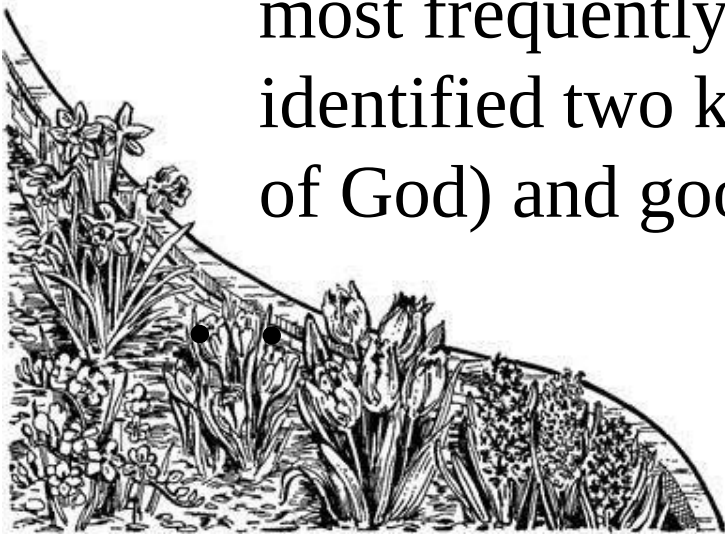
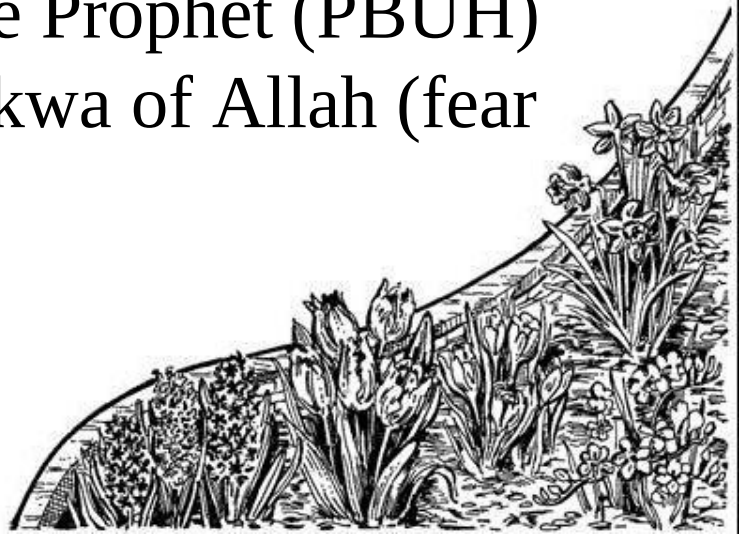


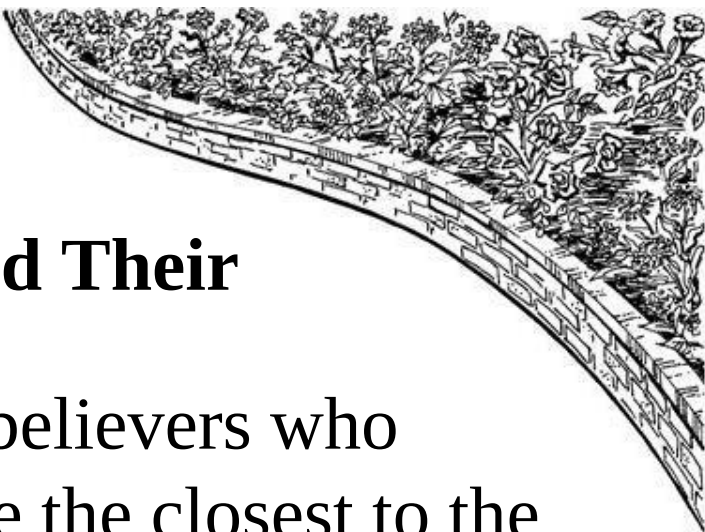
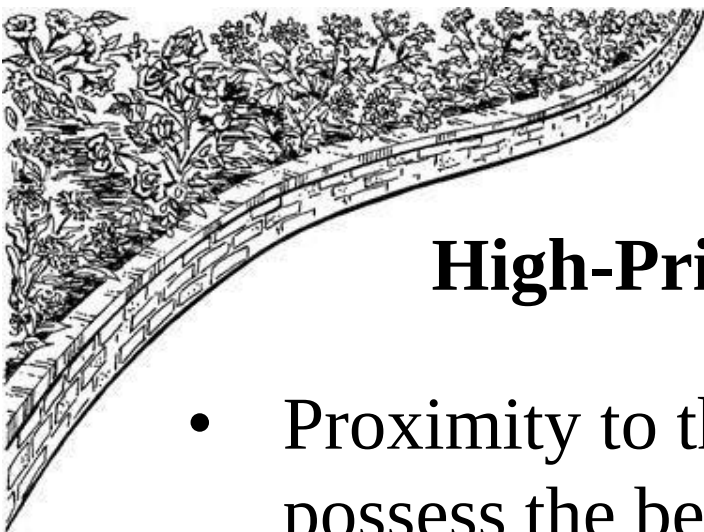
Some Important Morals in Quran

- Parents: Believers are commanded to treat their parents with the utmost kindness, especially in old age, and are forbidden from saying even a word of frustration ("uff") to them.
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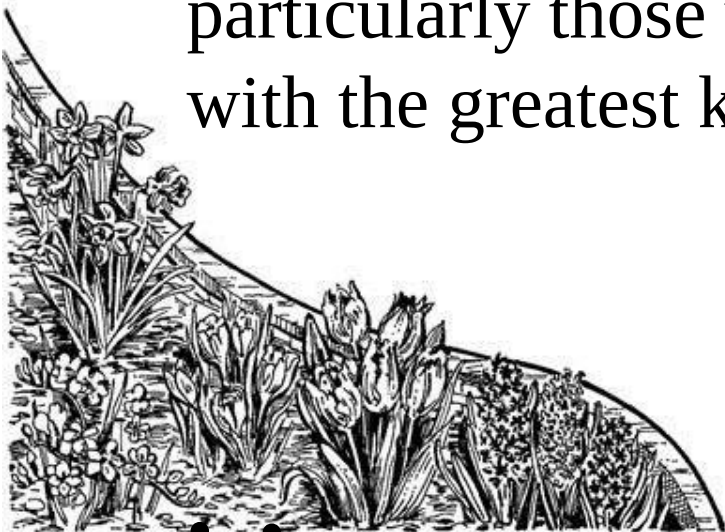
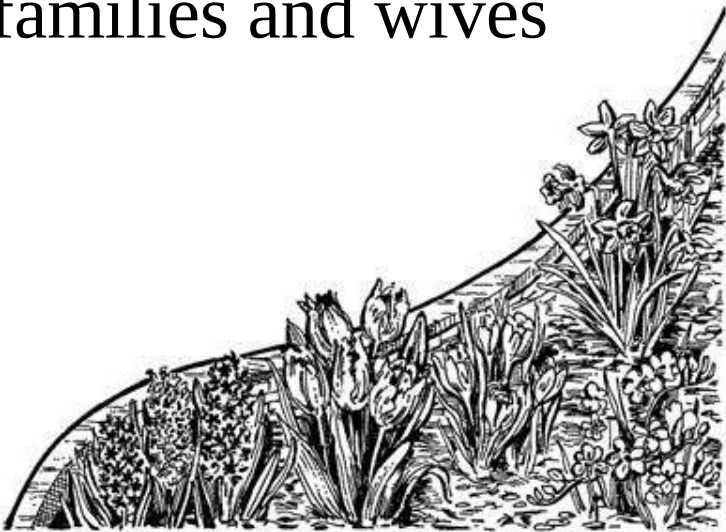


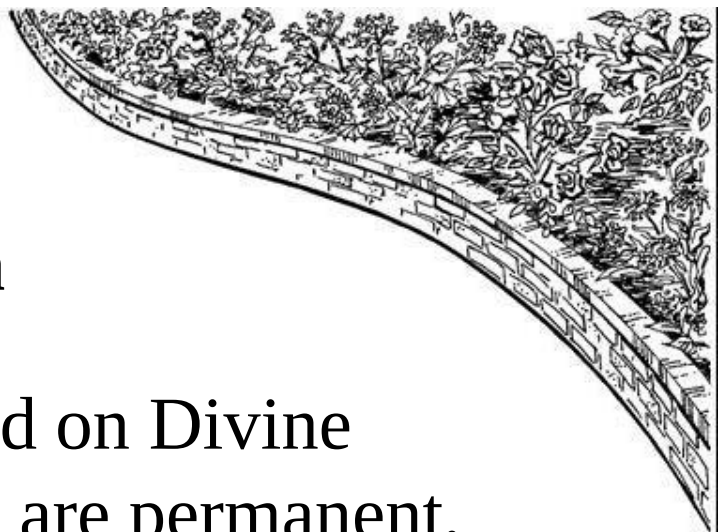
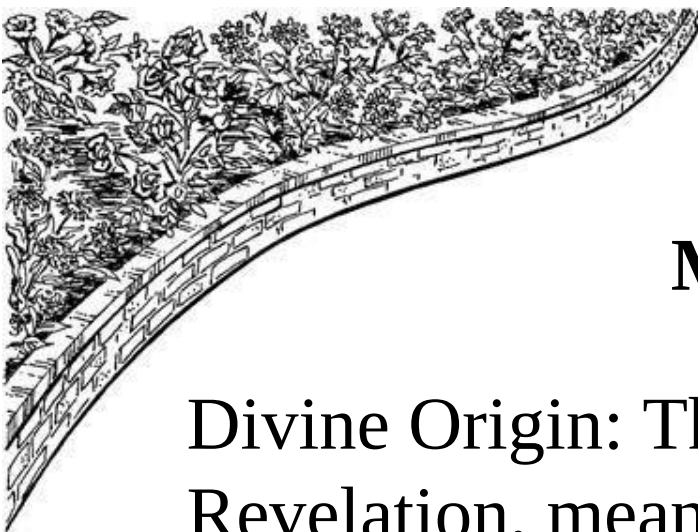
High-Priority Morals and Their Rewards

- Weight on the Scale: The Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) stated that the heaviest thing to be placed on the balance of a believer on the Day of Judgment will be good behavior.
 - Path to Paradise: When asked which actions lead most frequently to Paradise, the Prophet (PBUH) identified two key factors: "Takwa of Allah (fear of God) and good conduct".
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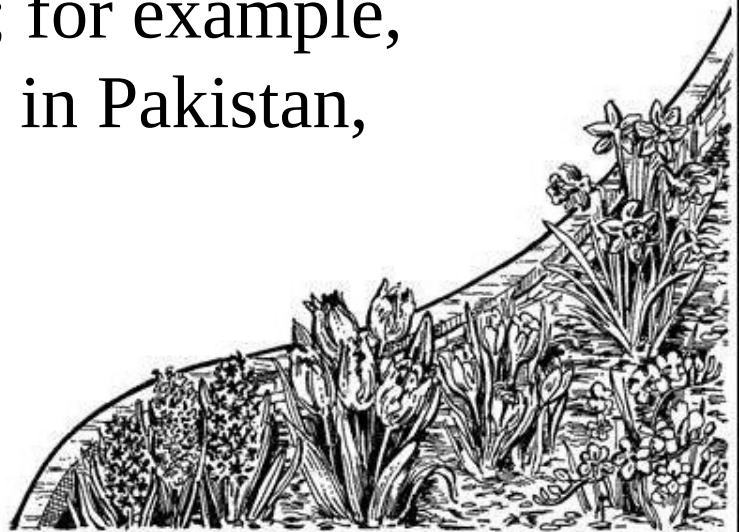
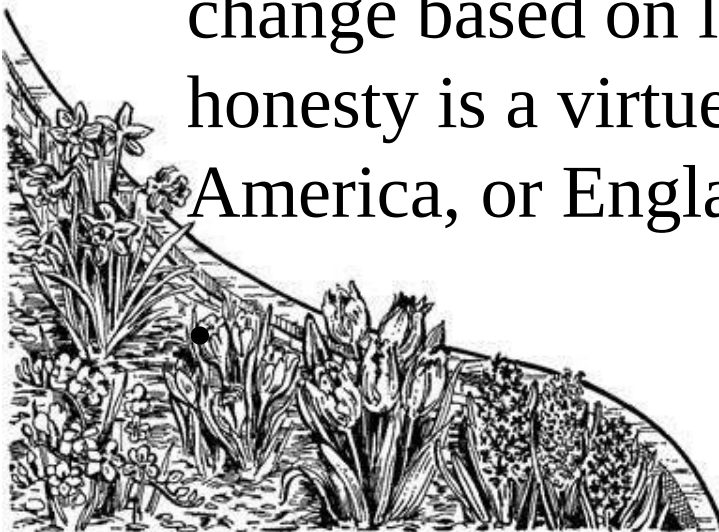
High-Priority Morals and Their Rewards

- Proximity to the Prophet: The believers who possess the best conduct will be the closest to the Prophet on the Day of Resurrection..
 - Perfection of Faith: The most perfect of believers in faith are those with the most excellent behavior, particularly those who treat their families and wives with the greatest kindness.
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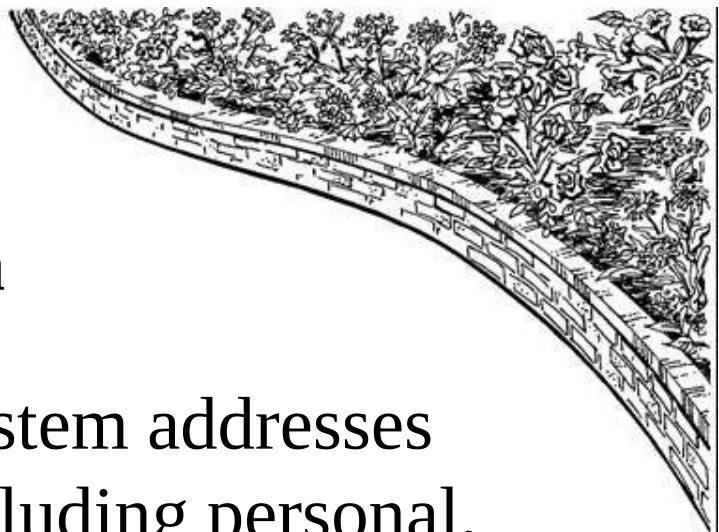
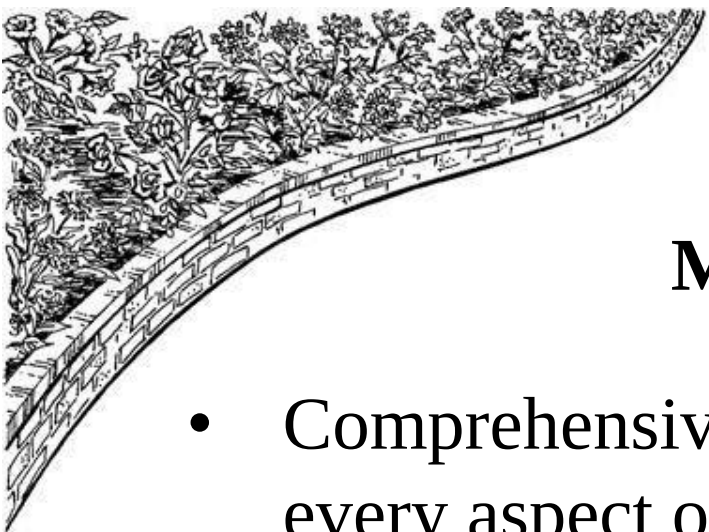


Morals in Quran

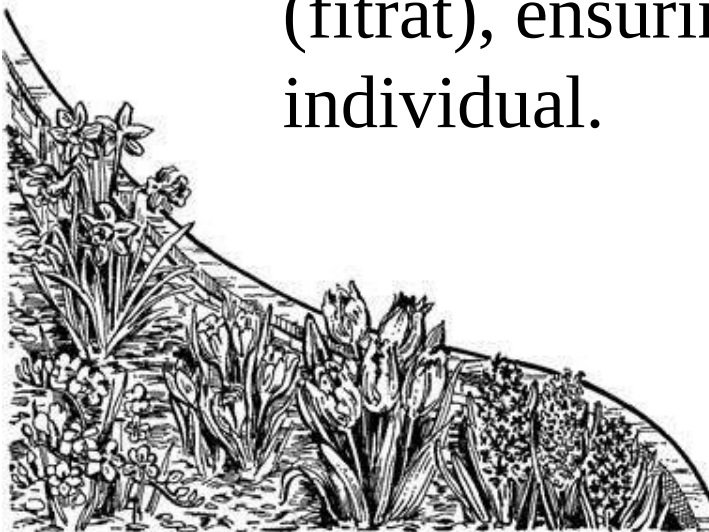
Divine Origin: The system is based on Divine Revelation, meaning its principles are permanent, unchangeable, and provide a guide for all future generations.



Universality: Islamic ethics are universal and do not change based on location or time; for example, honesty is a virtue whether one is in Pakistan, America, or England.

 - Practical and Natural: The rules are designed to be practical and aligned with human nature (fitrat), ensuring they are achievable for every individual.
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
