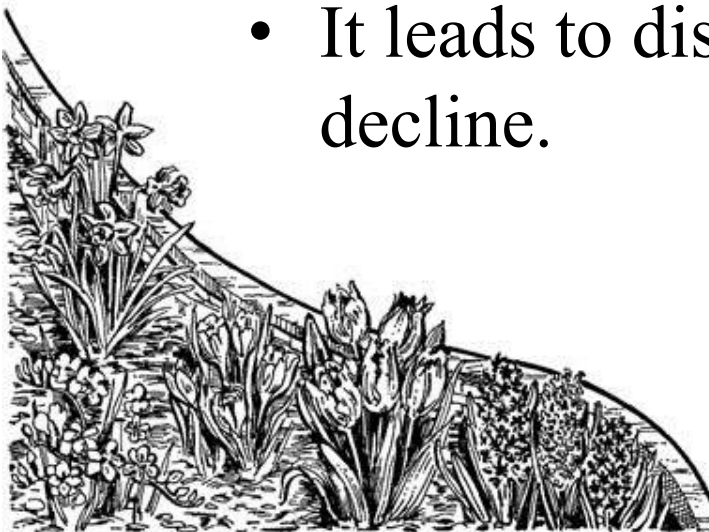
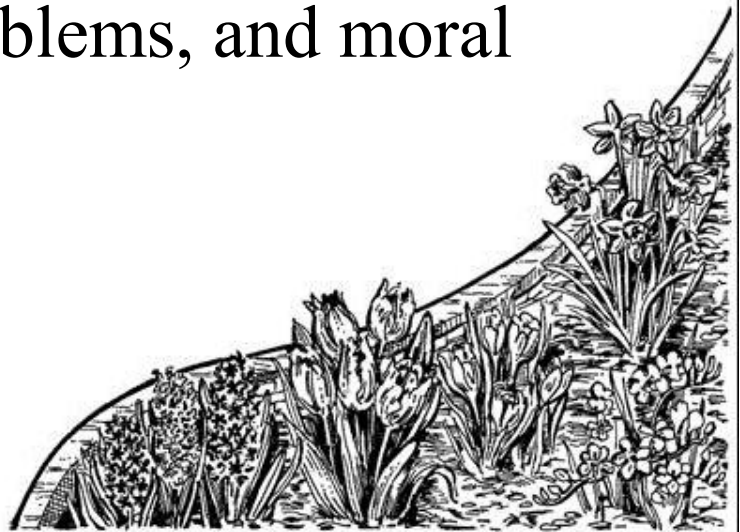


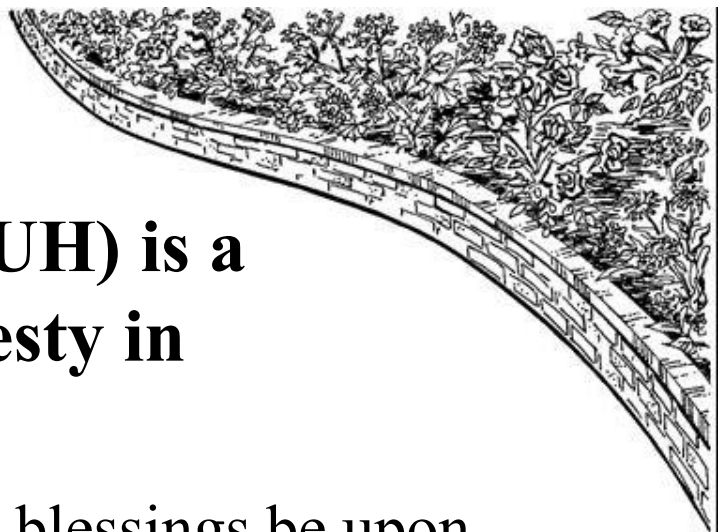
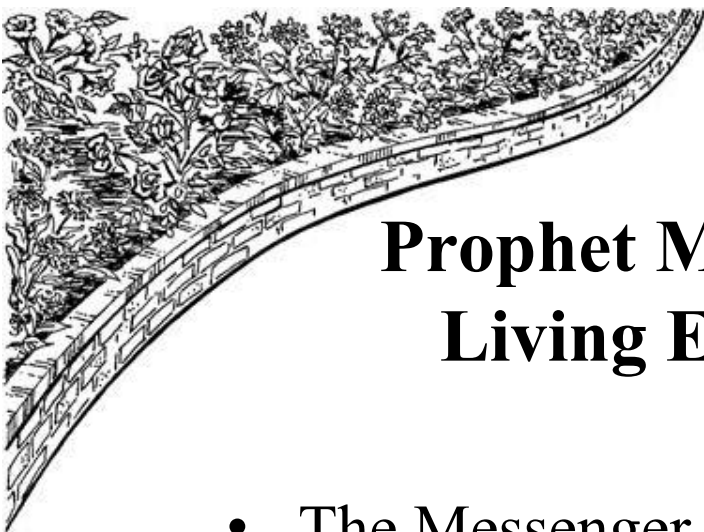
Needs and Benefits of Honesty

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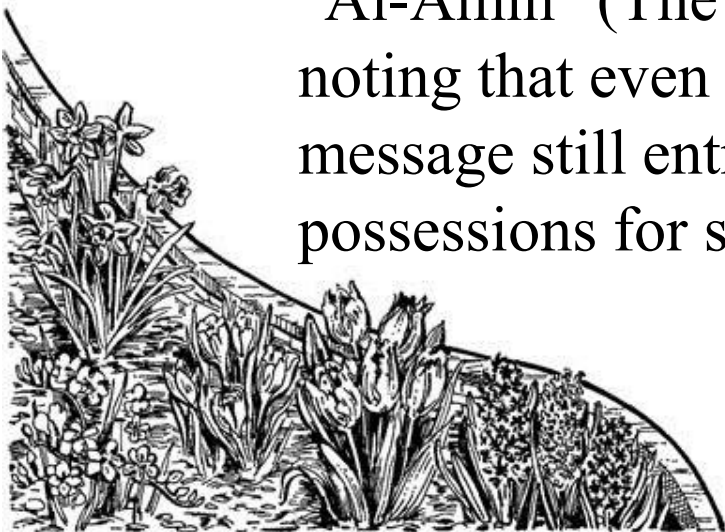
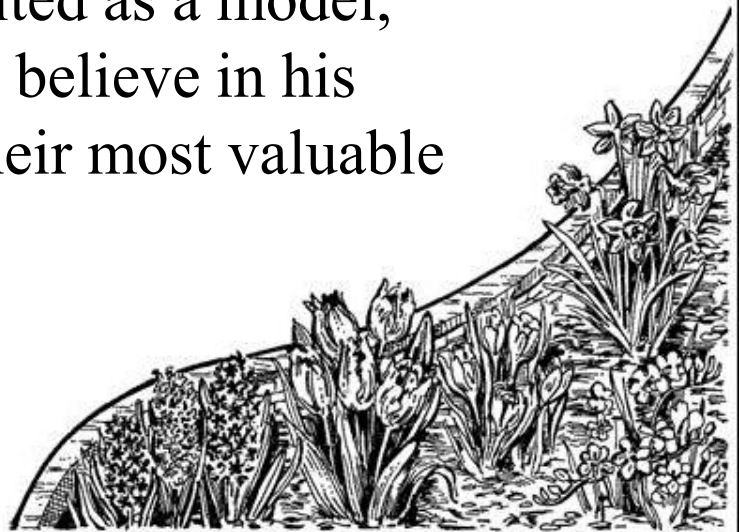


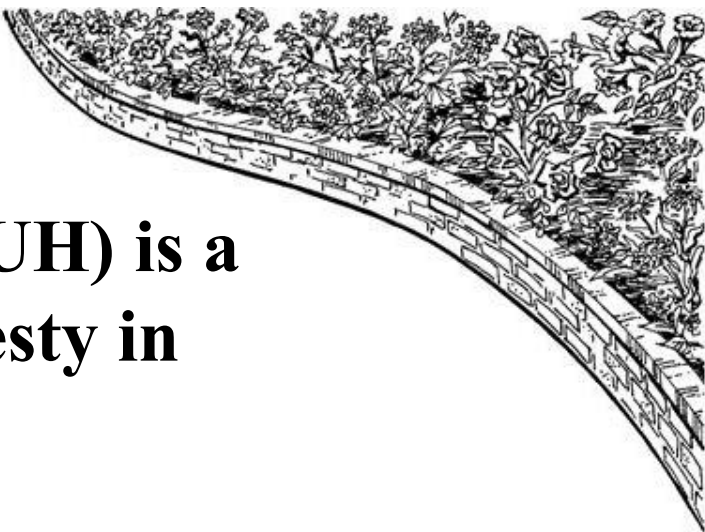
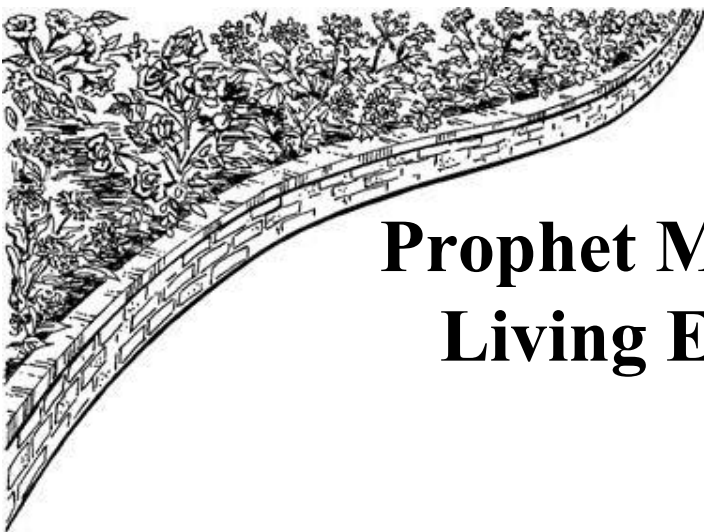
Reward of Honesty and Punishment of Dishonesty

 - Dishonesty is strongly condemned in Islam.
 - It leads to distrust, social problems, and moral decline.
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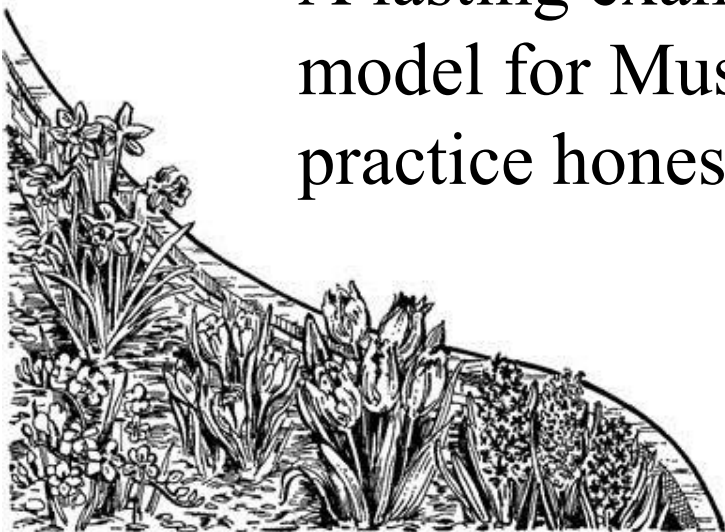


Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) is a Living Example of Honesty in Islam

- The Messenger of Allah, peace and blessings be upon him, said, “Verily, I have only been sent to perfect righteous character.”
 - The Model of Trust: The Prophet’s own reputation as "Al-Amin" (The Trustworthy) is cited as a model, noting that even those who did not believe in his message still entrusted him with their most valuable possessions for safekeeping.

- The Prophet Muhammad PBUH showed that being truthful is a sign of strong faith in Allah.
 - A lasting example: His truthful life remains a model for Muslims, encouraging them to practice honesty in everyday life.
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
