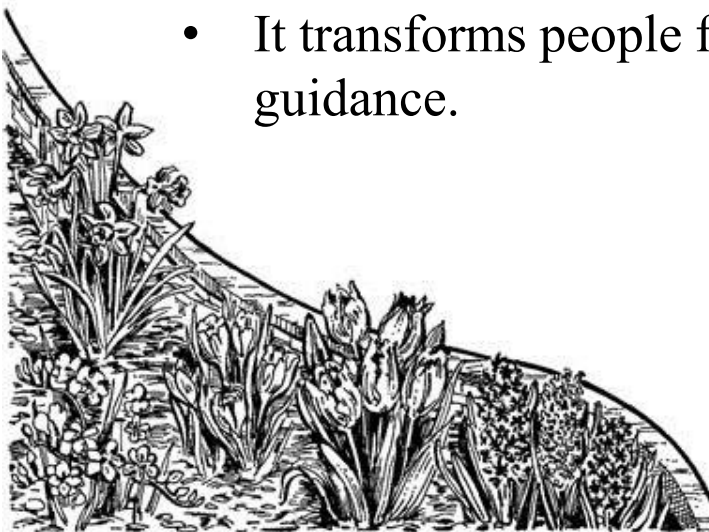


Characteristics of the Qur'an

- A Miraculous Book: Its unique language, depth, wisdom, and powerful impact make it inimitable.
 - Lessons from Past Nations: Contains stories of Prophets and previous communities, providing moral lessons and warnings.
 - Complete & Comprehensive Code: Provides guidance for worship, morality, social relationships, justice, and daily life.
 - Guidance for Humanity: Offers principles for achieving personal and social well-being in this world and the Hereafter.
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Authority of Qur'an

- Surah Bani Isra'il 17:9: The Quran guides humanity to what is most upright and best.
 - It gives glad tidings of a great reward to believers who do good deeds.
 - The Quran is described as a clear Book (Kitab-un-Mubeen) and a light from Allah. Allah guides those who seek His pleasure from darkness into light and toward the straight path. (5:15-16)
 - The Quran is an authority and proof in itself.
 - When approached with sincerity and good intention, it becomes a source of guidance.
 - It transforms people from ignorance to wisdom, knowledge, and guidance.
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
