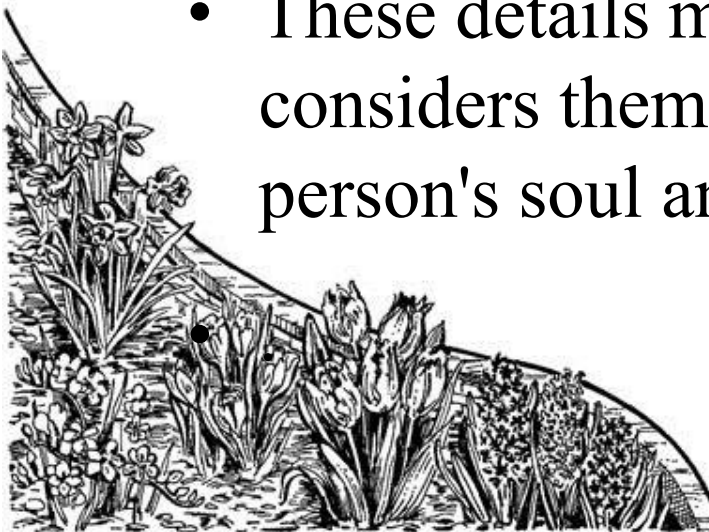
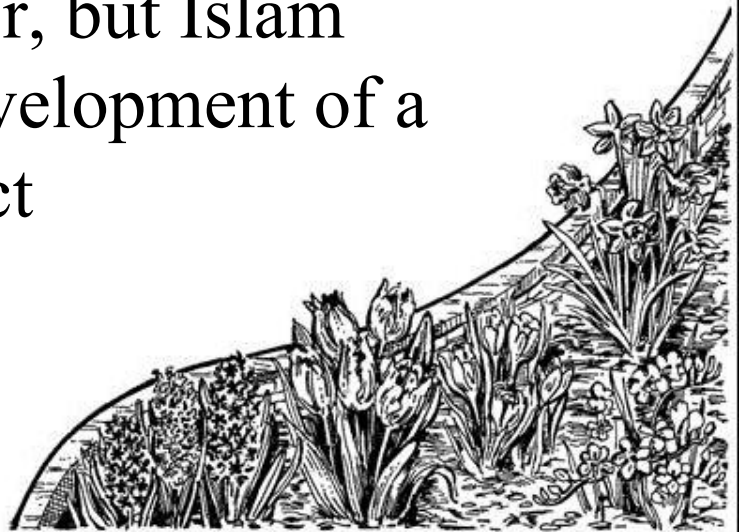
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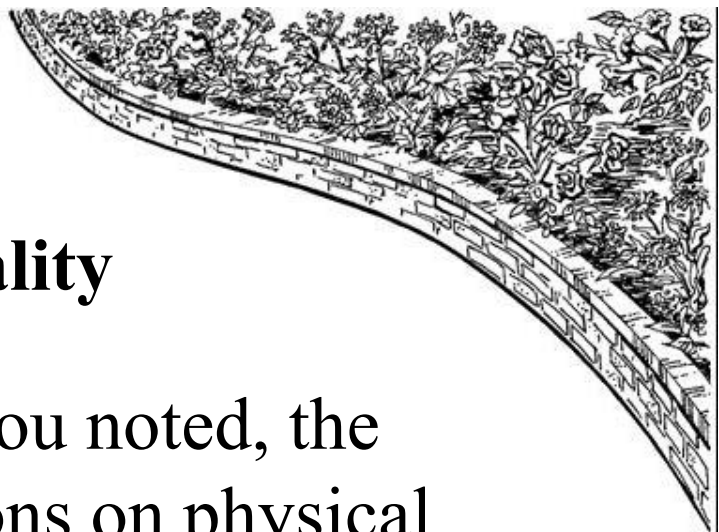
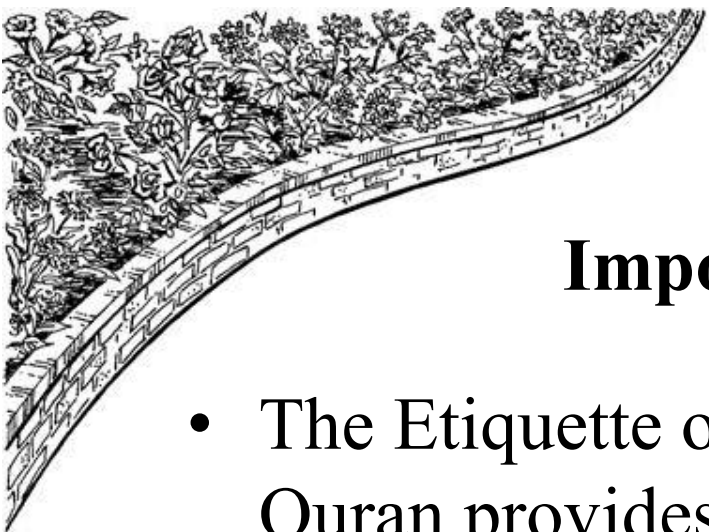
Explaining the importance of morality in Islam and how Prophet Muhammad (S.A.W.) exemplified ethical behavior as a model for Muslims



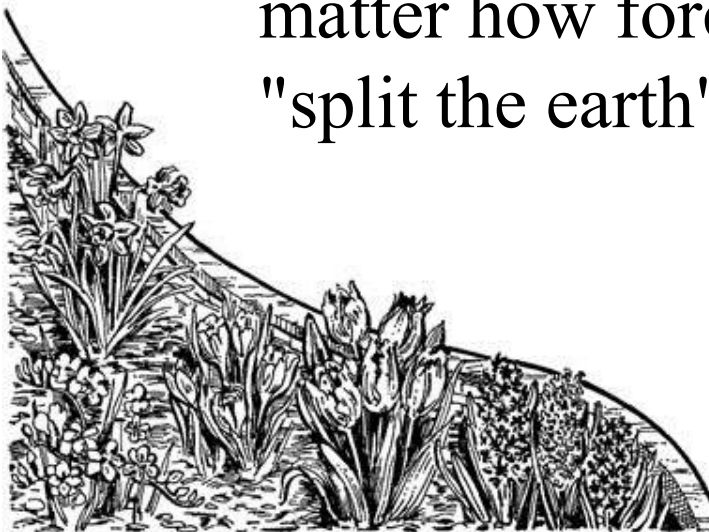
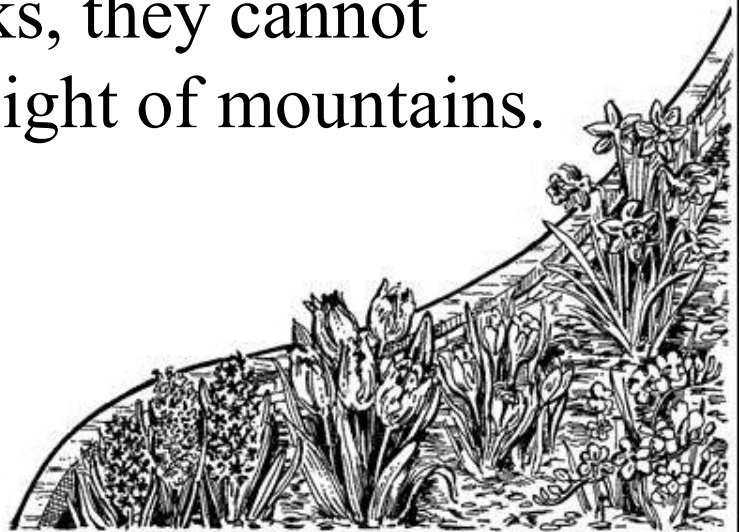


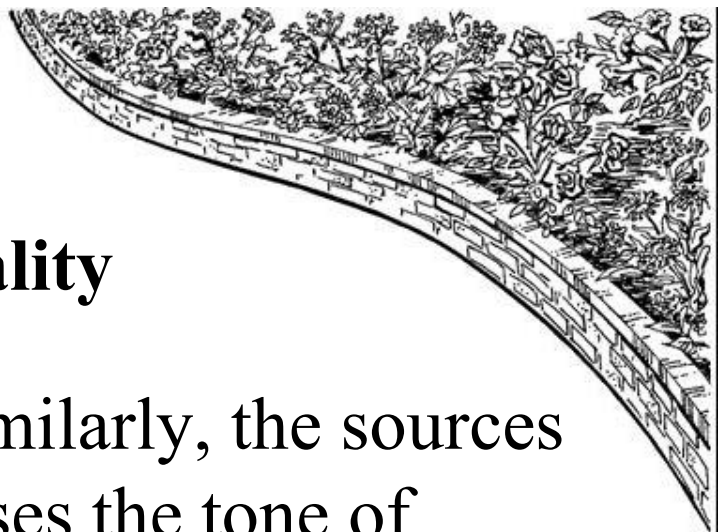
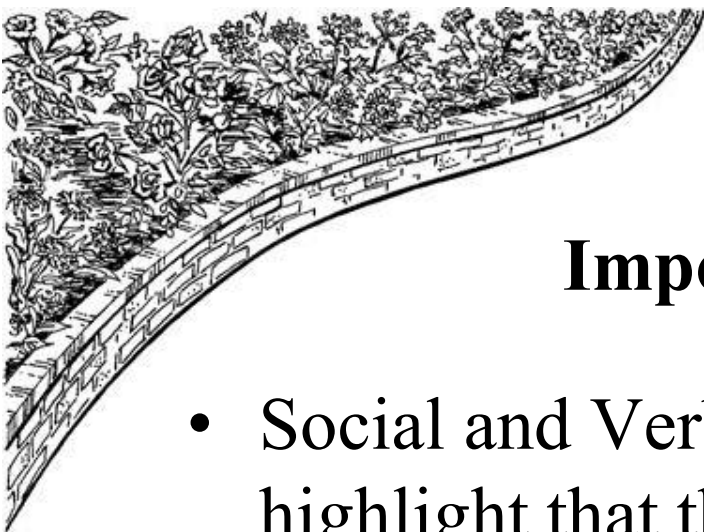
Importance of Morality

- While the Quran is often characterized as a book of general principles (Kulliya), providing the overarching framework for belief and law, it uniquely includes specific, particular injunctions (Juzia) when it comes to morality.
 - These details might seem minor, but Islam considers them vital for the development of a person's soul and social conduct
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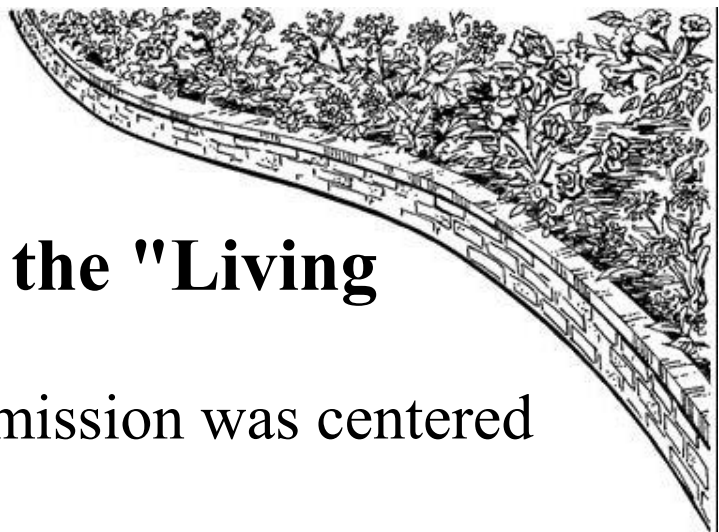
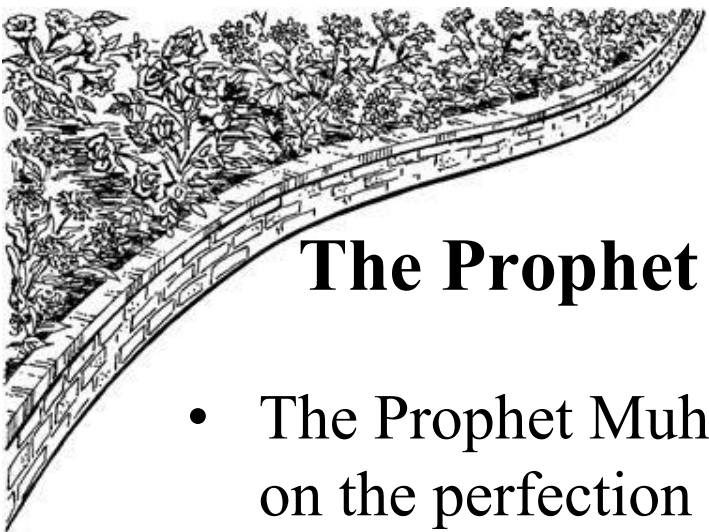
Importance of Morality

- The Etiquette of Walking: As you noted, the Quran provides direct instructions on physical movement to combat arrogance and vanity
 - . Believers are told to walk with modesty and humility, as a reminder of human limitations—no matter how forcefully one walks, they cannot "split the earth" or reach the height of mountains.
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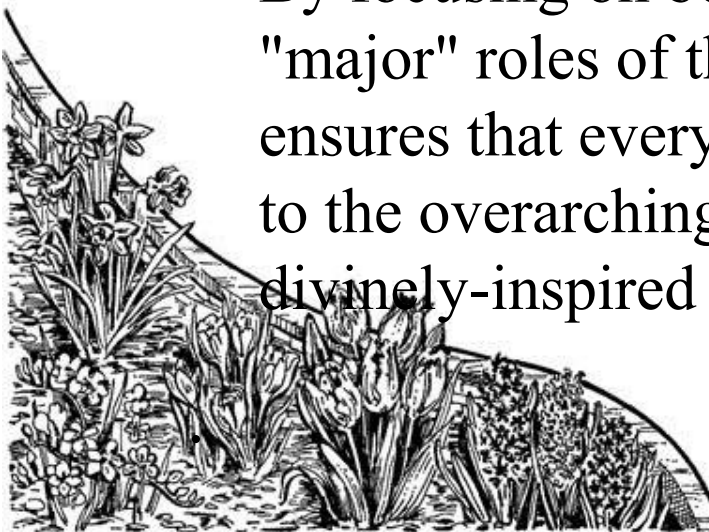
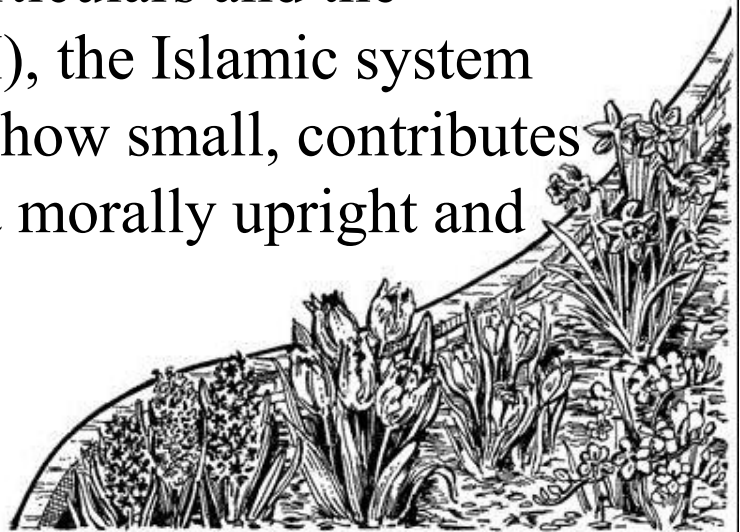


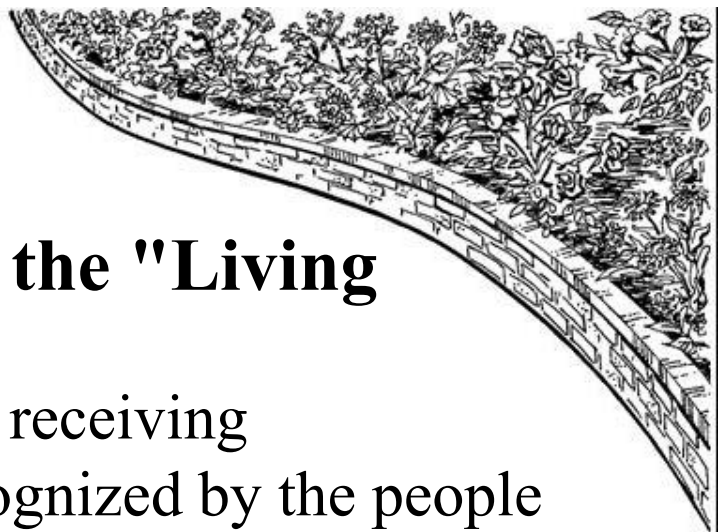
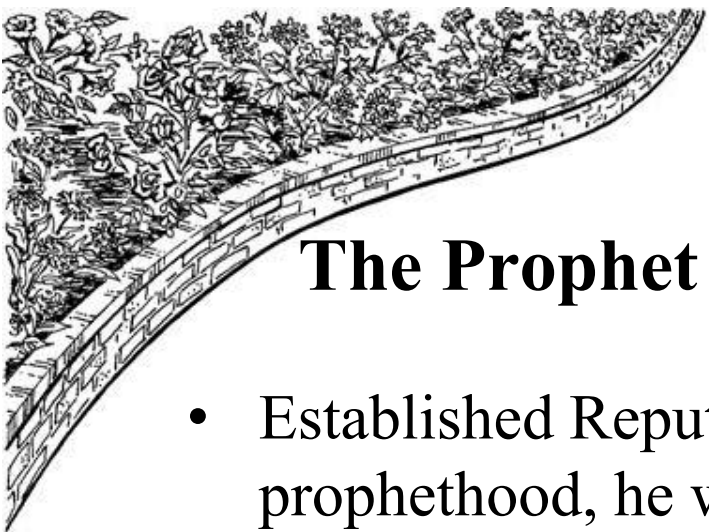
Importance of Morality

- Social and Verbal Etiquette: Similarly, the sources highlight that the Quran addresses the tone of voice, discouraging loud or harsh speech by comparing it to the "braying of a donkey"
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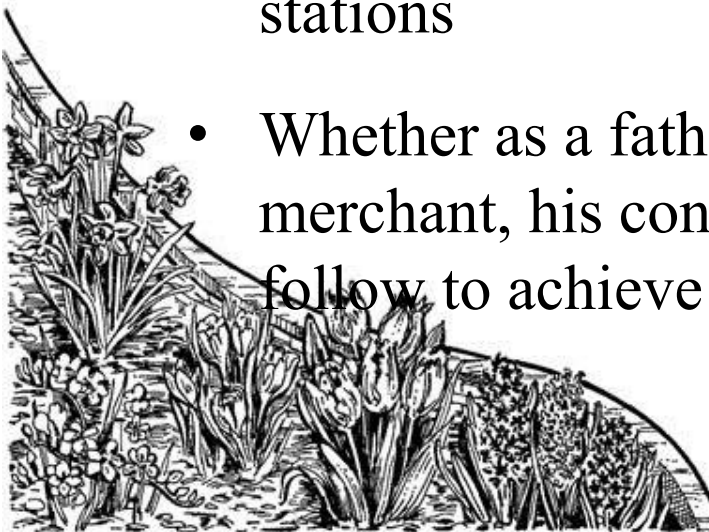


The Prophet Muhammad as the "Living Example"

- The Prophet Muhammad's (PBUH) mission was centered on the perfection of character.
 - His life serves as a standardized, practical model that proves Islamic ethics are not just theoretical but are aligned with human nature (fīrat).
 - By focusing on both the "minor" particulars and the "major" roles of the Prophet (PBUH), the Islamic system ensures that every action, no matter how small, contributes to the overarching goal of creating a morally upright and divinely-inspired individual.
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The Prophet Muhammad as the "Living Example"

- Established Reputation: Long before receiving prophethood, he was universally recognized by the people of Makkah for his integrity, earning the titles "Sadiq" (the Truthful) and "Amin" (the Trustworthy/Honest)
 - A Complete Model for All Roles: His life provides a "living picture" of how to apply ethics across various social stations
 - Whether as a father, a military leader, a guardian, or a merchant, his conduct offers a blueprint for believers to follow to achieve success in both worlds.
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
