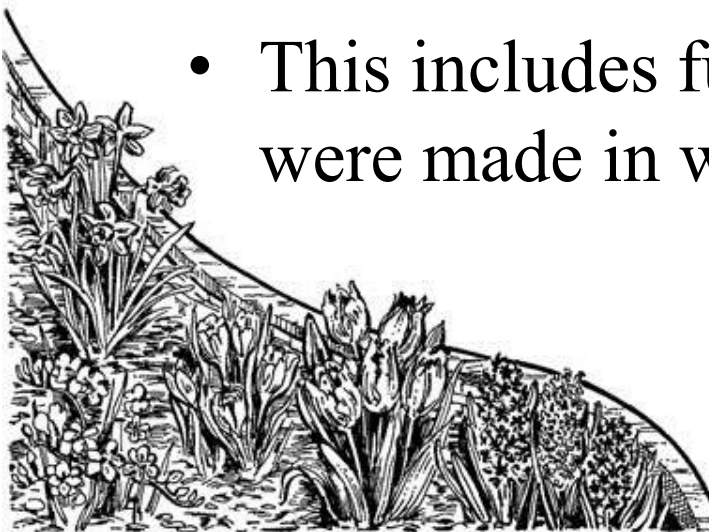
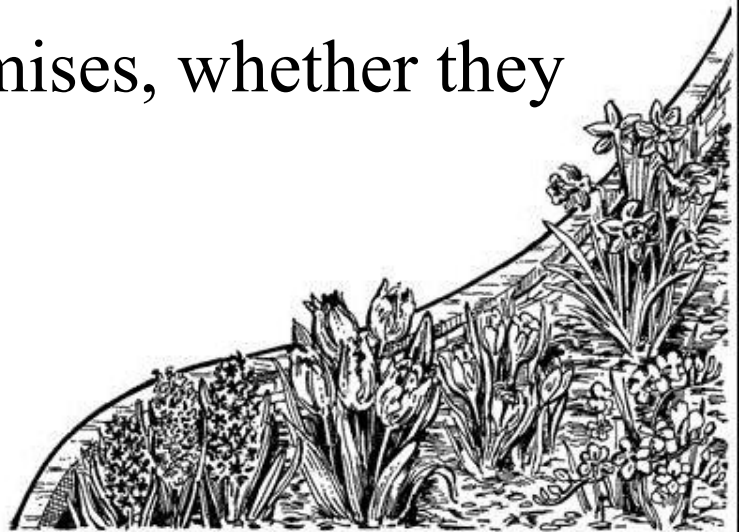
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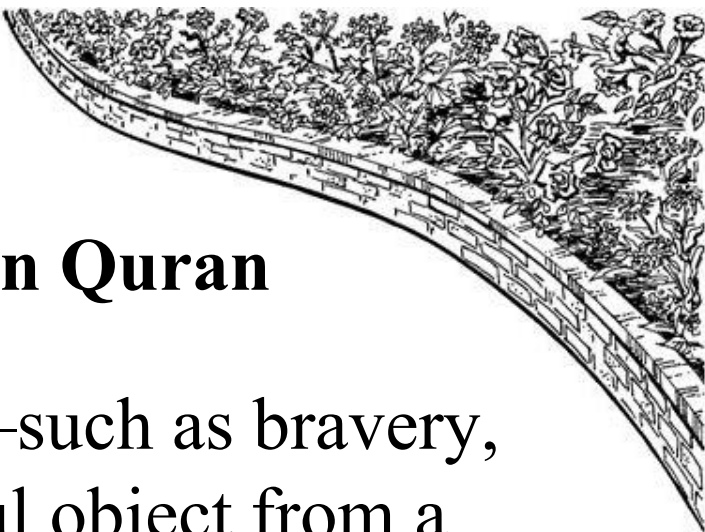
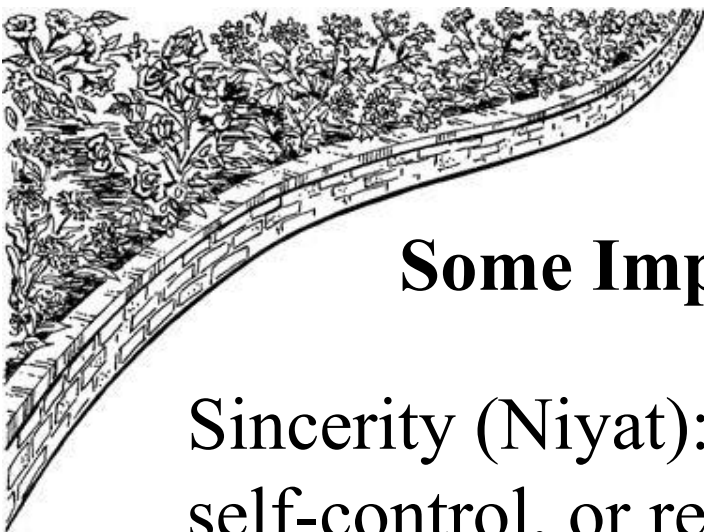
Identifying key moral teachings from the Qur'an and Hadith that guide behavior toward people, animals, and daily conduct.





Some Important Morals in Quran

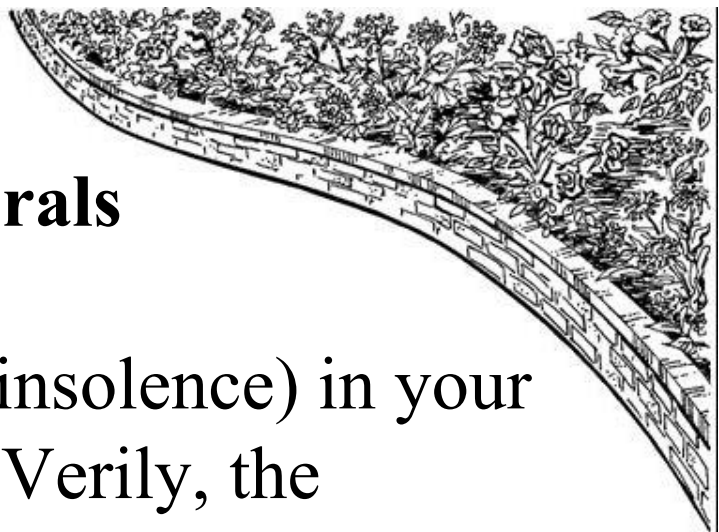
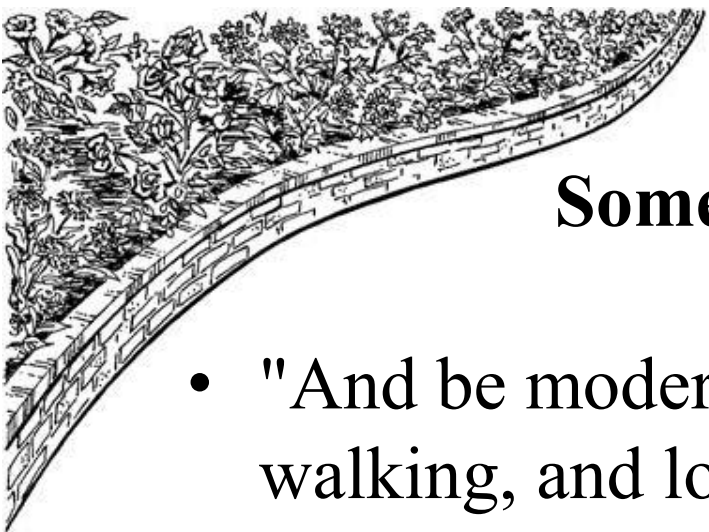
- Kindness to Others: Believers are instructed to be nice to their relatives (Zil-Kurba), neighbors, orphans, and the poor.
 - Honesty and Truthfulness: Telling the truth and being honest (Amanat) are fundamental duties
 - This includes fulfilling all promises, whether they were made in writing or orally.
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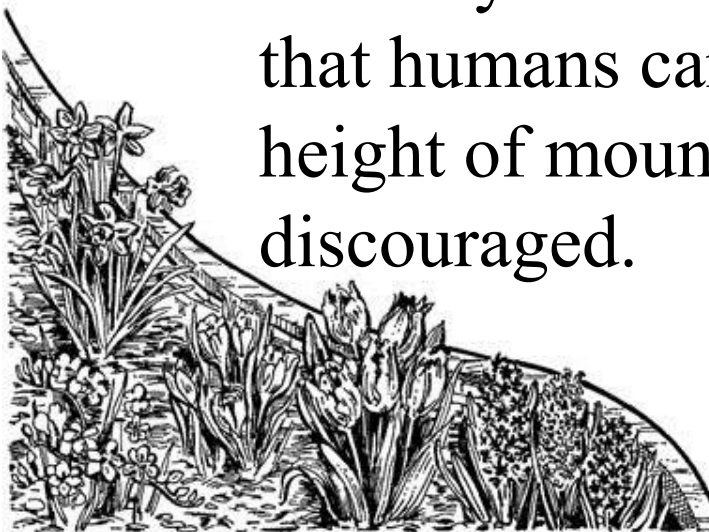
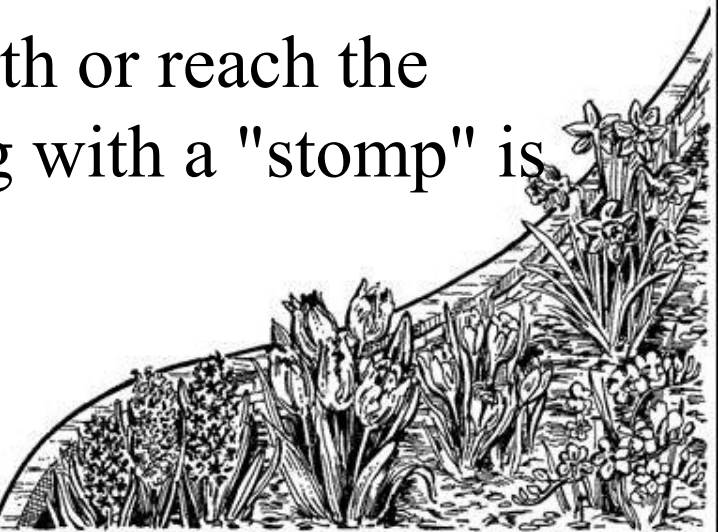

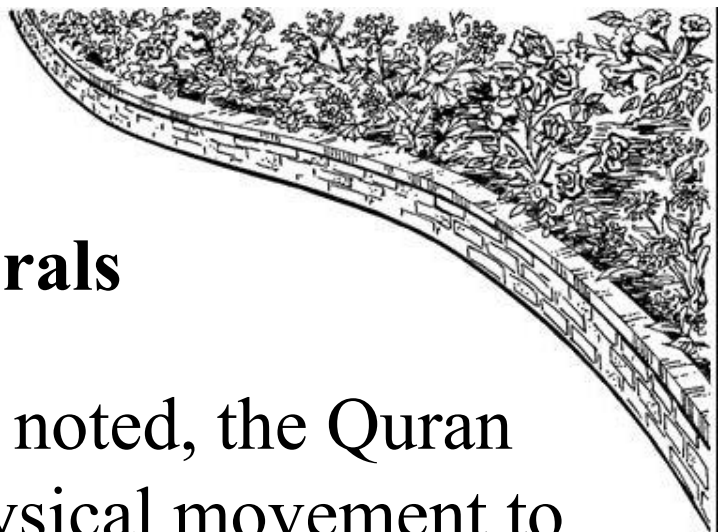
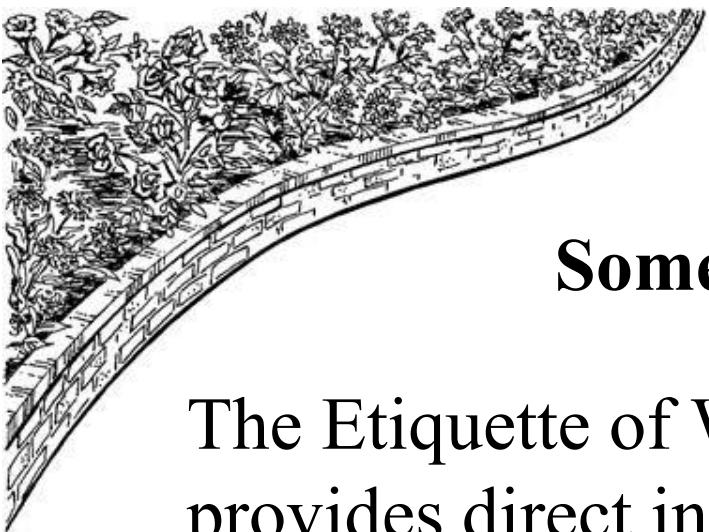
Sincerity (Niyat): All moral acts—such as bravery, self-control, or removing a harmful object from a path—only hold value and earn a reward if they are done with sincere and good intentions.

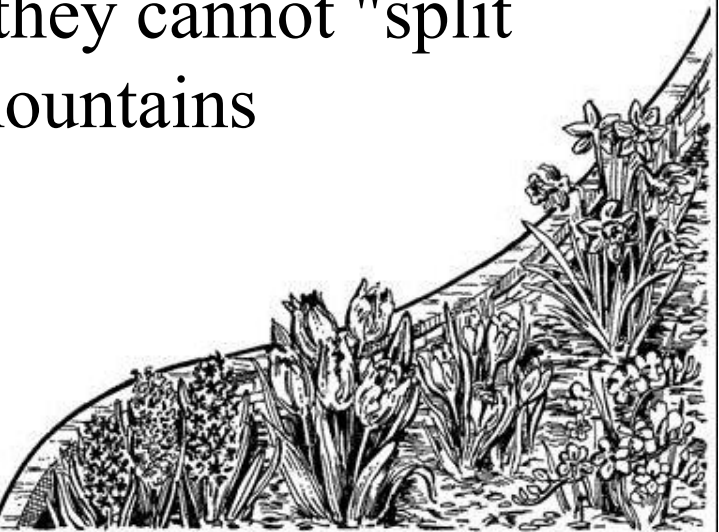
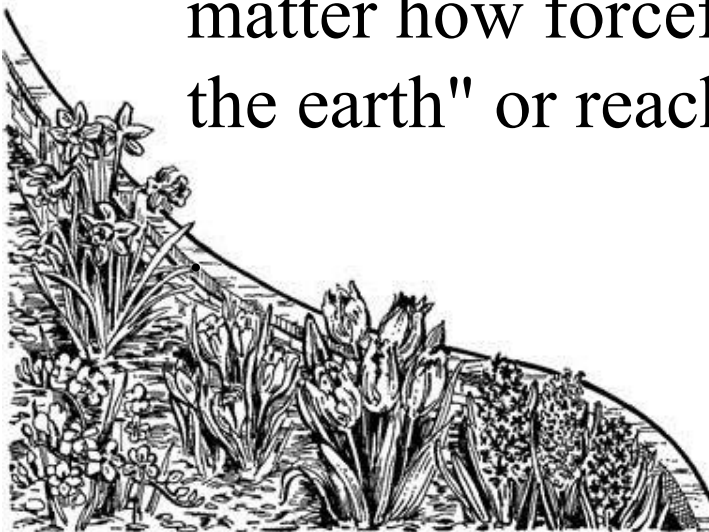
- "And be moderate (or show no insolence) in your walking, and lower your voice. Verily, the harshest of all voices is the braying of the asses."
 - Modesty in Walking: The Quran specifically instructs believers to walk with modesty and humility rather than arrogance or conceit. It notes that humans cannot split the earth or reach the height of mountains, so walking with a "stomp" is discouraged.
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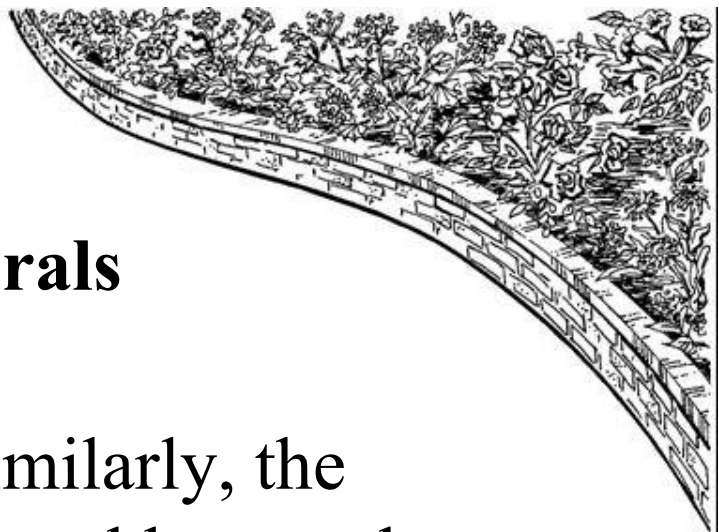
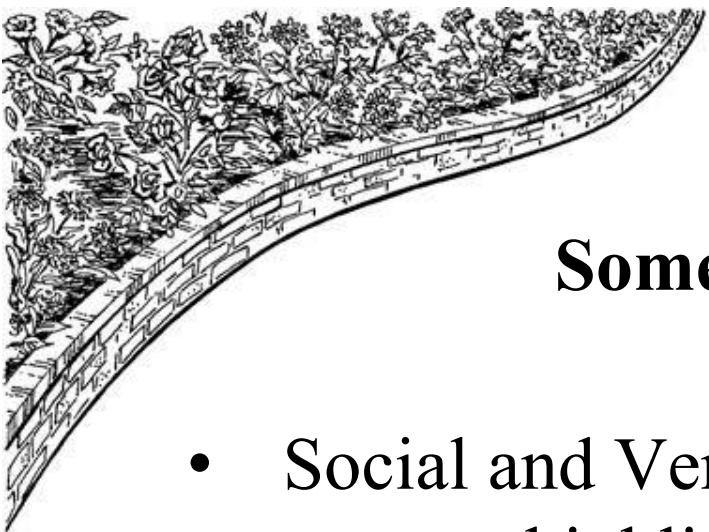

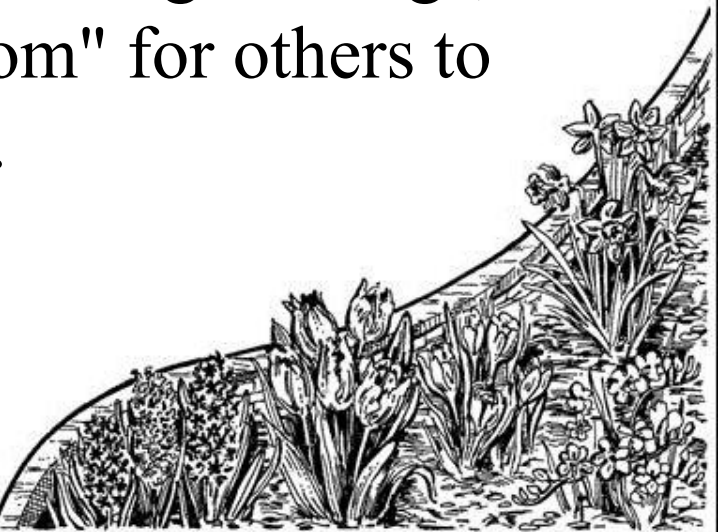
The Etiquette of Walking: As you noted, the Quran provides direct instructions on physical movement to combat arrogance and vanity

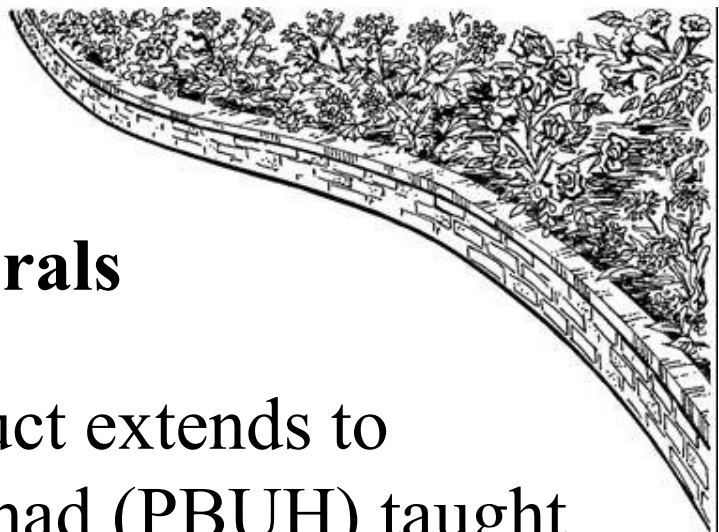
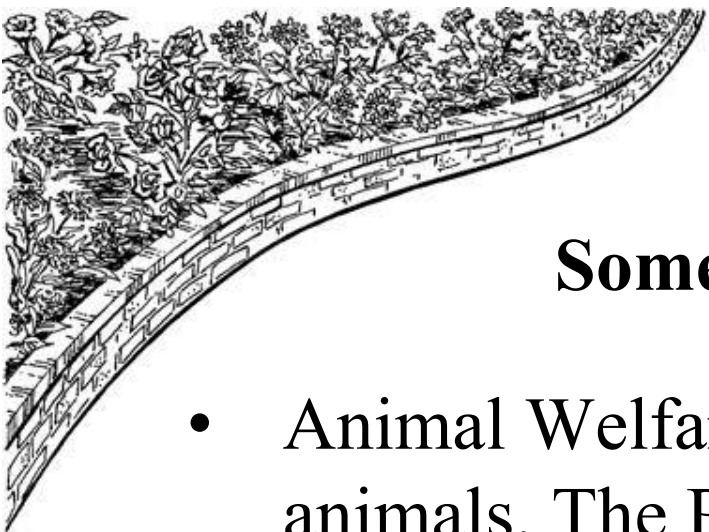
Believers are told to walk with modesty and humility, as a reminder of human limitations—no matter how forcefully one walks, they cannot "split the earth" or reach the height of mountains



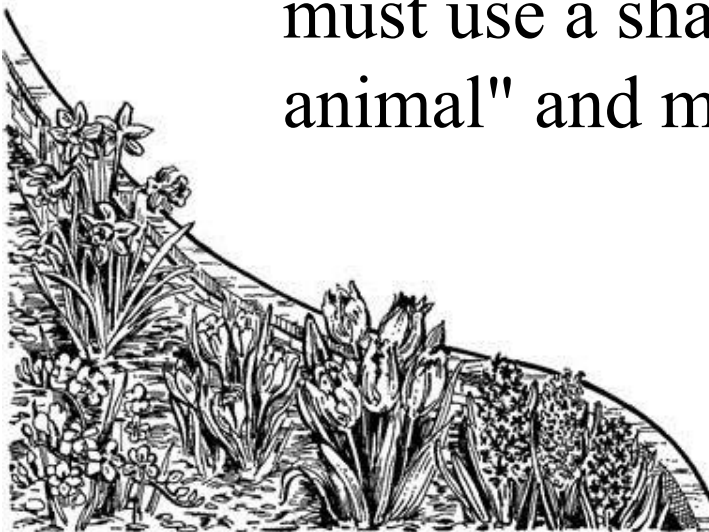


Some Important Morals

- Social and Verbal Etiquette: Similarly, the sources highlight that the Quran addresses the tone of voice, discouraging loud or harsh speech by comparing it to the "braying of a donkey".
 - It even provides guidance for social gatherings, instructing people to "make room" for others to ensure comfort and inclusivity.
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Some Important Morals

- Animal Welfare: Ethical conduct extends to animals. The Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) taught that animals should be kept in good health and treated with care
 - Even when slaughtering an animal for food, one must use a sharp knife to "give ease to the animal" and minimize its pain•
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
