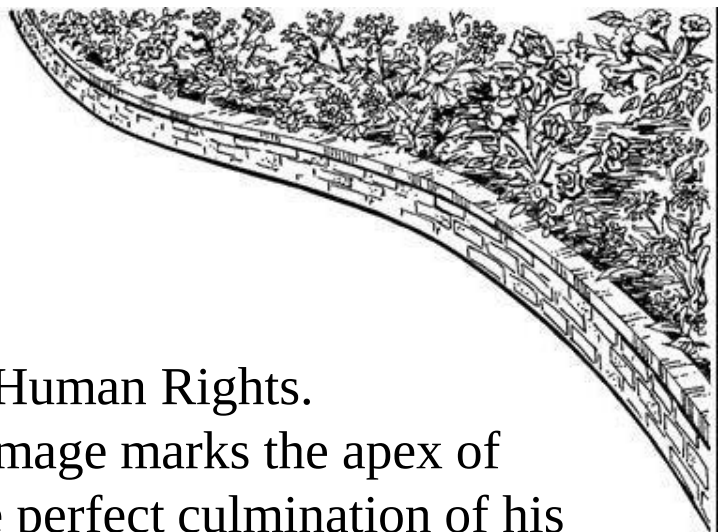
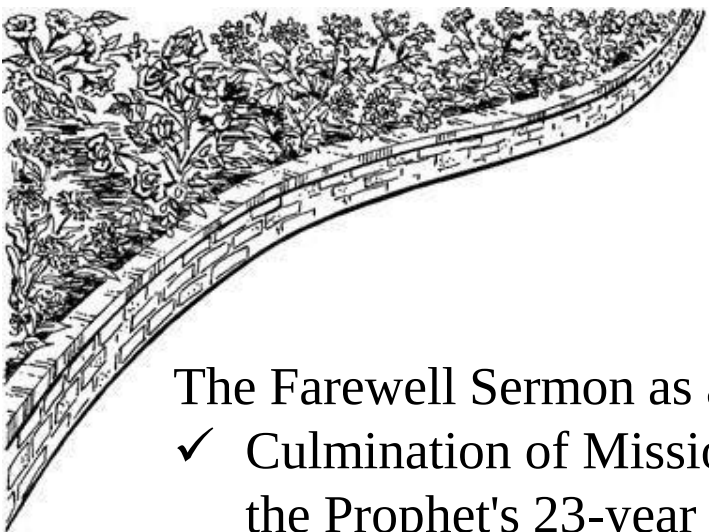
Importance of Farewell Sermon

- ✓ The Farewell Sermon was one of the Prophet Muhammad's (PBUH) final and most important messages to the Muslim Ummah.

 - ✓ It emphasized complete faith, obedience, and submission to Allah.
 - ✓ It reminded Muslims to remain firm in their belief in Islam.
 - ✓ It established a lasting foundation of faith and devotion to Allah for future generations.
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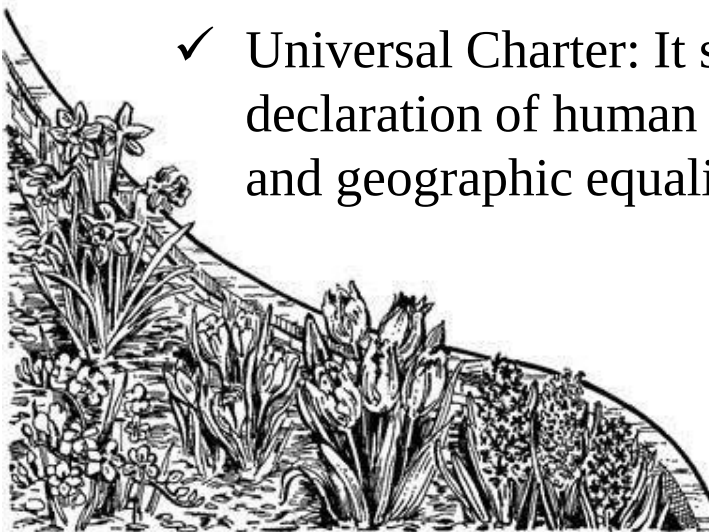
Last Sermon
