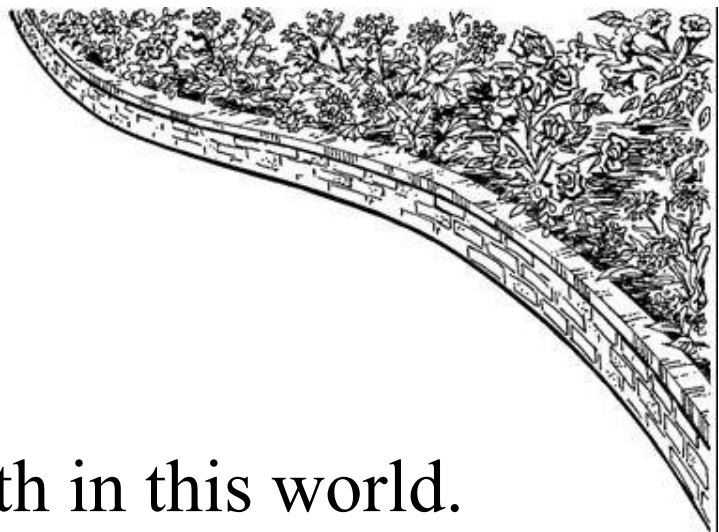
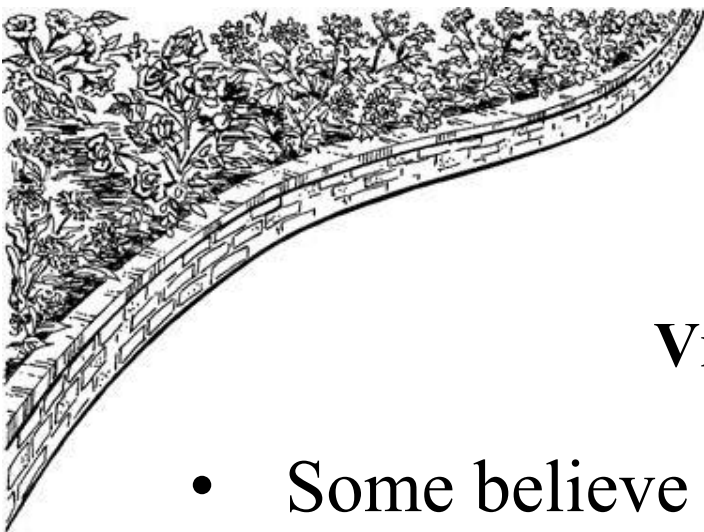
Life After Death – A Rational Vindication

 - The Islamic view is presented as logical and meaningful.
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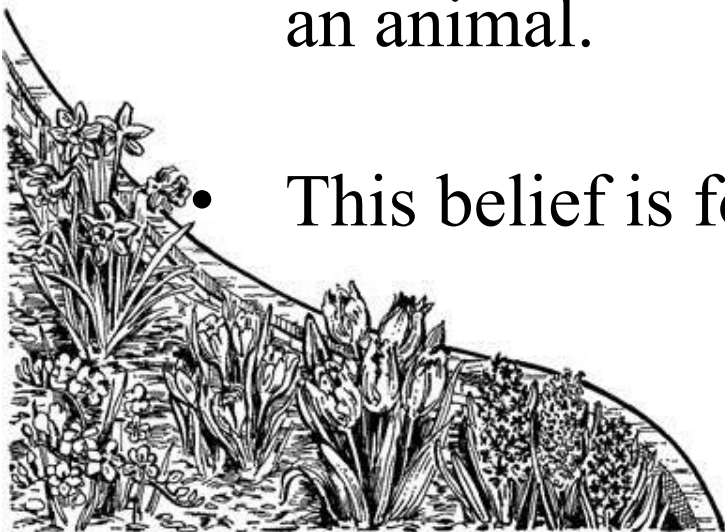
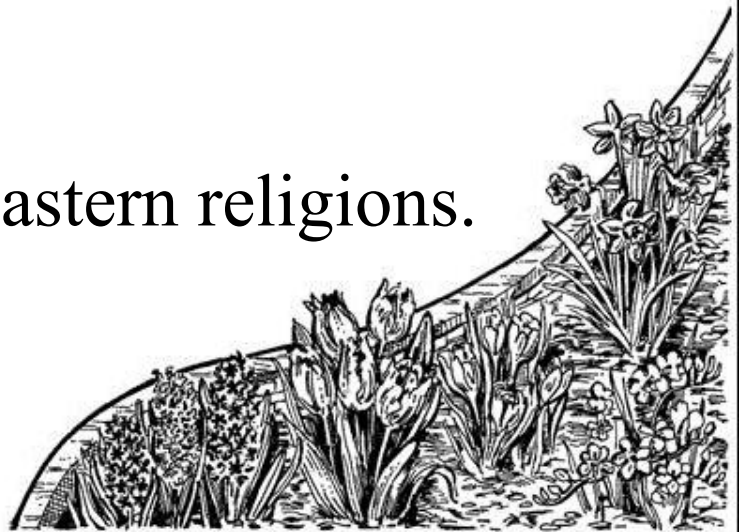


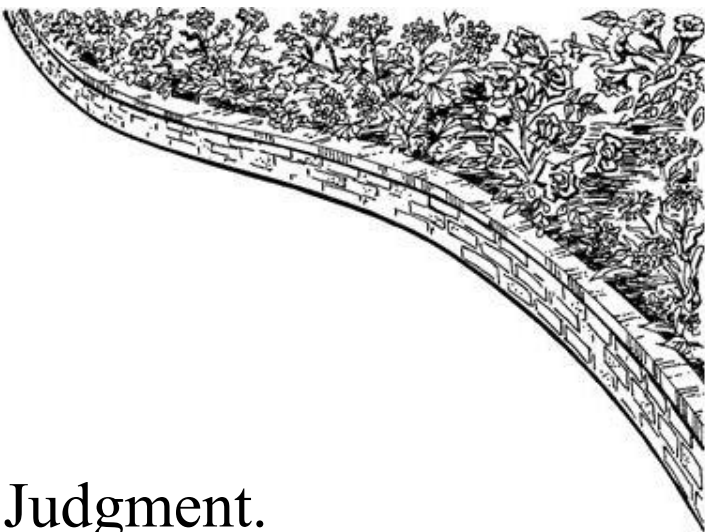
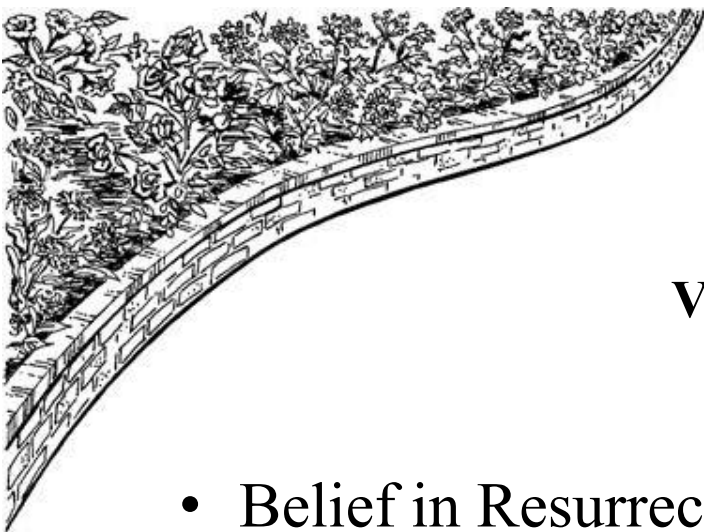
View 1 – No Life After Death

- Some people believe death is the end of life.

 - They consider it impossible or unscientific.
 - This view is often associated with a materialistic approach.
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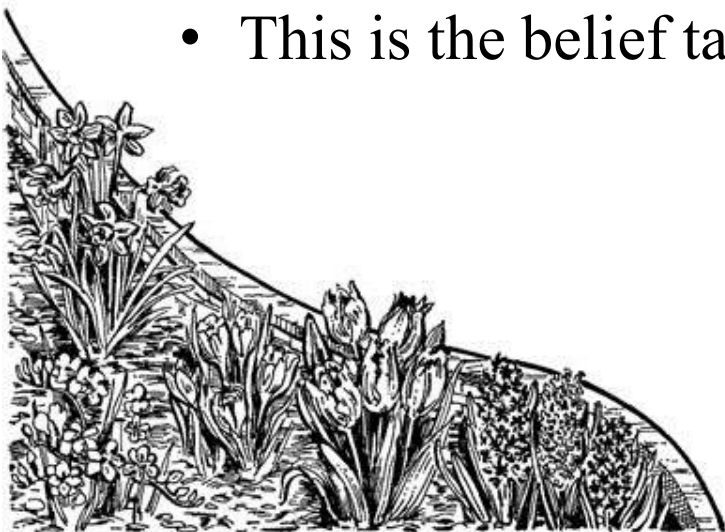


View 2 – Rebirth

- Some believe in repeated rebirth in this world.
 - Good deeds may lead to a better form of life.
 - Bad deeds may lead to a lower form of life or an animal.
 - This belief is found in some Eastern religions.
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View 3 – Islamic Belief

- Belief in Resurrection and the Day of Judgment.
 - All people will appear before Allah for judgment.
 - Deeds will be examined and reward or punishment will follow.
 - This is the belief taught by the Prophets.
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
