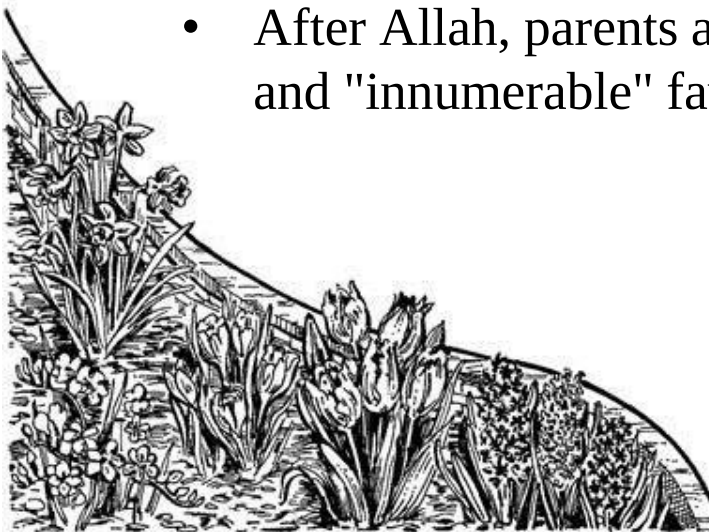
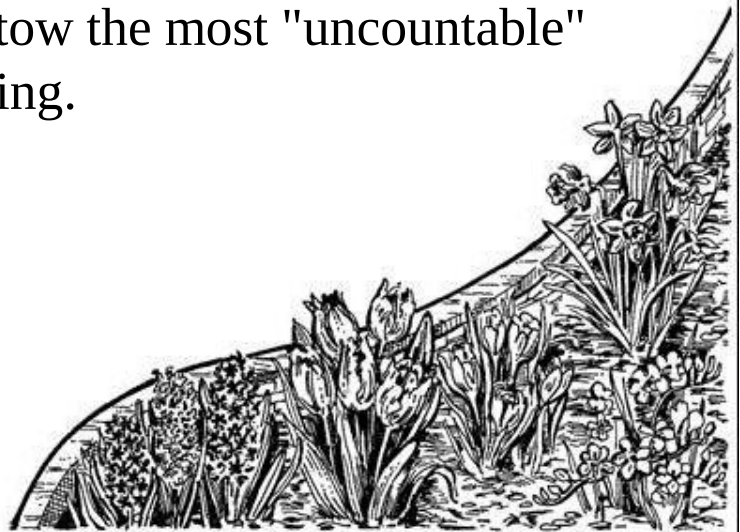


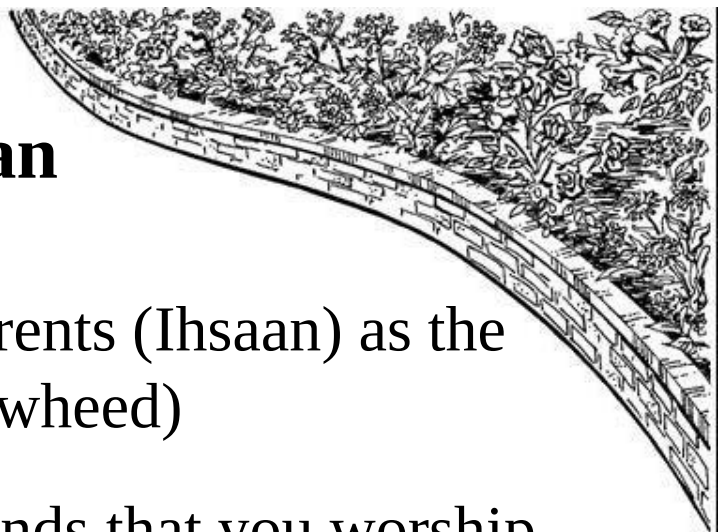
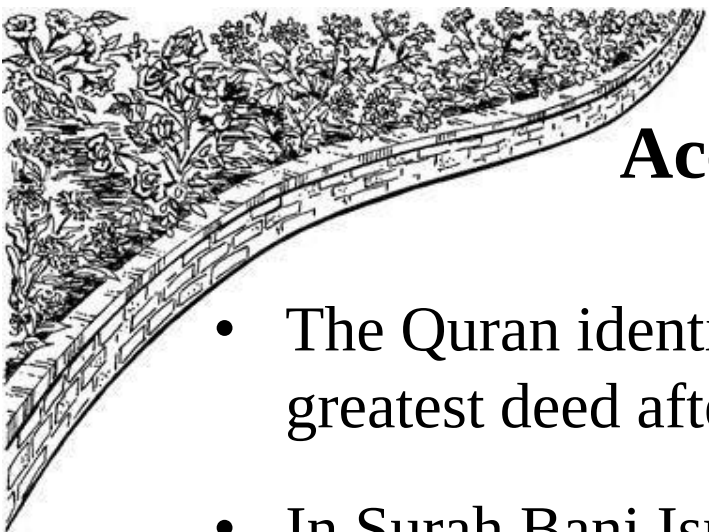
Family as the Foundation of Society

- The family is the basic and strongest unit of society in Islam.
 - Islam emphasizes the relationship between husband and wife as well as the rights and responsibilities of parents.
 - A stable and healthy home contributes to social stability.
 - The family environment plays an important role in shaping a child's character.
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Rights and Responsibilities of Parents

- In Islam, rights and obligations are reciprocal: the rights of parents are the responsibilities of children.
 - Parents provide their children with countless and selfless favors.
 - Their love, care, protection, and support are given without expecting compensation.
 - Parents deserve kindness, respect, and good treatment.
 - After Allah, parents are the beings who bestow the most "uncountable" and "innumerable" favors upon a human being.
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According to Quran

- The Quran identifies kindness to parents (Ihsaan) as the greatest deed after Monotheism (Tawheed)
 - In Surah Bani Israeel, Allah commands that you worship none but Him and treat parents with excellence.
 - This "good turn" (Ihsaan) involves:
 - ☐ Obedience and respect in all spheres of life
 - ☐ Speaking softly and avoiding harsh words, especially when parents reach old age
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
