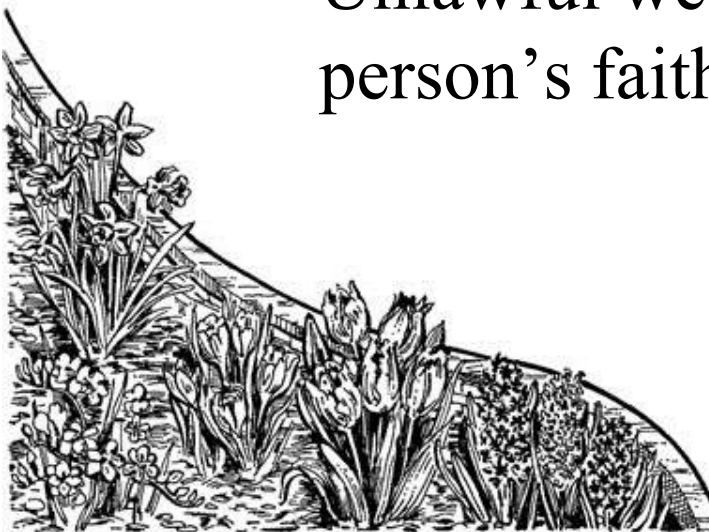


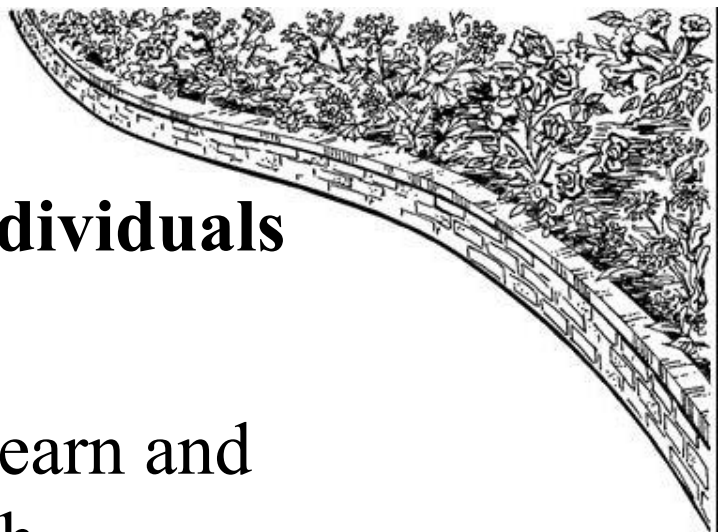
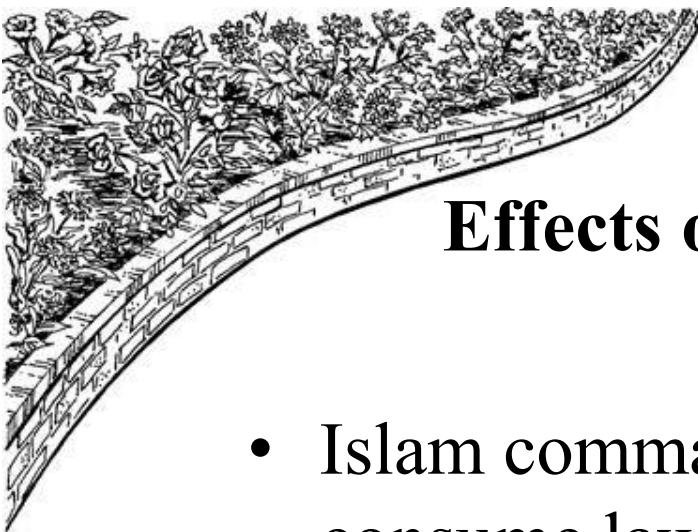
## Bribery and Islamic Teachings

- Bribery is a serious violation of Islamic ethics and undermines justice and fairness.
  - The Qur'an prohibits using wealth or bribes to gain unfair advantage or influence decisions.
  - Allah (SWT) says: "Do not consume one another's wealth unjustly or send it in bribery..." (2:188)
  - The Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) condemned both the giver and receiver of bribes.
  - Bribery is considered a major sin because it involves unlawful wealth and corruption.
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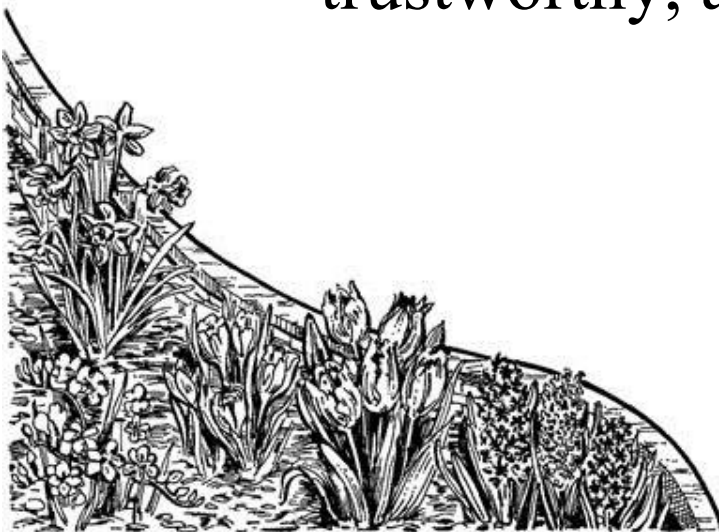


## **Effects of Bribery on Individuals and Society**

- Bribery leads to unlawful earnings (Haram) and can affect the acceptance of a person's supplications.
  - It promotes inequality, exploitation, corruption, and injustice.
  - Unlawful wealth can negatively affect a person's faith, character, and family.

- Islam commands Muslims to earn and consume lawful (Halal) wealth.
  - Muslims should uphold fairness, honesty, and integrity in all transactions.
  - Avoiding bribery helps build a just, trustworthy, and corruption-free society.
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
