What is culture?

A group of people's shared values, beliefs, customs, and behaviors.

It's a way of life that includes language, food, art, music, and religion.

What does culture
include?





1. **Values:** The beliefs and ideals that a group of people share

2. **Language:** The words and symbols used by a group of people

3. **Customs:** The ways of life that a group of people share

4. **Material objects:** The tools, techniques, and works of art that a group of people share

5. **Practices:** The ways that a group of people act, think, and behave

Types of culture

Types of CULTURE

- **Material culture** refers to the concrete and tangible things that man creates and uses. They range from the prehistoric stone tools of primitive man to the most advanced computer of the modern man
- **Non-material culture** consists of words people use; the habits they follow; the ideas, customs and behavior that any society professes and to which they strive to conform. Laws, techniques, lifestyle, and knowledge are included, too.



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What is culture?

Culture is shared values, norms, traditions, customs, history, and beliefs of a group of people.

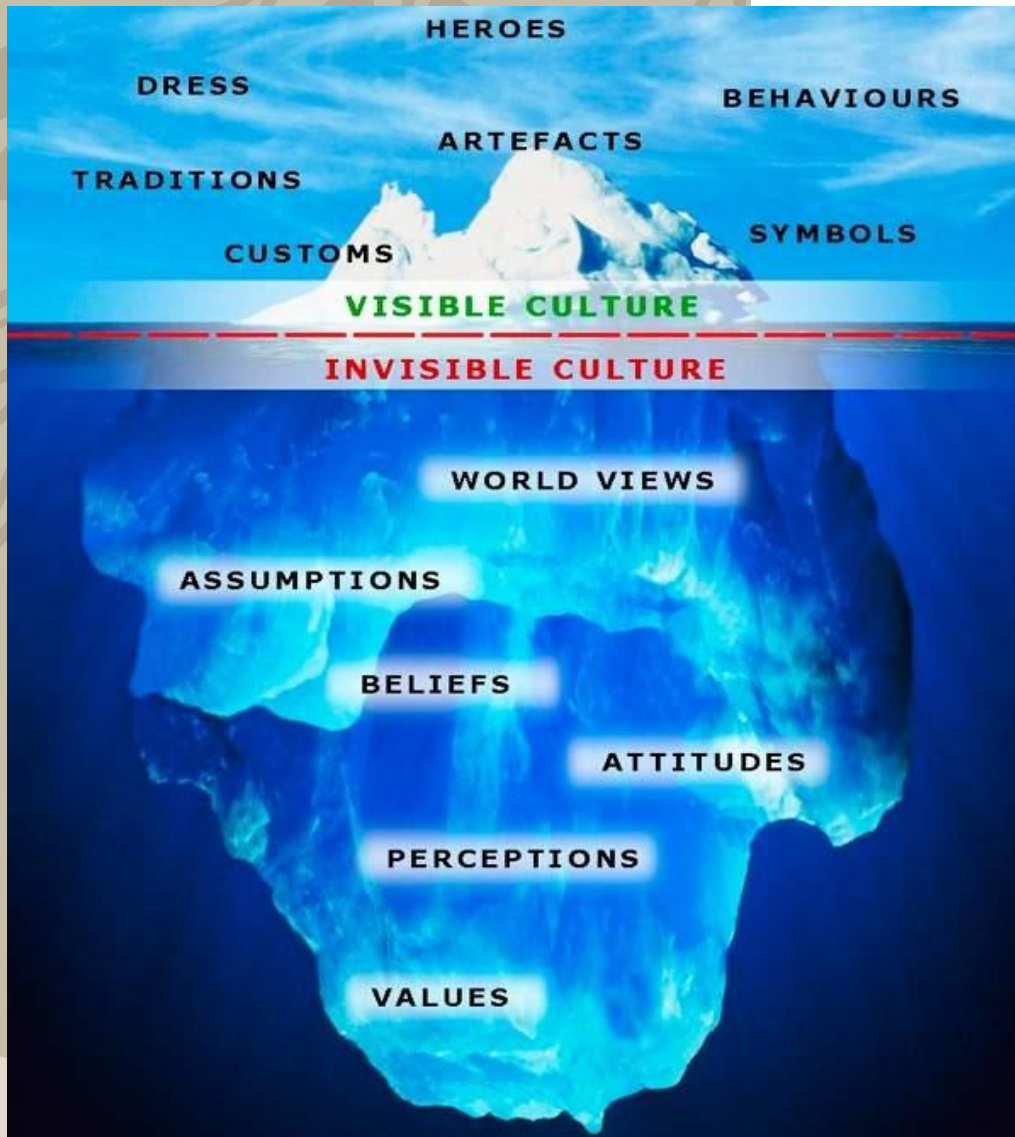
Culture has a multitude of aspects.

Cultural factors include geography, age, social economic status, religion, gender, education, language, politics, sexual orientation, and not just Reese, language, ethnicity.

Culture shapes how people experience their world, make decisions about quality of life, work and how people relate to others.

It's dynamic. One of the most important aspect of culture is **what is not seen**, that which controls values and thought patterns.

Cultural diversity

The variety of cultural expressions, practices, and identities that exist within a society or community, encompassing different backgrounds, languages, traditions, and beliefs that shape individuals and groups

What is cultural diversity also known as?

Cultural diversity is synonymous with multiculturalism. Multiculturalism is defined by the Encyclopedia Britannica as, “the view that cultures, races, and ethnicities, particularly those of minority groups, deserve special acknowledgment of their differences within a dominant political culture.



Culture

a way of life of a group of people – the behaviors, beliefs, values, and symbols that they accept, generally without thinking about them, and that are passed along by communication and imitation from one generation to the next.

Diversity

each individual is unique and different from one another – race, ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, socio-economic status, age, physical abilities, religious beliefs, political beliefs, experiences, and other ideologies.

What are the 4 types of cultural diversity?

Internal

internal diversity is all about any characteristics and traits an individual is born with. These include assigned sex, ethnicity, gender, race, nationality, sexual orientation, and physical ability, **Internal Diversity refers to the components that one can't control - age, gender, sexual orientation, ethnicity, race, and physical/mental ability.**

External

which includes things such as your education, religious beliefs, socioeconomic status, and even your relationship status. Examples: **education, personal experiences, socioeconomic status, spirituality, religion, citizenship, geographic location, or family status.**

Organizational

the differences between people in a workplace. It includes differences in job roles, work experience, age, gender, race, ethnicity, and more.

Worldview

political beliefs, moral values, general outlook on life and other aspects, Varied philosophical beliefs and ethical values across different cultures
