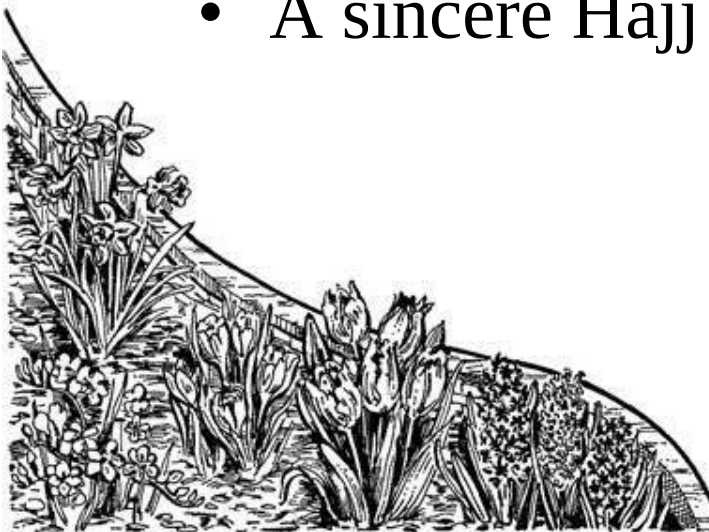
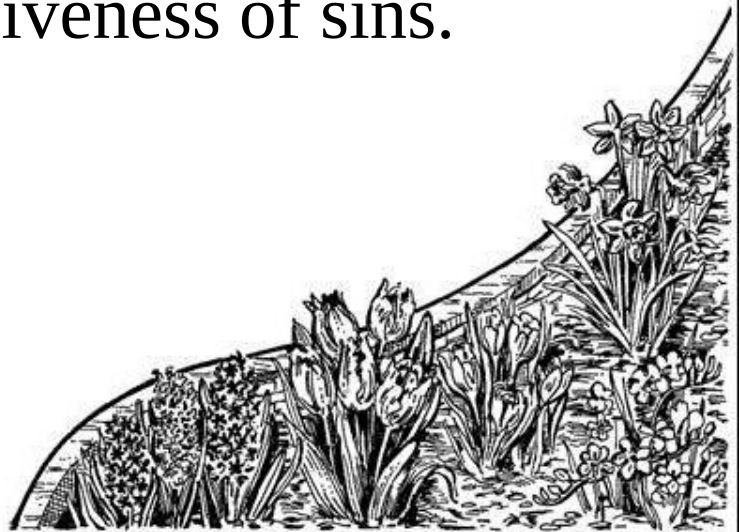


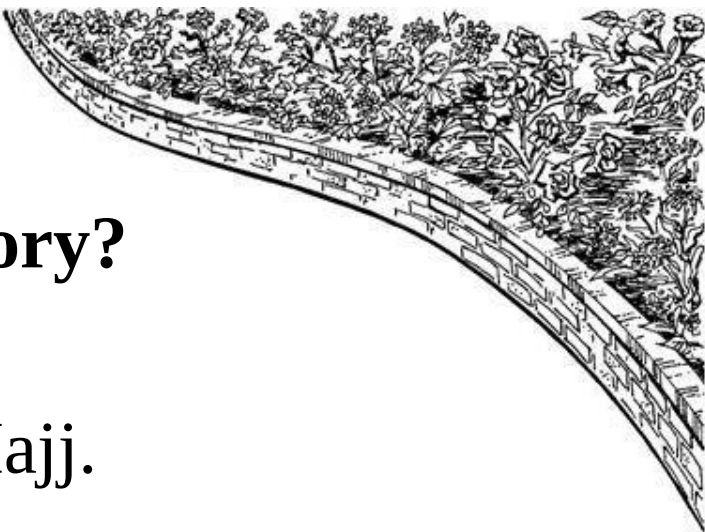
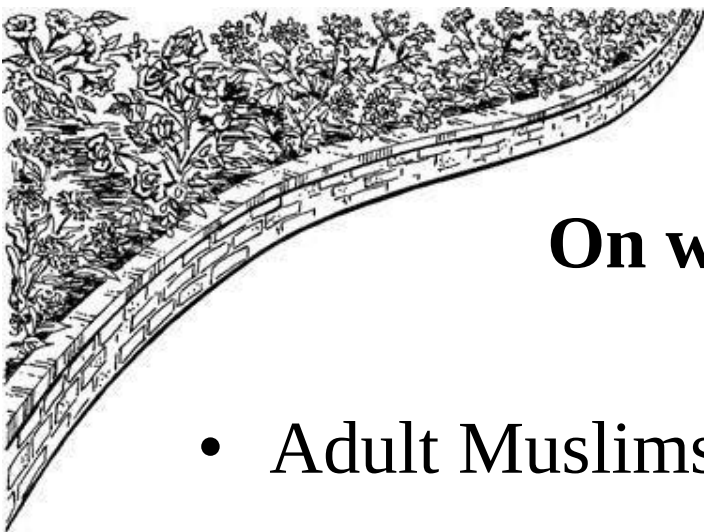
Meaning & Importance

- Hajj means “to intend.”
 - It is the pilgrimage to the Holy Kaaba.
 - Hajj is one of the Five Pillars of Islam.
 - It brings Muslims closer to Allah (SWT).
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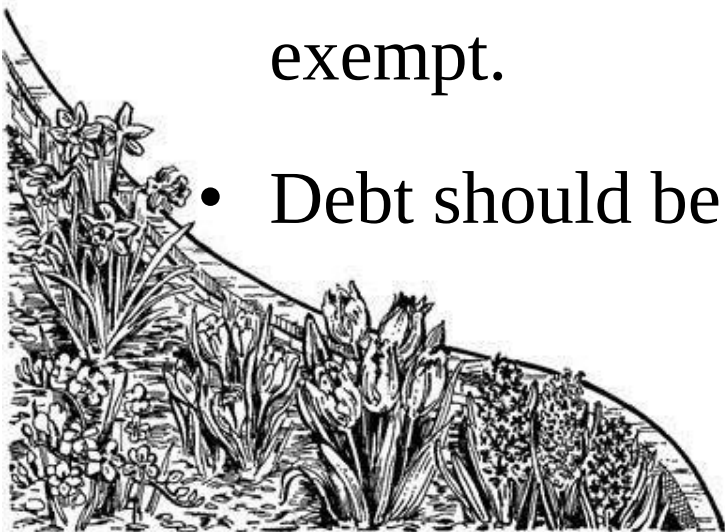


Importance of Hajj

- Hajj teaches patience and devotion.
 - It helps Muslims seek forgiveness.
 - It strengthens faith and unity.
 - A sincere Hajj can lead to forgiveness of sins.
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On whom its obligatory?

- Adult Muslims must perform Hajj.
 - They must be physically able.
 - They must be financially able.
 - Those with serious illness or inability are exempt.
 - Debt should be settled first.
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
