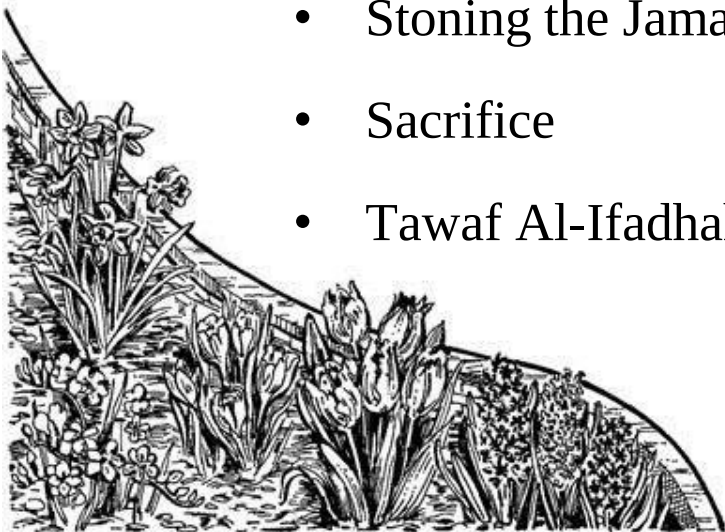


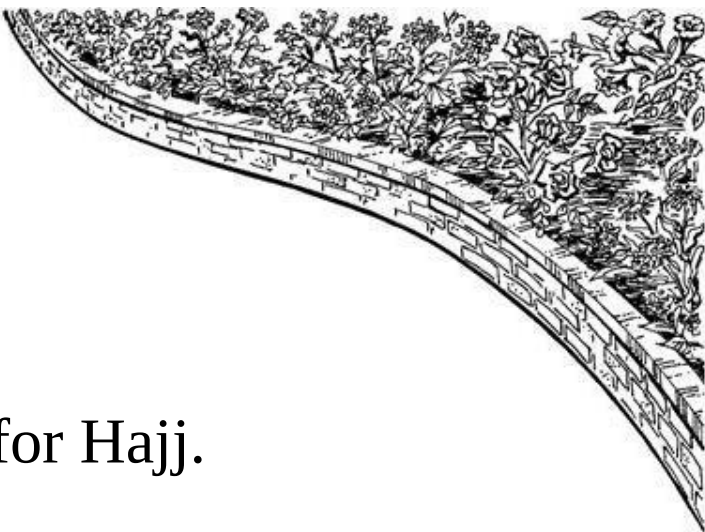
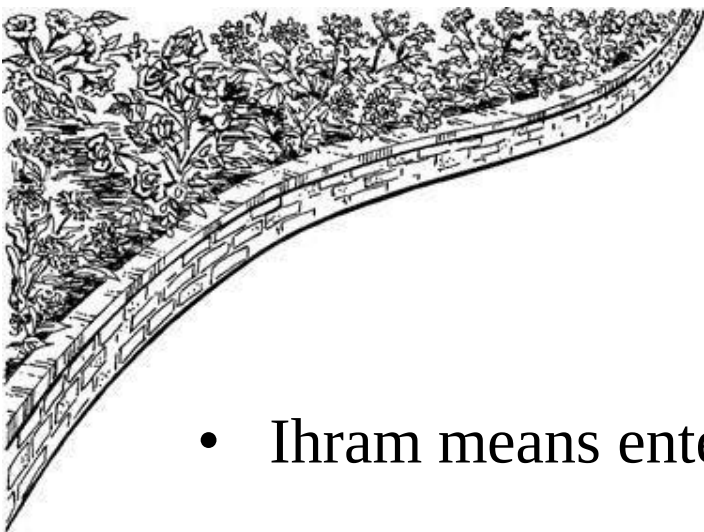
Pillars of Hajj

- Ihram with the intention of Hajj
 - Wuquf at Arafat on 9th Dhul-Hijjah
 - Tawaf after Arafat
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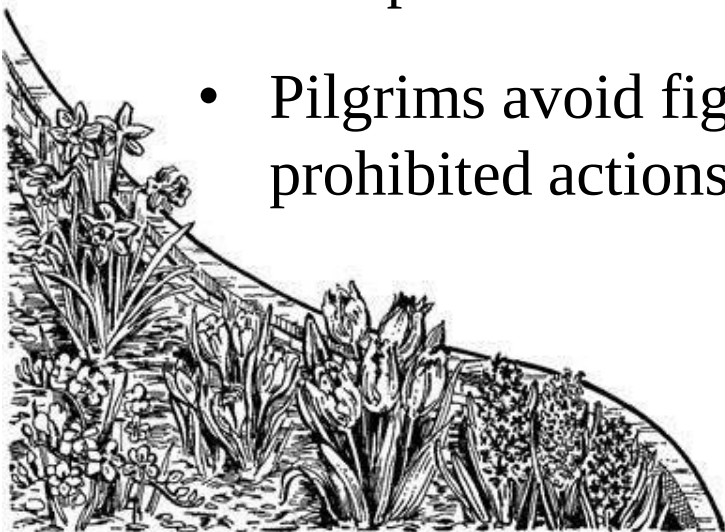


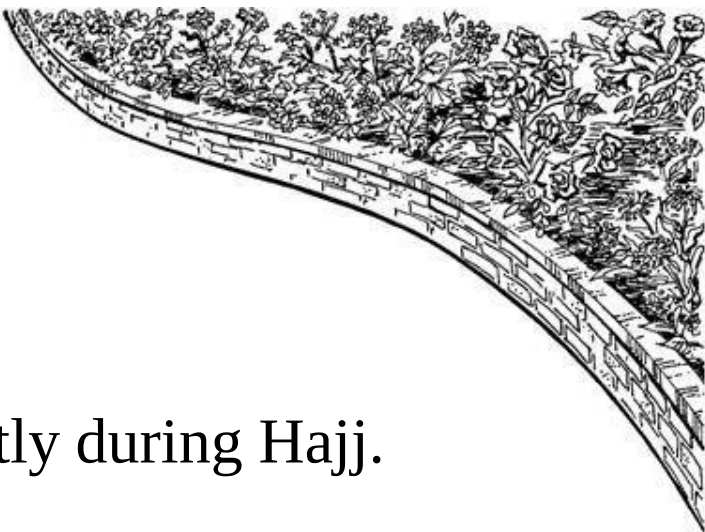
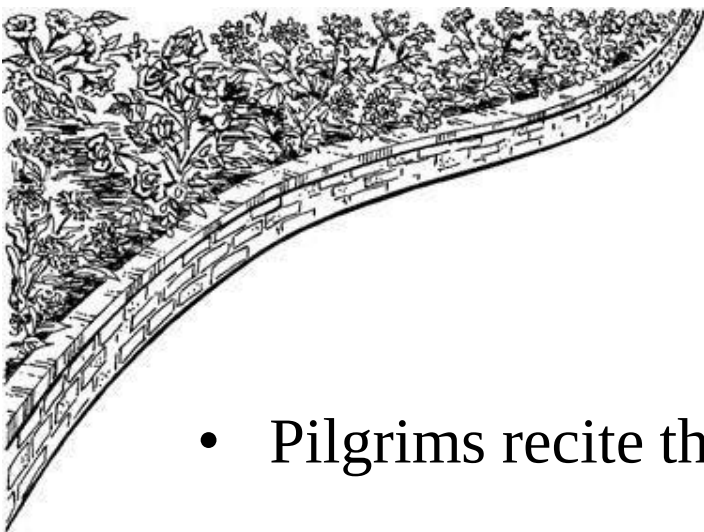
Main Rituals of Hajj

- Ihram
 - Tawaf
 - Sa'i
 - Wuquf at Arafat
 - Shaving or trimming hair
 - Stoning the Jamarat
 - Sacrifice
 - Tawaf Al-Ifadhah
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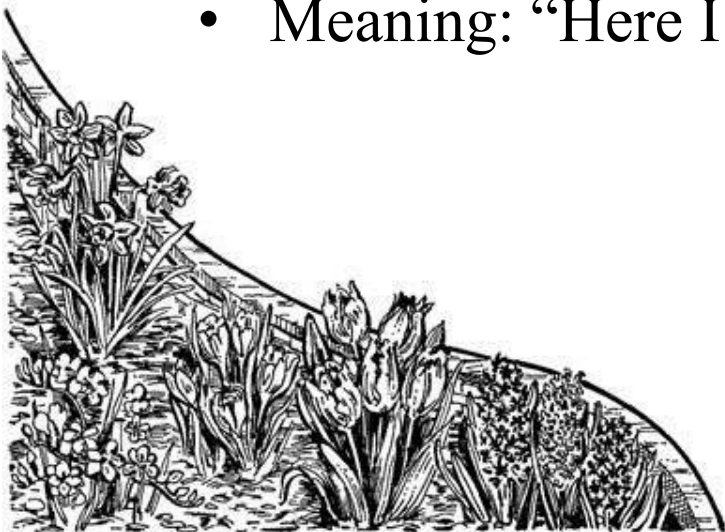
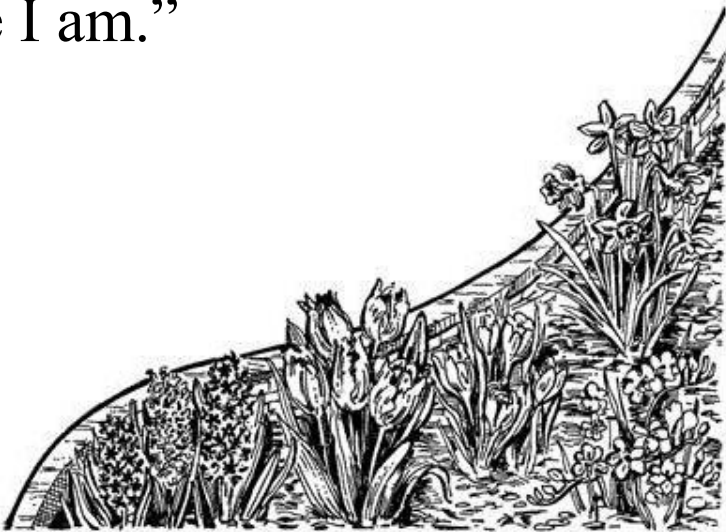


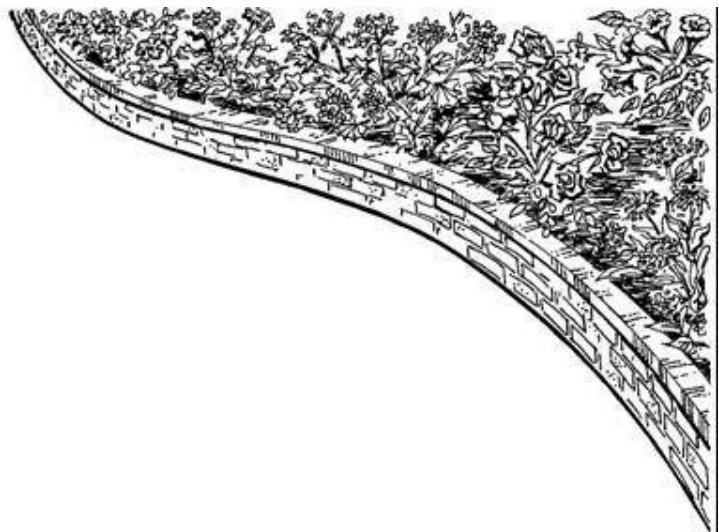
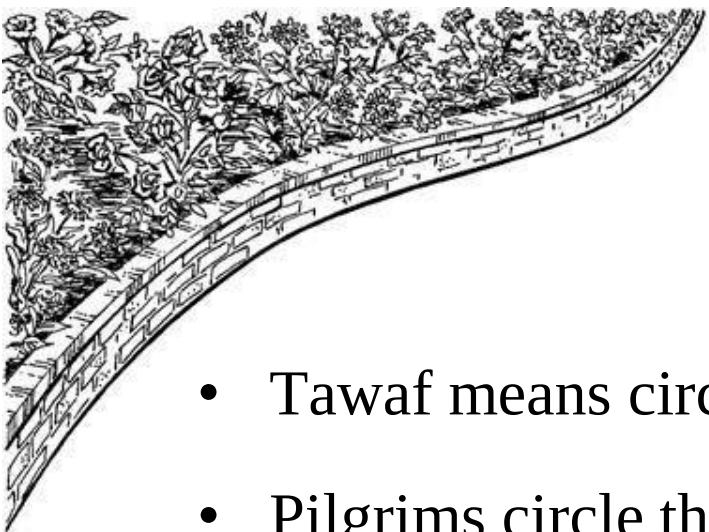
Ihram

- Ihram means entering a sacred state for Hajj.
 - Pilgrims make the intention (Niyyah) for Allah.
 - Men wear two white cloths.
 - Women wear modest clothing covering the body except the face and hands.
 - Pilgrims avoid fighting, perfume, and other prohibited actions.
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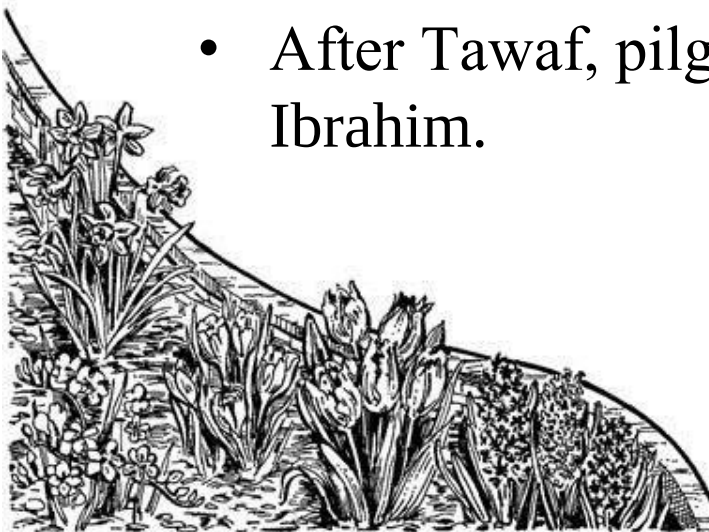


Talbeyah

- Pilgrims recite the Talbeyah frequently during Hajj.
 - Men recite it aloud.
 - Women recite it quietly.
 - “Labbayka Allahumma Labbayk.”
 - Meaning: “Here I am, O Allah, here I am.”
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Tawaf

- Tawaf means circling the Kaaba.
 - Pilgrims circle the Kaaba 7 times.
 - They walk counterclockwise, keeping the Kaaba on their left.
 - Tawaf begins and ends at the Black Stone.
 - After Tawaf, pilgrims pray two Rak'ahs near Maqam Ibrahim.
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
