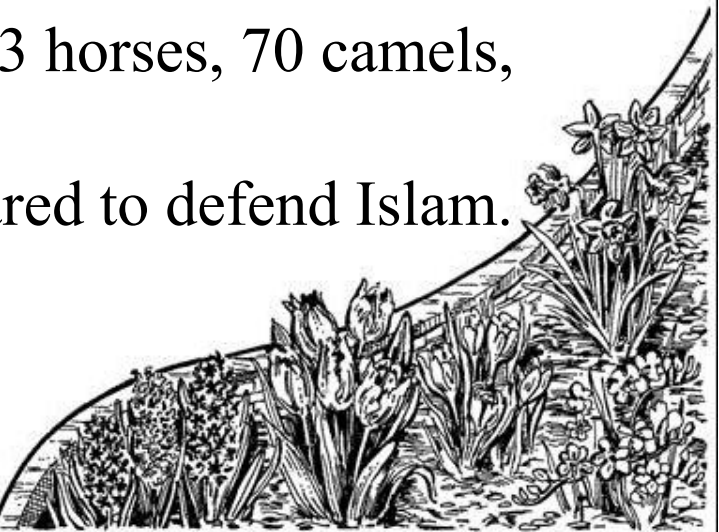
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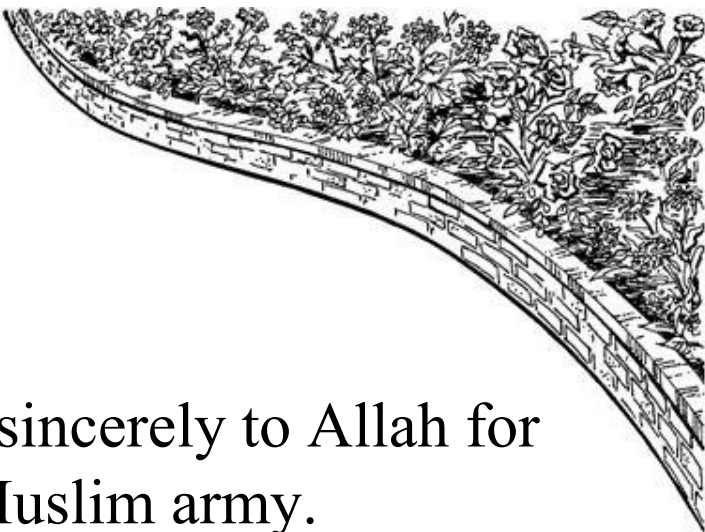
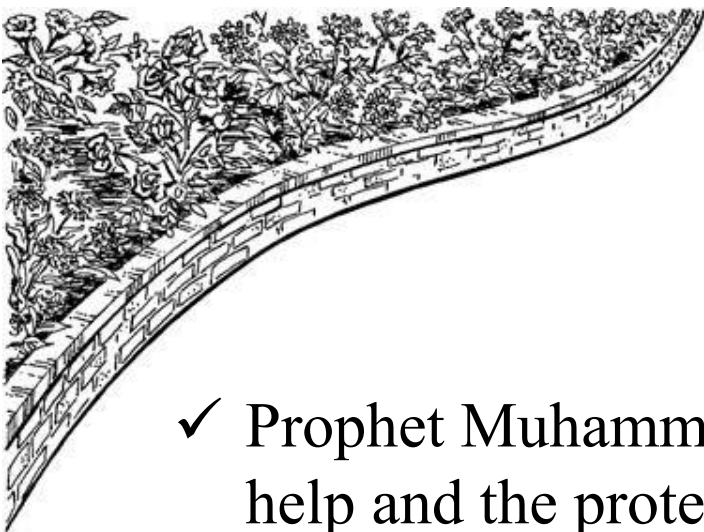
Describe the Battle of Badr, including the events leading to it, key participants, and its significance in defending Islam.





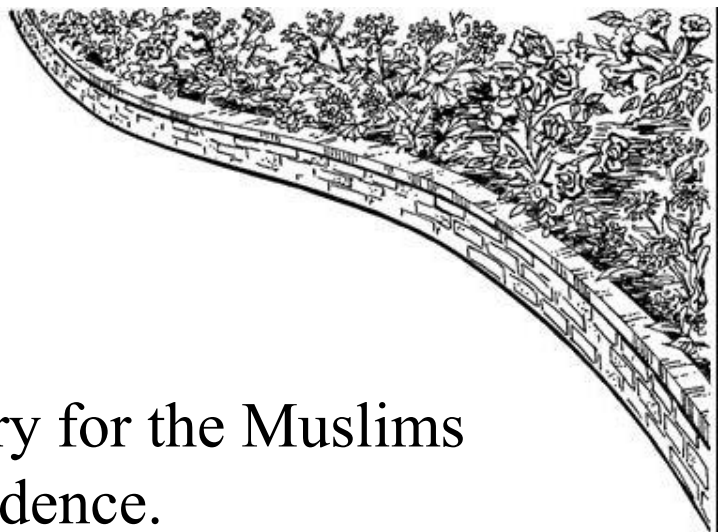
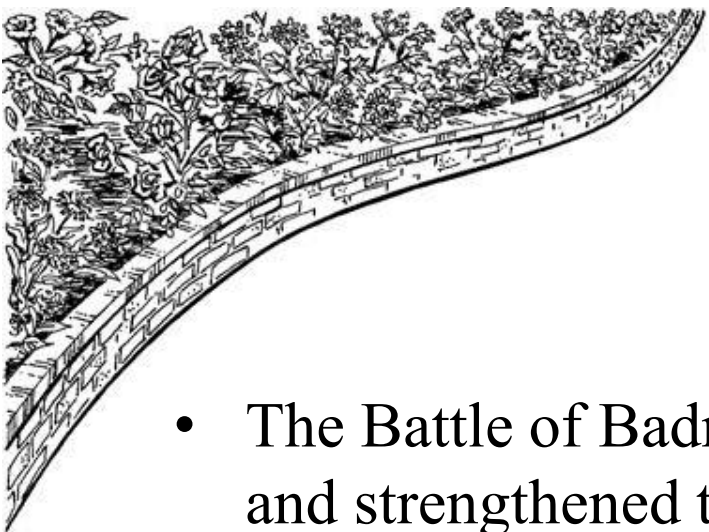
Battle of Badr

- Abu Sufyan's caravan returned safely from Syria, but Abu Jahl continued towards Madinah with an army of 1,000 men.
 - The Quraysh army had 700 camels, 300 horses, and was well-equipped with weapons.
 - ✓ Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) consulted the Sahaba at Masjid-e-Nabawi before preparing for the battle.
 - 313 Muslims left Madinah with only 3 horses, 70 camels, and a few swords.
 - The Muslims reached Badr and prepared to defend Islam.
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Battle of Badr

- ✓ Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) prayed sincerely to Allah for help and the protection of the small Muslim army.
 - ✓ On 17th Ramadan, 2 AH, the Muslims achieved a decisive victory over the Quraysh.
 - ✓ About 70 Quraysh soldiers were killed, including Abu Jahl.
 - ✓ About 70 were taken as prisoners, while 14 Muslims were martyred.
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Battle of Badr

- The Battle of Badr was a major victory for the Muslims and strengthened their faith and confidence.
 - It established the Muslims of Madinah as a strong and independent community.
 - The victory was seen as a triumph of truth over falsehood.
 - The Quraysh were deeply humiliated and became more determined to oppose the Muslims.
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
