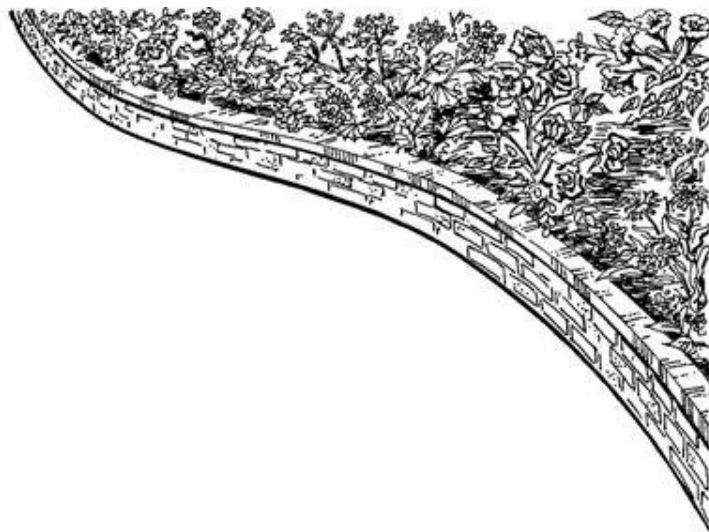
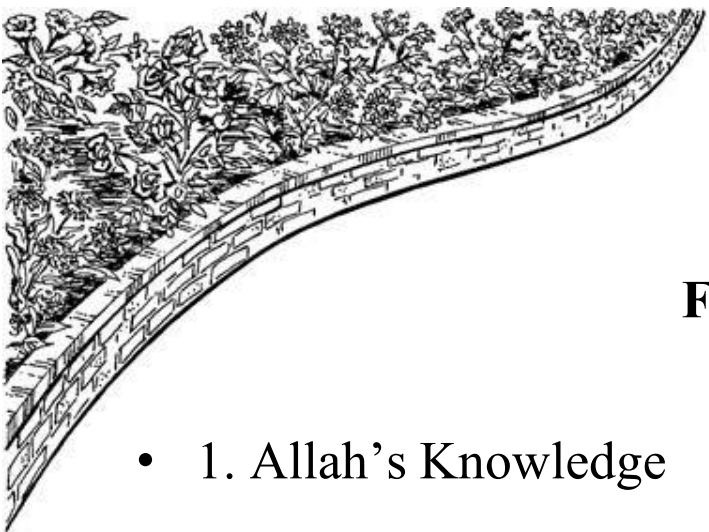
Belief in Al-Qadar

- Al-Qadar is the 6th pillar of faith.
 - Faith is incomplete without belief in Qadar.
 - Allah (SWT) knows everything before it happens.
 - Everything occurs according to His Knowledge, Will, and Measure. “We have created all things with Qadar.”
 - (Qur'an 54:49)
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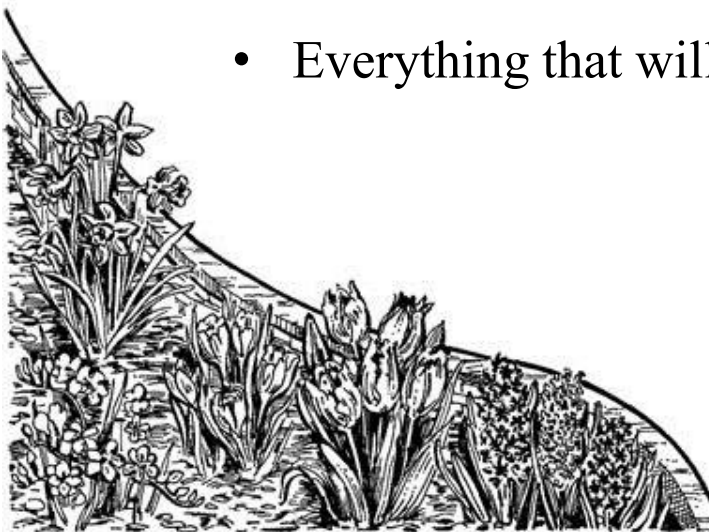
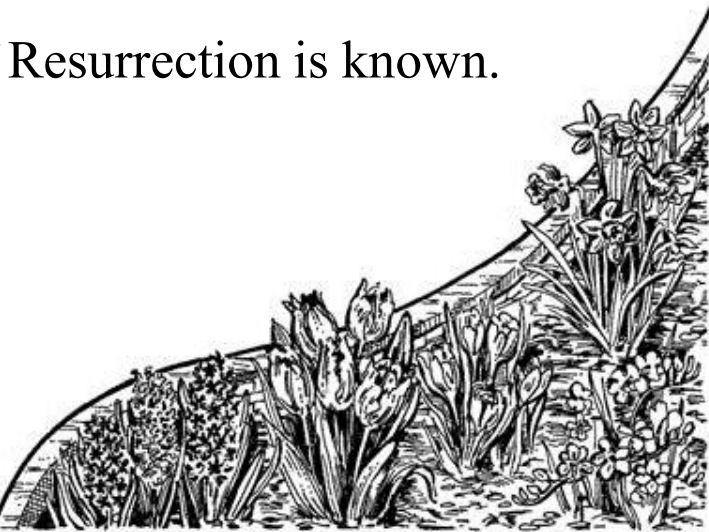


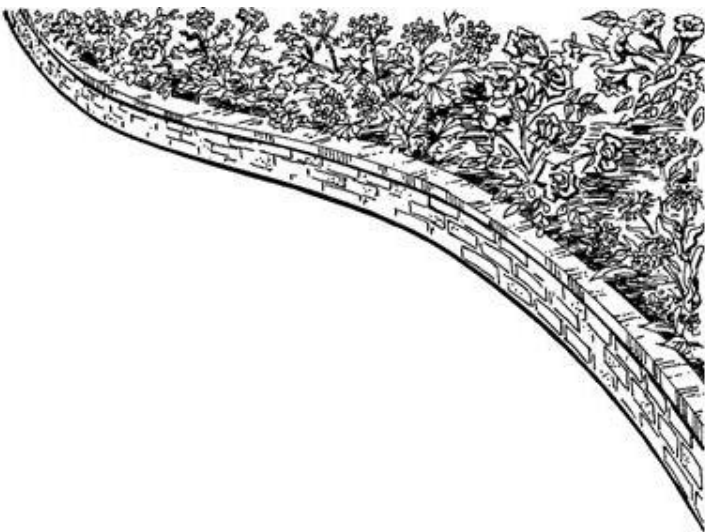
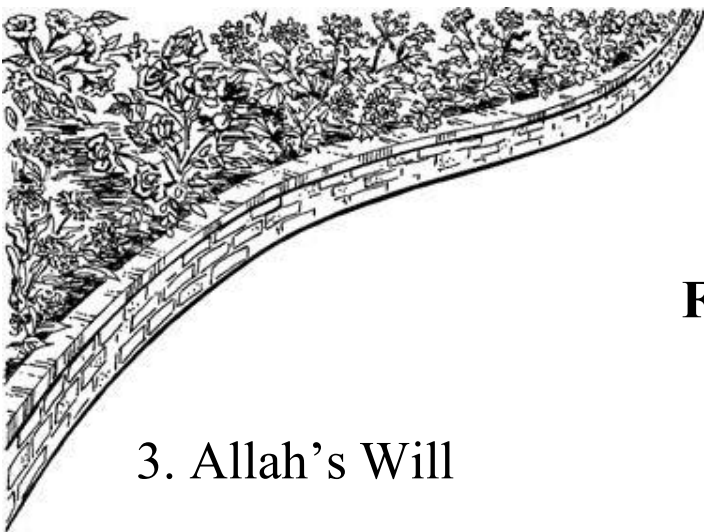
What Does Qadar Mean?

- Allah (SWT) knows the past, present, and future.
 - Everything happens according to His Will and Measure.
 - Whatever happens to us was never meant to miss us.
 - Whatever misses us was never meant to happen.
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Four Beliefs of Qadar

- 1. Allah's Knowledge
 - Allah is aware of everything.
 - His knowledge encompasses all things.
 - 2. The Preserved Tablet
 - Allah has recorded everything in Al-Lawh-ul-Mahfoodh.
 - Everything that will occur until the Day of Resurrection is known.
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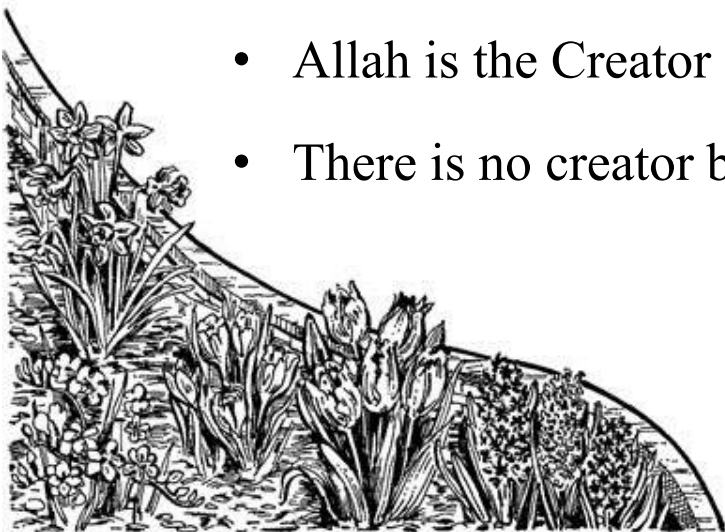


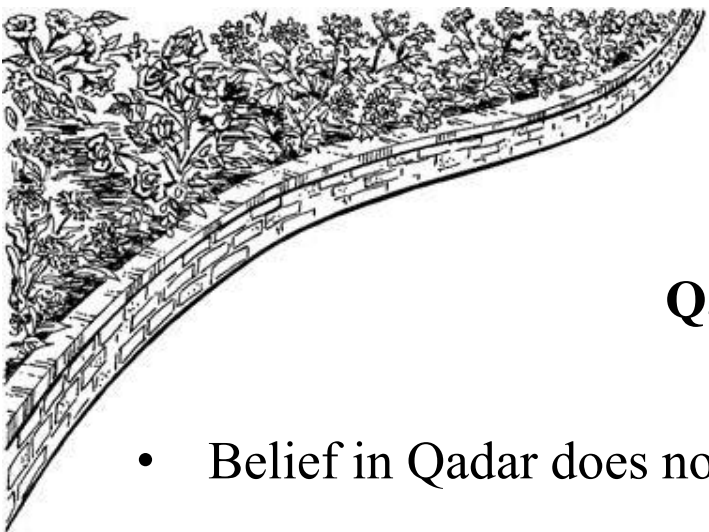
Four Beliefs of Qadar

3. Allah's Will

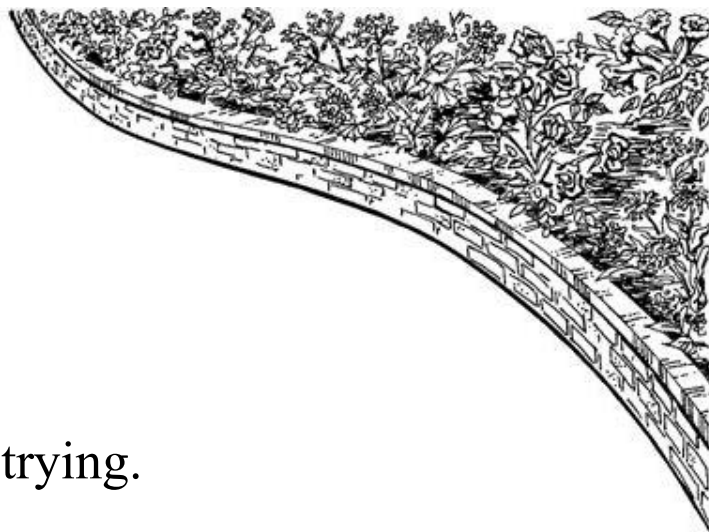
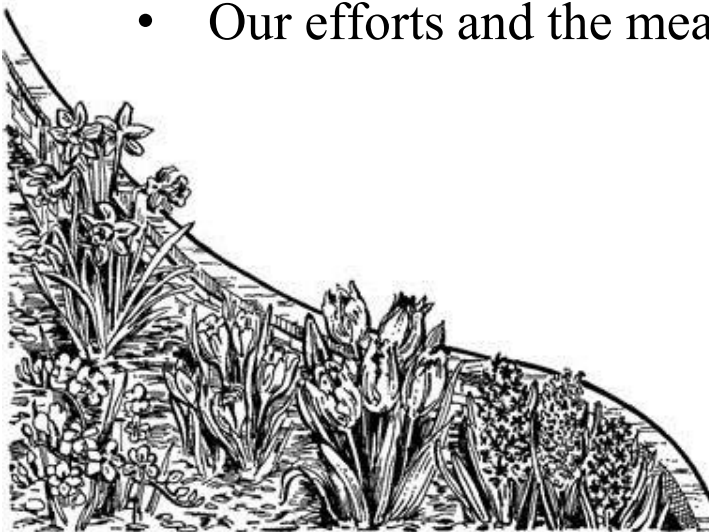
- Nothing happens without Allah's Will.
- What Allah wills takes place.
- What He does not will does not take place.

4. Allah is the Creator

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- Allah is the Creator of everything.
 - There is no creator besides Him.
