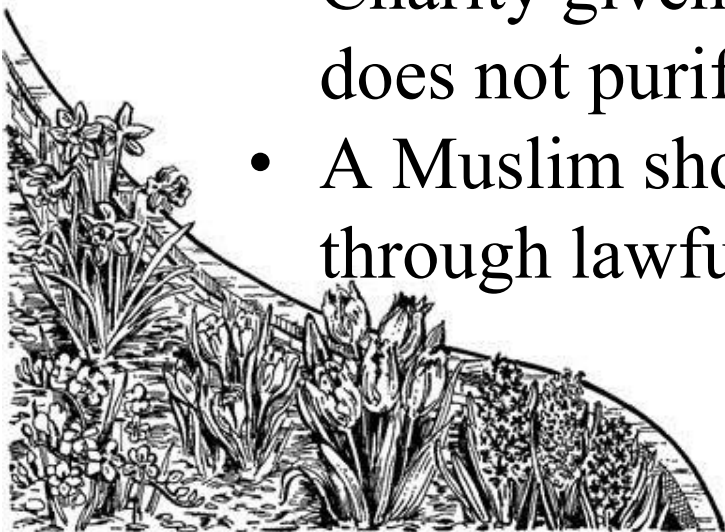
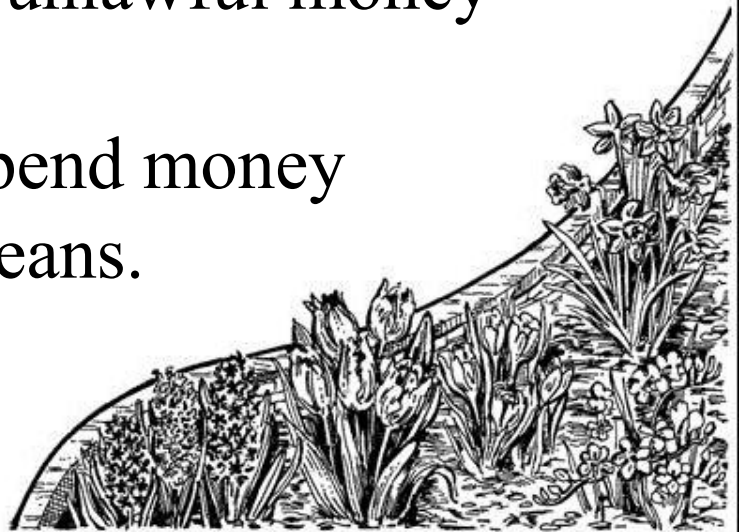
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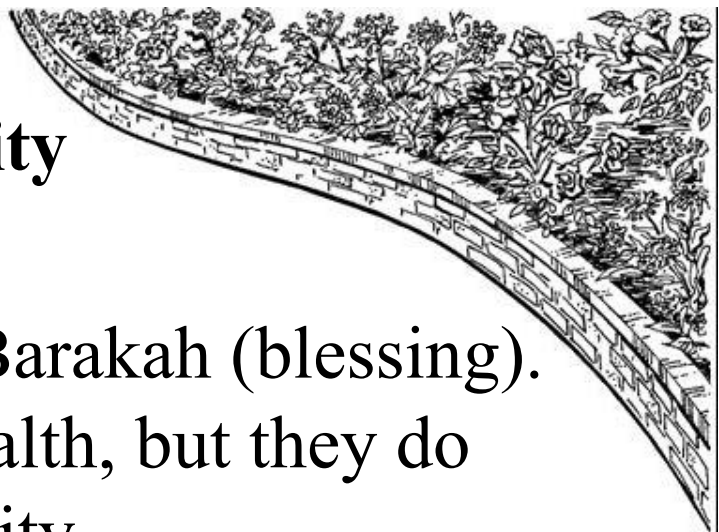
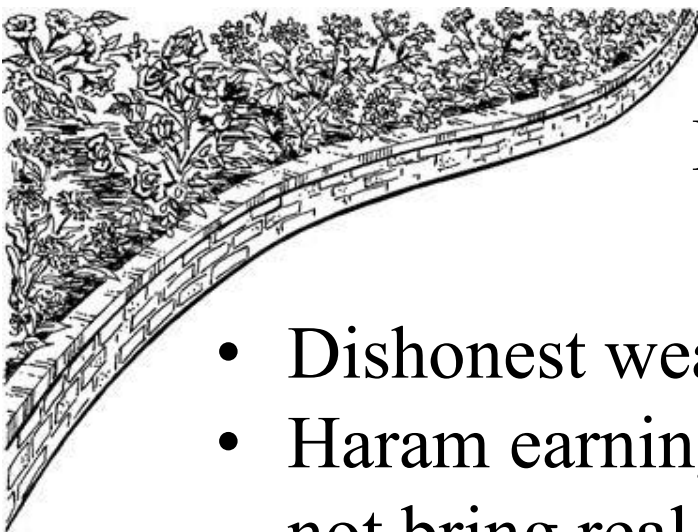
Understanding how dishonest actions in dealings violate Islamic ethics and harm society.



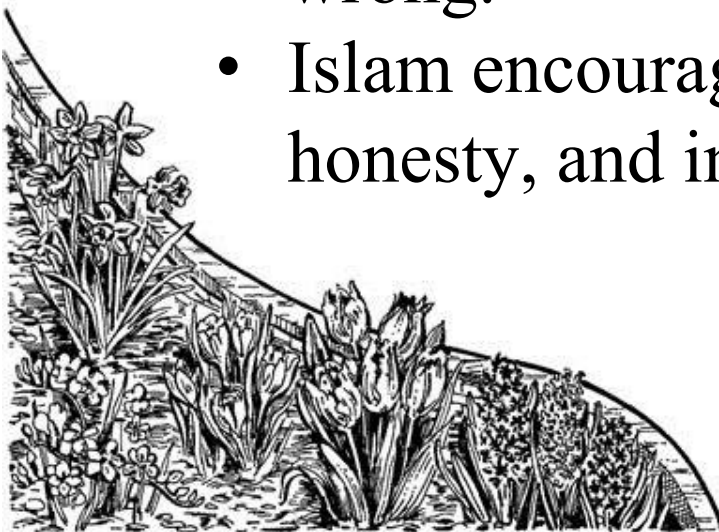


Effects of Dishonest Wealth

- Allah accepts only pure and lawful (Halal) earnings.
 - Worship and supplications may not be accepted when a person is sustained by Haram wealth.
 - Charity given from stolen or unlawful money does not purify that wealth.
 - A Muslim should earn and spend money through lawful and honest means.
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Loss of Prosperity

- Dishonest wealth has no true Barakah (blessing).
 - Haram earnings may bring wealth, but they do not bring real peace or prosperity.
 - Passing dishonest wealth to children can become a source of harm and sin.
 - One wrong cannot be corrected by another wrong.
 - Islam encourages Muslims to seek Halal income, honesty, and integrity.
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
