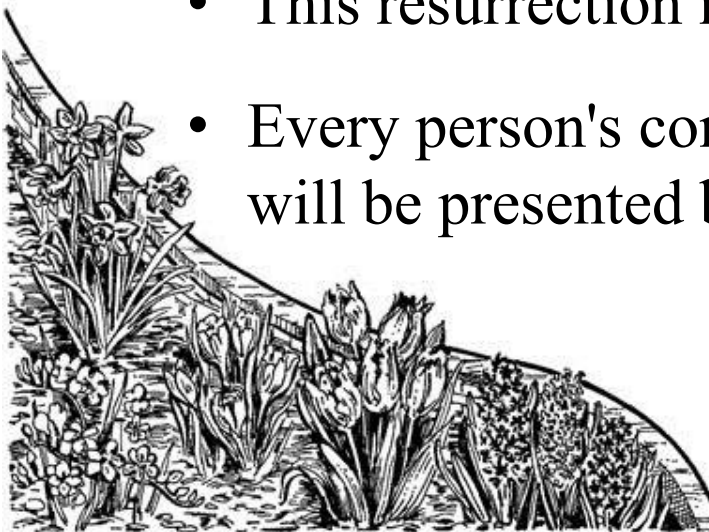
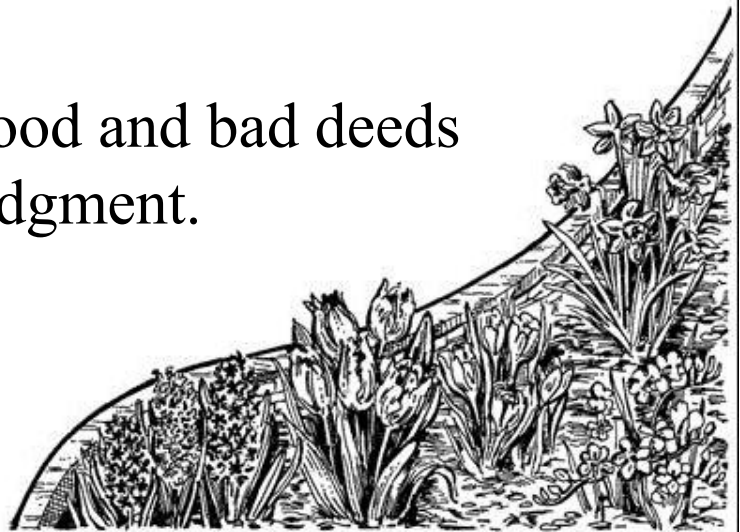
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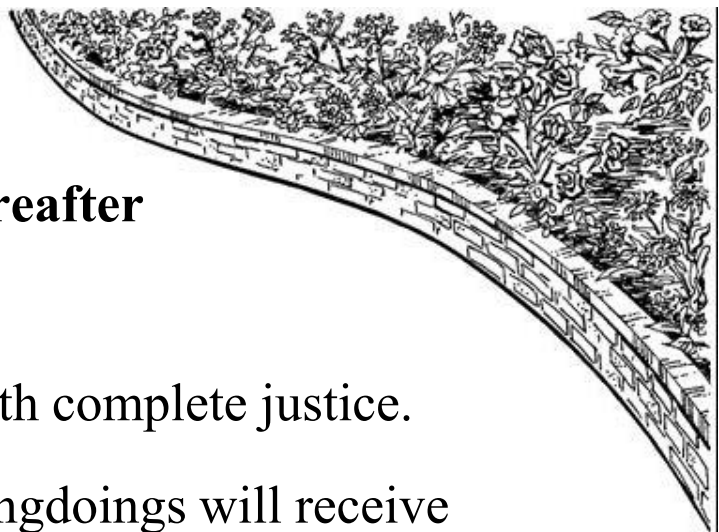
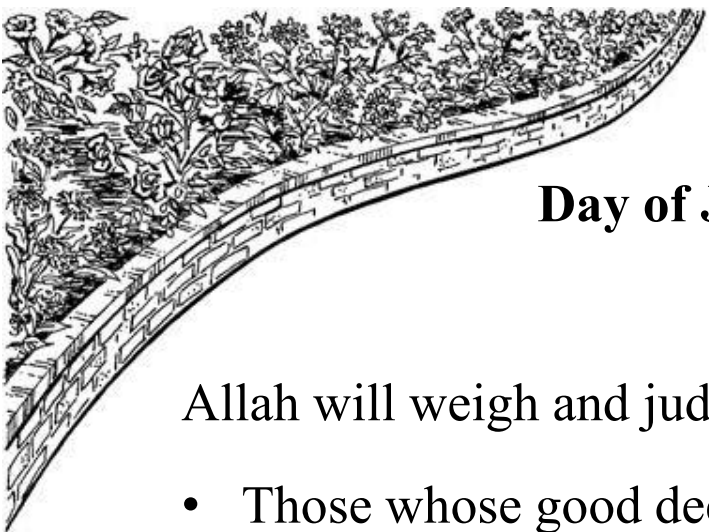
Explaining the belief in life after death, including resurrection, final judgment, and the consequences of good and bad deeds





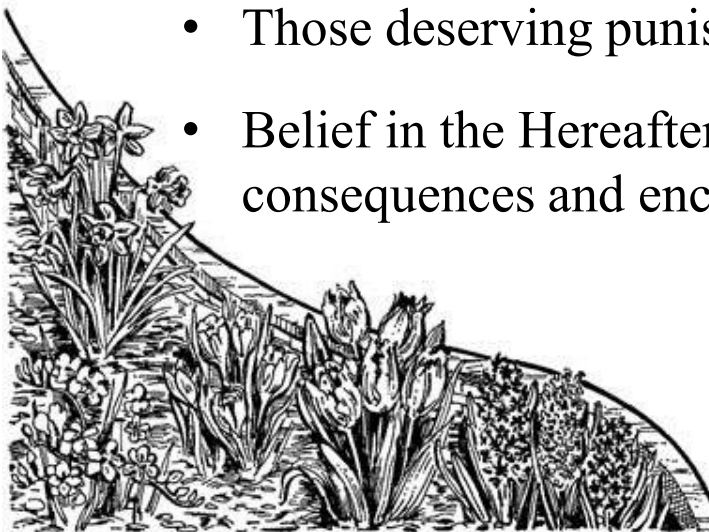
Belief in Life After Death

- Belief in life after death is the fifth article of Islamic faith.
 - Muslims believe that this worldly life will come to an end on an appointed day, known as Qayamah (the Last Day).
 - On that day, all human beings who have ever lived will be resurrected and brought before Allah.
 - This resurrection is called Hashr.
 - Every person's complete record of good and bad deeds will be presented before Allah for judgment.
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Day of Judgment and the Hereafter

Allah will weigh and judge everyone's deeds with complete justice.

- Those whose good deeds outweigh their wrongdoings will receive reward.
 - Those whose evil deeds outweigh their good deeds will face punishment.
 - The successful will enter Paradise (Jannah), a place of eternal bliss.
 - Those deserving punishment will be sent to Hell (Jahannam).
 - Belief in the Hereafter reminds Muslims that every action has consequences and encourages them to live a righteous life.
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
