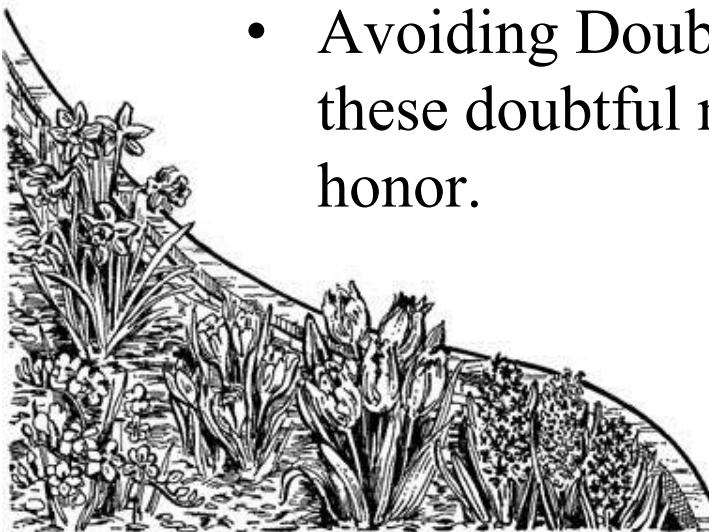
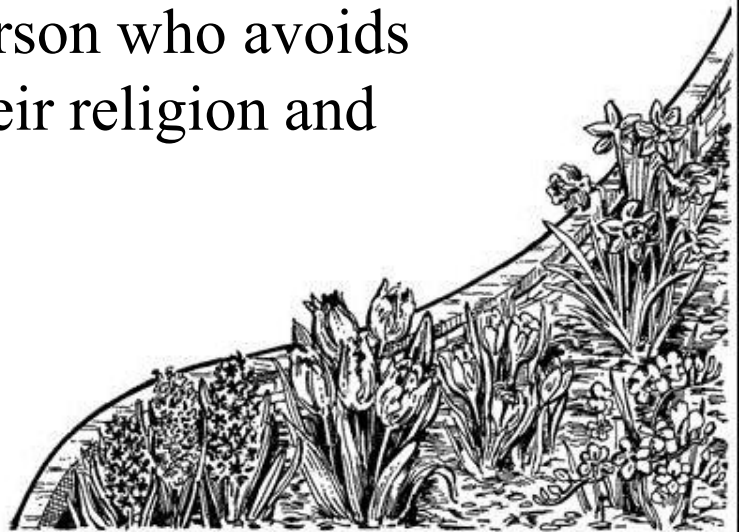
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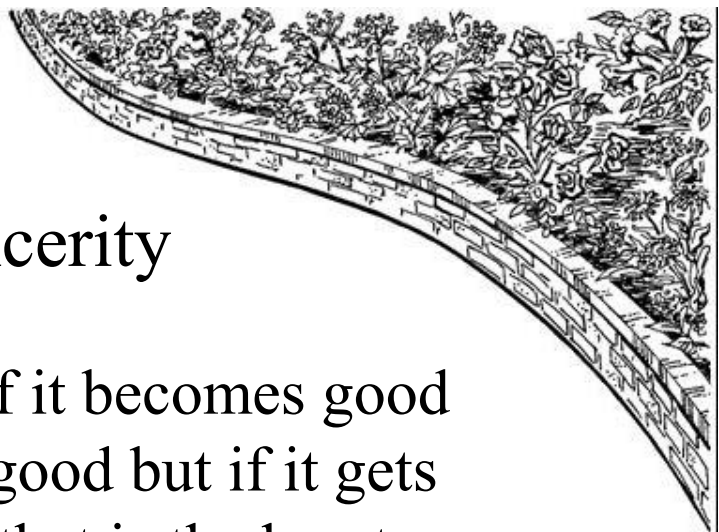
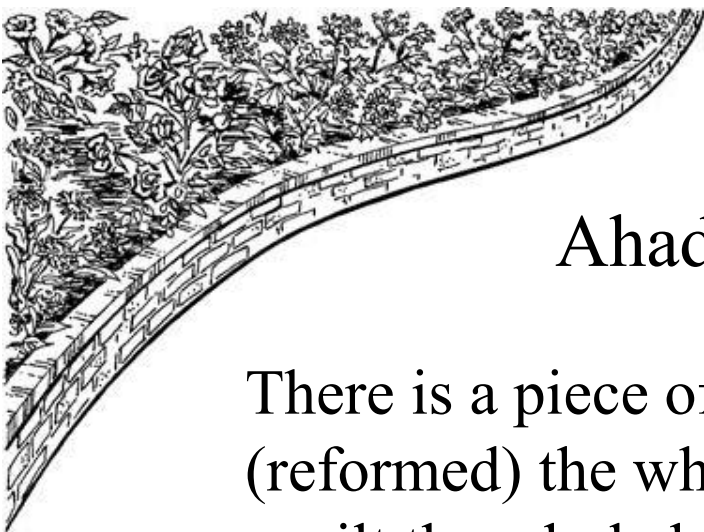
Distinguishing between authentic acts of worship and innovations (Biddah) by examining their conformity with the Quran and Sunnah.





Rejecting Innovation (Bid'ah)

- Any innovation introduced into the religion that is not part of it will be rejected, as mentioned in the Hadith of Hazrat Aisha (RA).
 - Halal and Haram: Islam clearly defines what is permissible (Halal) and forbidden (Haram).
 - Ambiguous Matters (Mushtabaha): Some matters fall into a doubtful area between Halal and Haram.
 - Avoiding Doubtful Matters: A person who avoids these doubtful matters protects their religion and honor.
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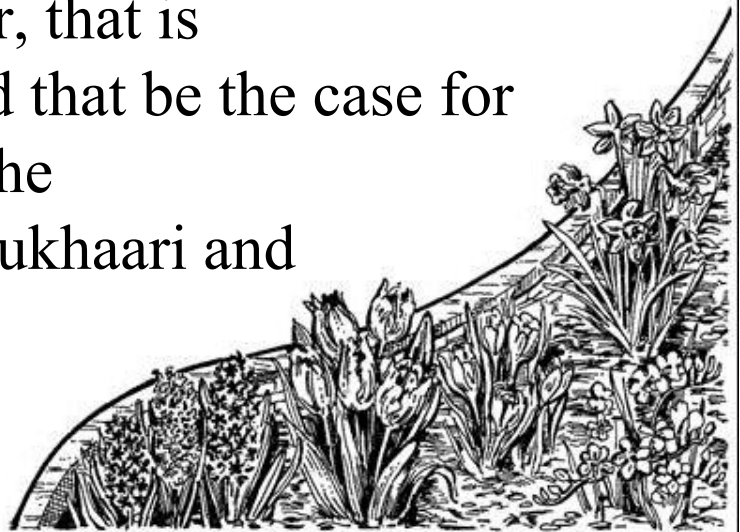
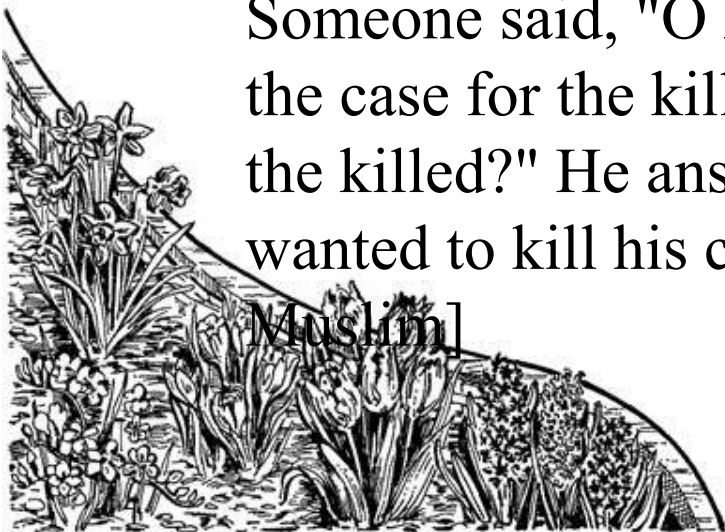


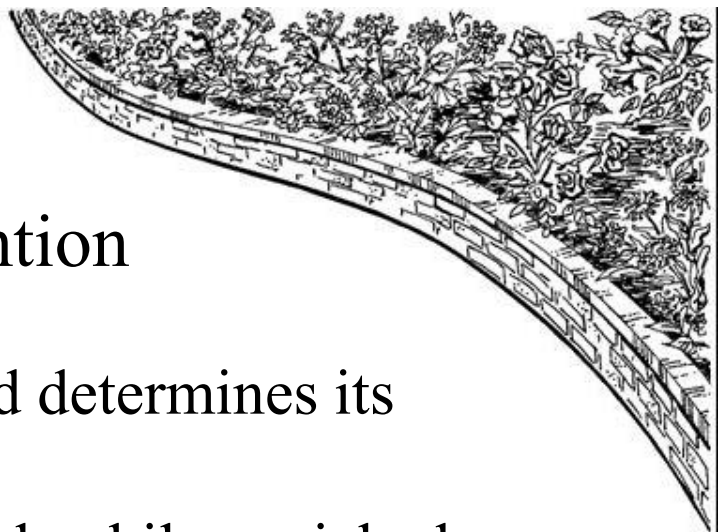
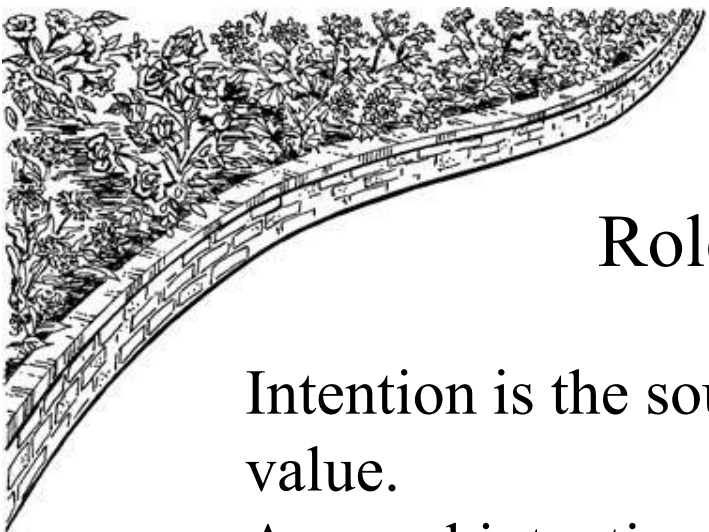
Ahadith regarding sincerity

There is a piece of flesh in the body if it becomes good (reformed) the whole body becomes good but if it gets spoilt the whole body gets spoilt and that is the heart.

Allah's Messenger has also said: "If two Muslims meet each other with their swords, then both the killer and the killed will be in the Hell-fire."

Someone said, "O Allah's Messenger, that is the case for the killer but why should that be the case for the killed?" He answered, "Because he wanted to kill his companion." [Al-Bukhaari and Muslim]





Role of sincere intention

Intention is the soul of every deed and determines its value.

A sound intention makes a deed sound, while a wicked intention makes the deed wicked.

Sincere intention is essential for the acceptance and validity of deeds.

Intention is not merely words spoken by the tongue or a thought in the mind; it is the driving force in the heart behind an action.

A sincere intention directs a person to perform deeds for the sake of Allah and to fulfill His Commands.
