Revelation to Prophet Muhammad (PBUH)

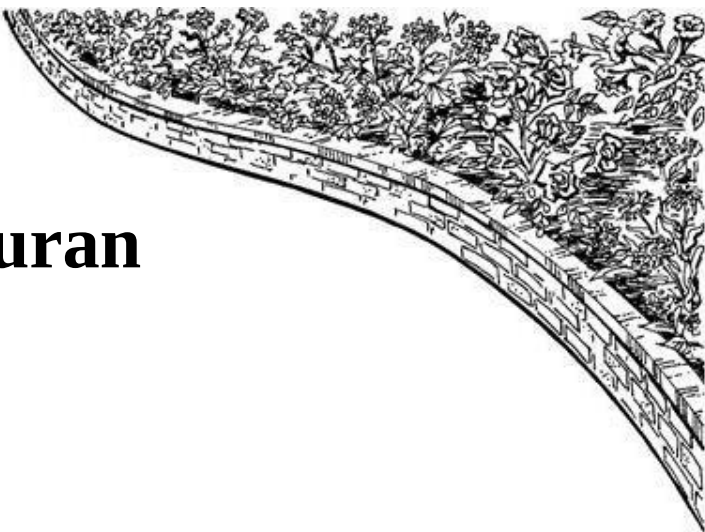
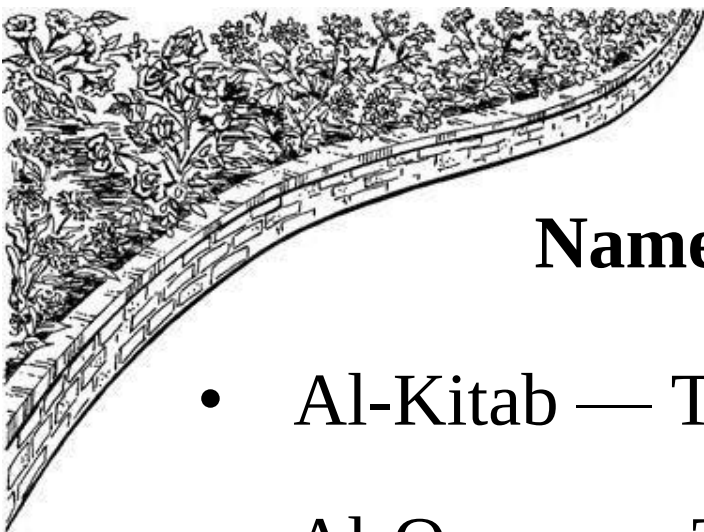
- The first revelation came in the Cave of Hira.

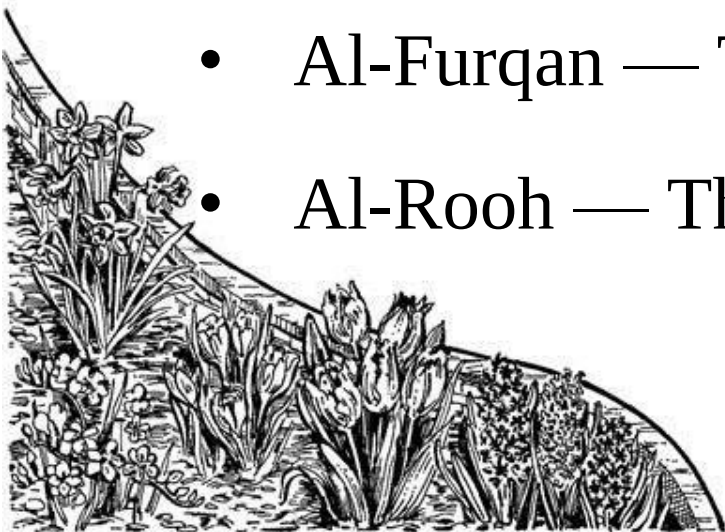
Meaning of the Quran

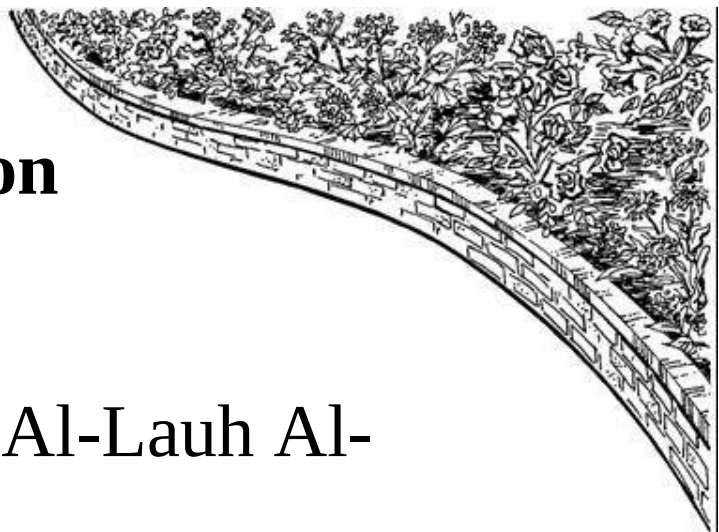
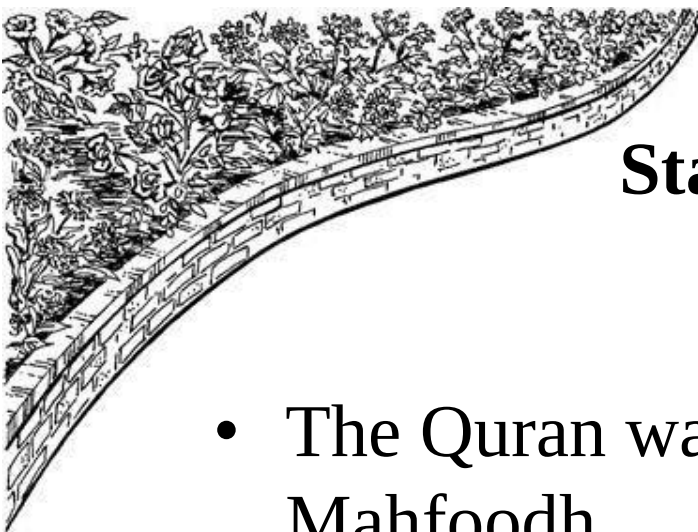
The word “Quran” is derived from the Arabic root “Qara”, which means “to recite” or “to read.” Thus, the Quran is a book meant to be read and recited repeatedly. It is widely regarded as the most read book in the world.



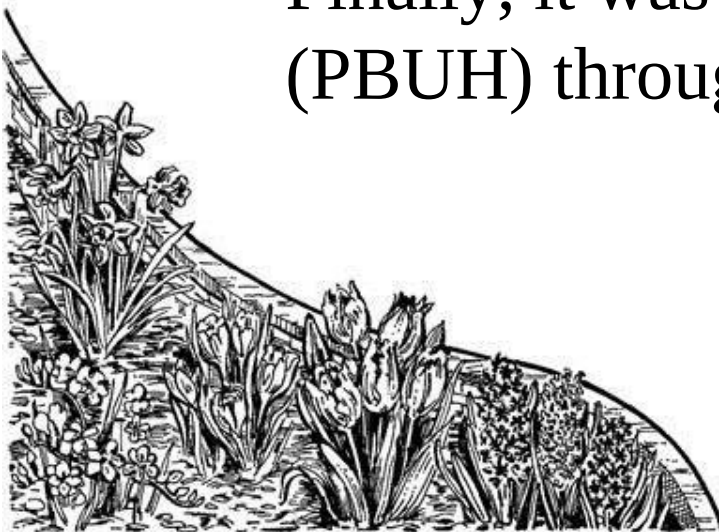


Names of the Holy Quran

- The Quran was first written in Al-Lauh Al-Mahfoodh.
 - It was then revealed to Bait-ul-Izzah in the lower heaven.
 - Finally, it was revealed to Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) through Jibril (AS).
