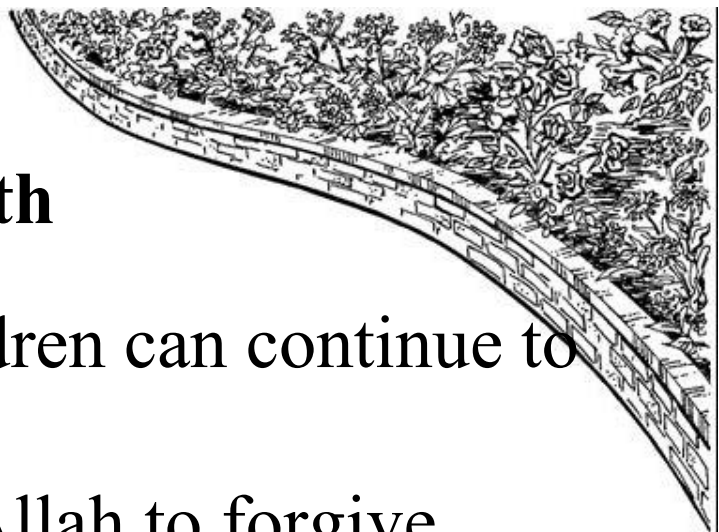
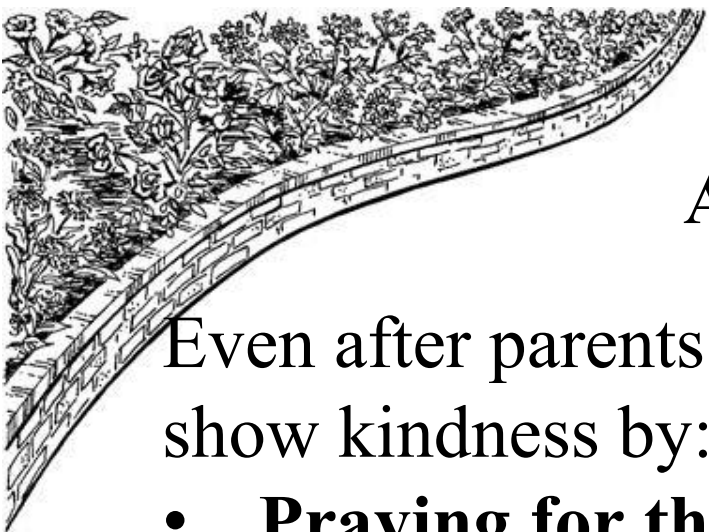




No Paradise for Him

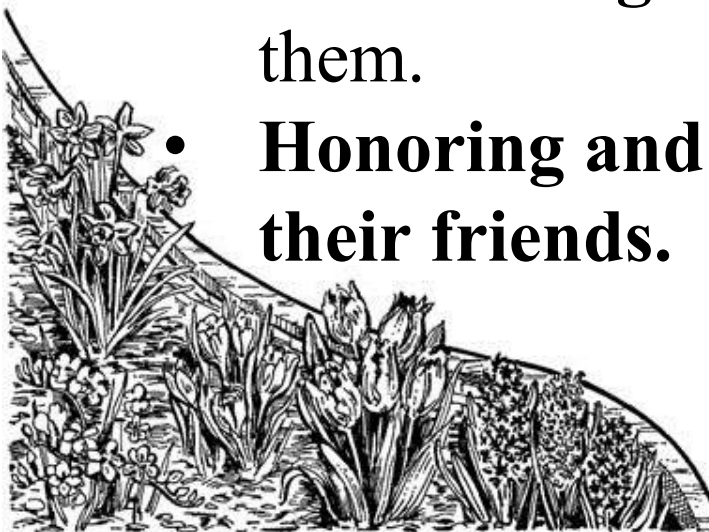
The Prophet (PBUH) strongly warned against neglecting elderly parents.

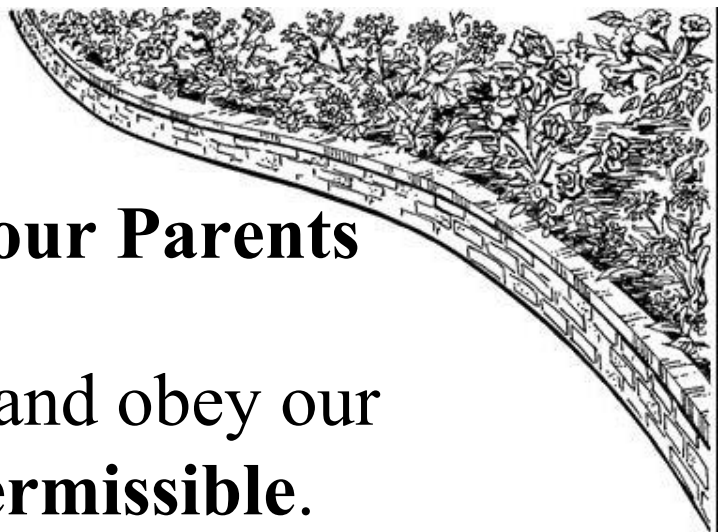
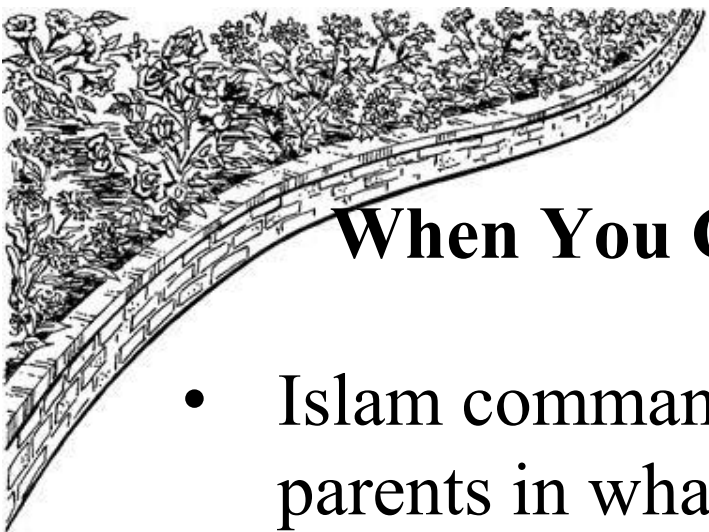
- He said that a person who finds one or both parents in old age but does not earn Paradise through serving them has suffered a great loss.

 - We should show parents respect, patience, kindness, and gratitude.

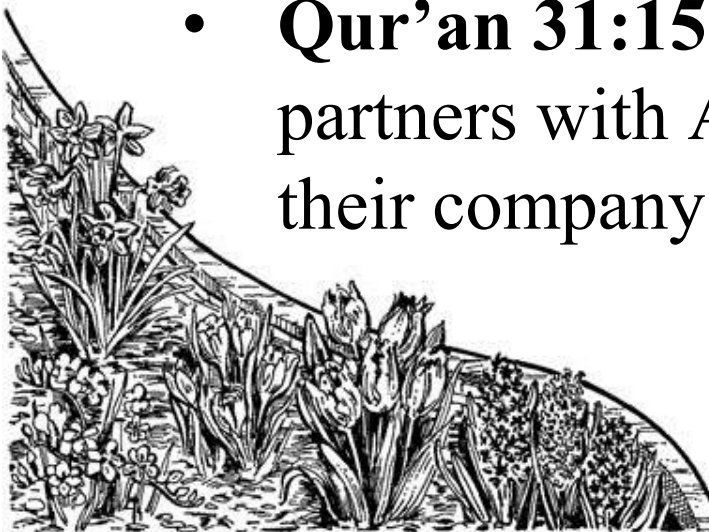
After Their Death

When You Cannot Obey Your Parents

- Islam commands us to respect and obey our parents in what is **right and permissible**.
 - However, if parents tell us to **associate partners with Allah**, we must not obey them.
 - Even then, we must continue to treat them with **kindness, justice, and respect**.
 - **Qur'an 31:15:** If they urge you to associate partners with Allah, do not obey them, but keep their company in this world with kindness.
