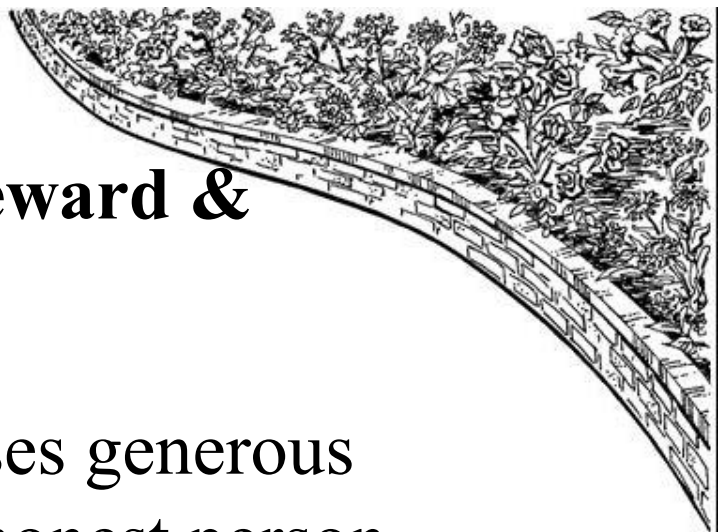
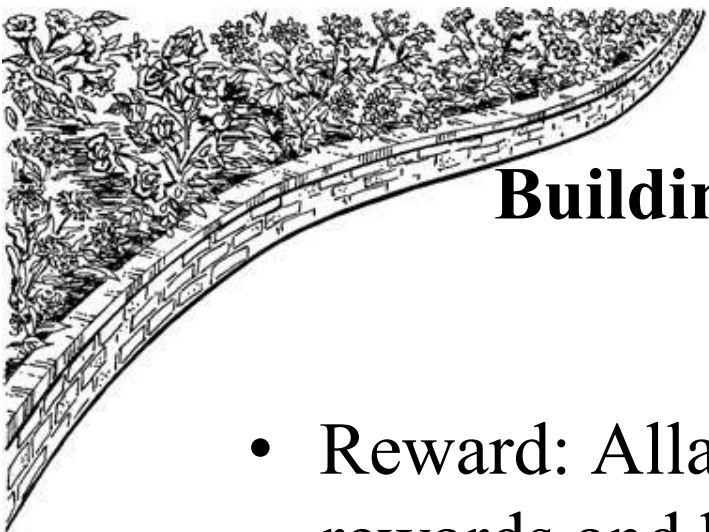




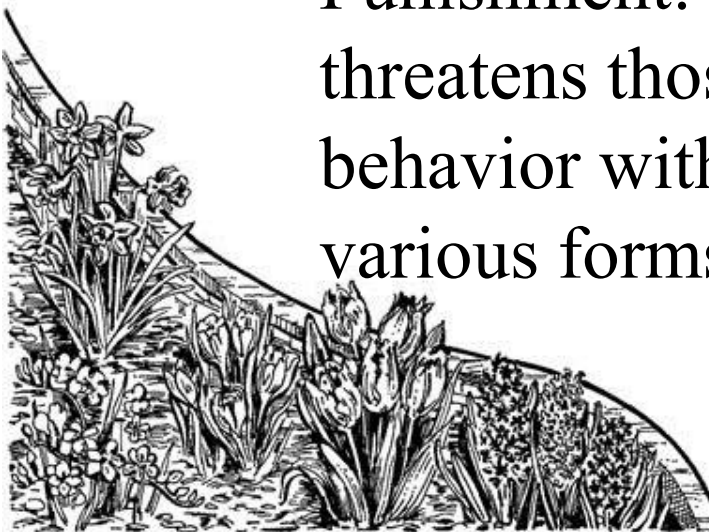
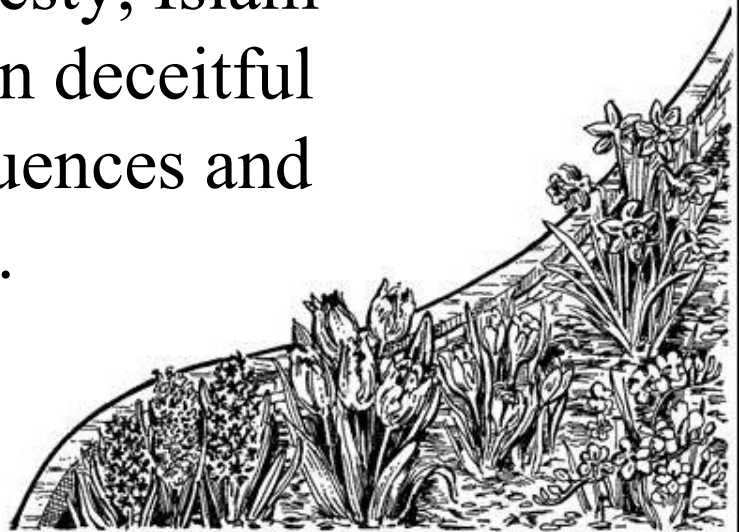
Building Honesty – Instructions & Reason

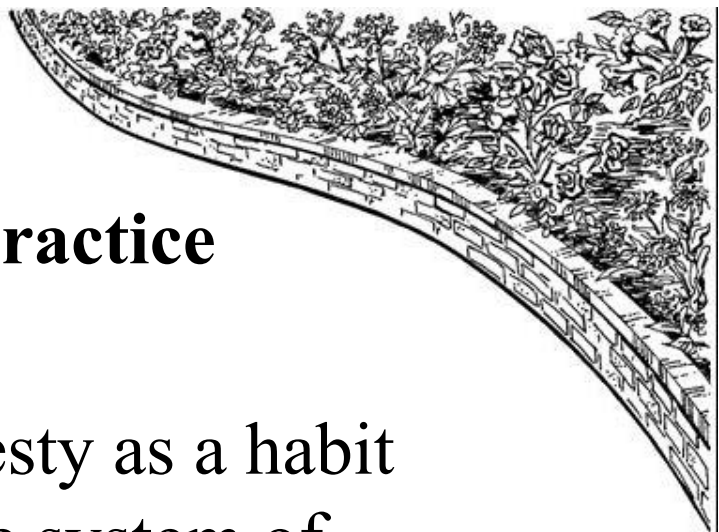
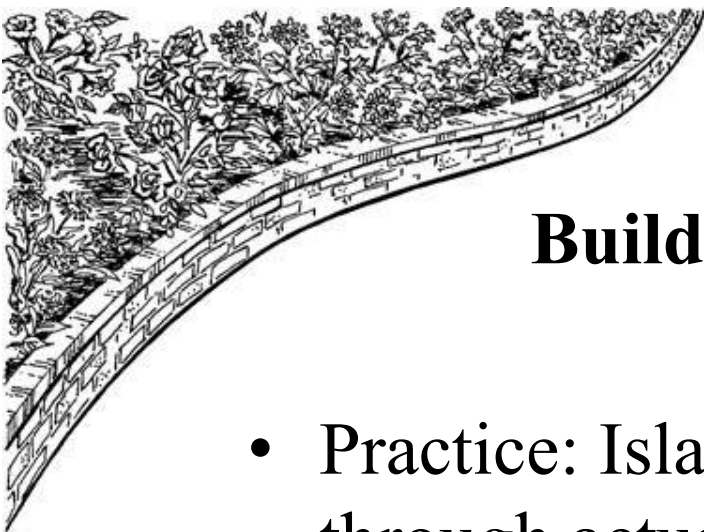
Islam employs multiple methods to cultivate ethical qualities, specifically honesty:

- Instructions: Allah (SWT) provides clear, abundant, and obvious instructions for Muslims to be honest in all circumstances—including their deeds, words, and dealings with others
 - Reason: Islam offers rational and logical proofs showing that honesty is the best policy, even on a utilitarian basis, explaining why integrity is essential for social well-being

Building Honesty – Reward & Pinishment

- Reward: Allah (SWT) promises generous rewards and blessings to the honest person, both in this life (through social trust and internal peace) and in the life hereafter.
 - Punishment: To deter dishonesty, Islam threatens those who engage in deceitful behavior with severe consequences and various forms of punishment.

Building Honesty – Practice

- Practice: Islam develops honesty as a habit through actual practice via the system of worship. For example, fasting is a private act of integrity known only to the individual and Allah, training the person to be honest even when no one else is watching
