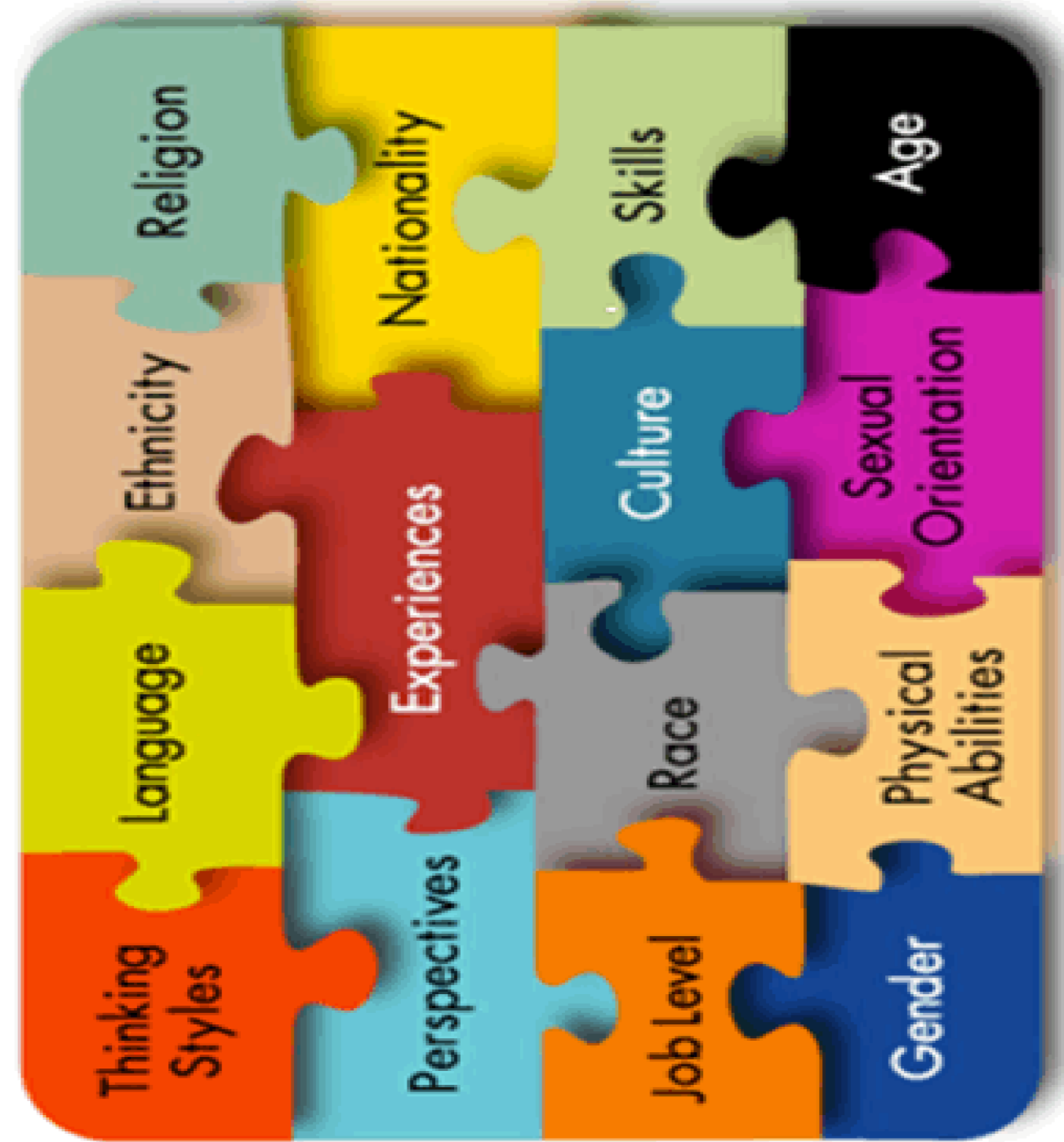

# What is diversity

Diversity is the range of human differences, including but not limited to race, ethnicity, gender, gender identity, sexual orientation, age, social class, physical ability or attributes, religious or ethical values system, national origin, and political beliefs.

OR

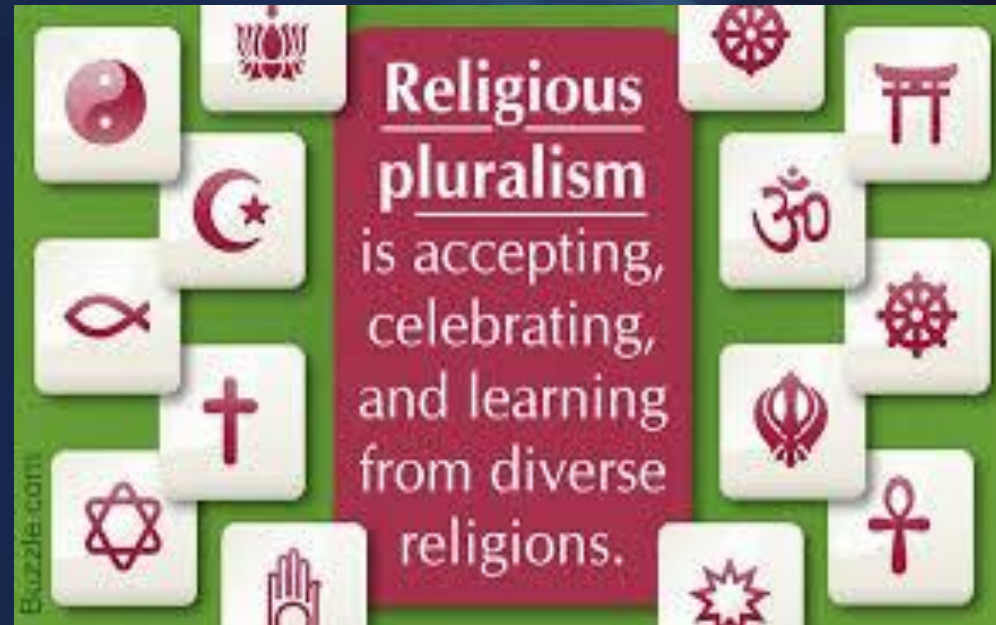
Diversity is a satisfying mix of ideas, cultures, races, genders, economic statuses and other characteristics necessary for promoting growth and learning among a group

# Religious pluralism



Religious pluralism is the attitude of accepting the diversity of religious beliefs in a society. Interfaith dialogue is a way to reduce conflicts between people of different religions.

# Religious diversity and religious pluralism

**Religious diversity** simply refers to the existence of multiple religions within a society

**Religious pluralism** goes further by describing a positive attitude towards this diversity, encouraging respect, understanding, and dialogue between different religious groups,

Example:

- Diversity:**

- A city with a large population of Hindus, Muslims, Christians, and Sikhs represents religious diversity.

- Pluralism:**

- A community where these different religious groups actively engage in interfaith events, respect each other's practices, and advocate for the freedom to worship according to their beliefs demonstrates religious pluralism.



# How religious diversity varies

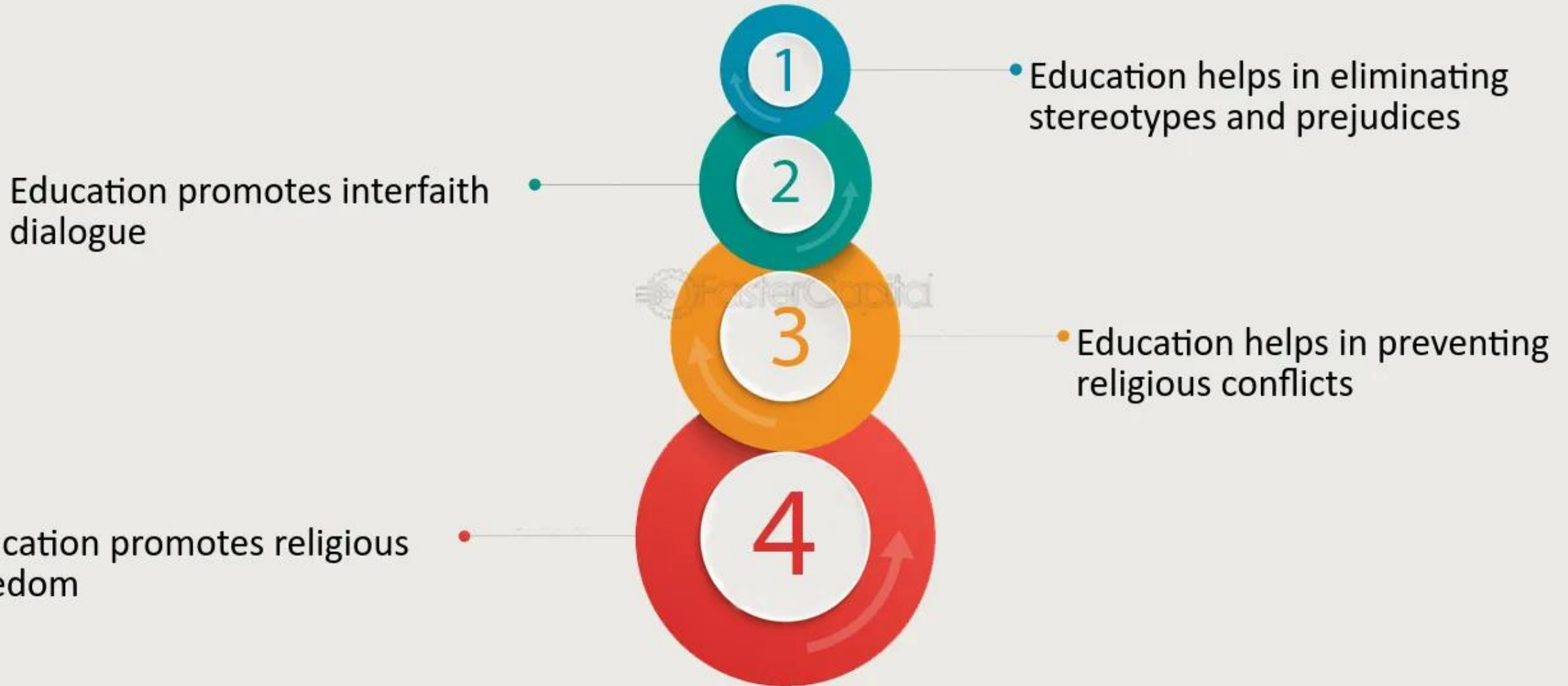
**Geographic region:** The level of religious diversity varies by region

**Historical context:** The development of religious diversity has been influenced by travel, publishing, and emigration.

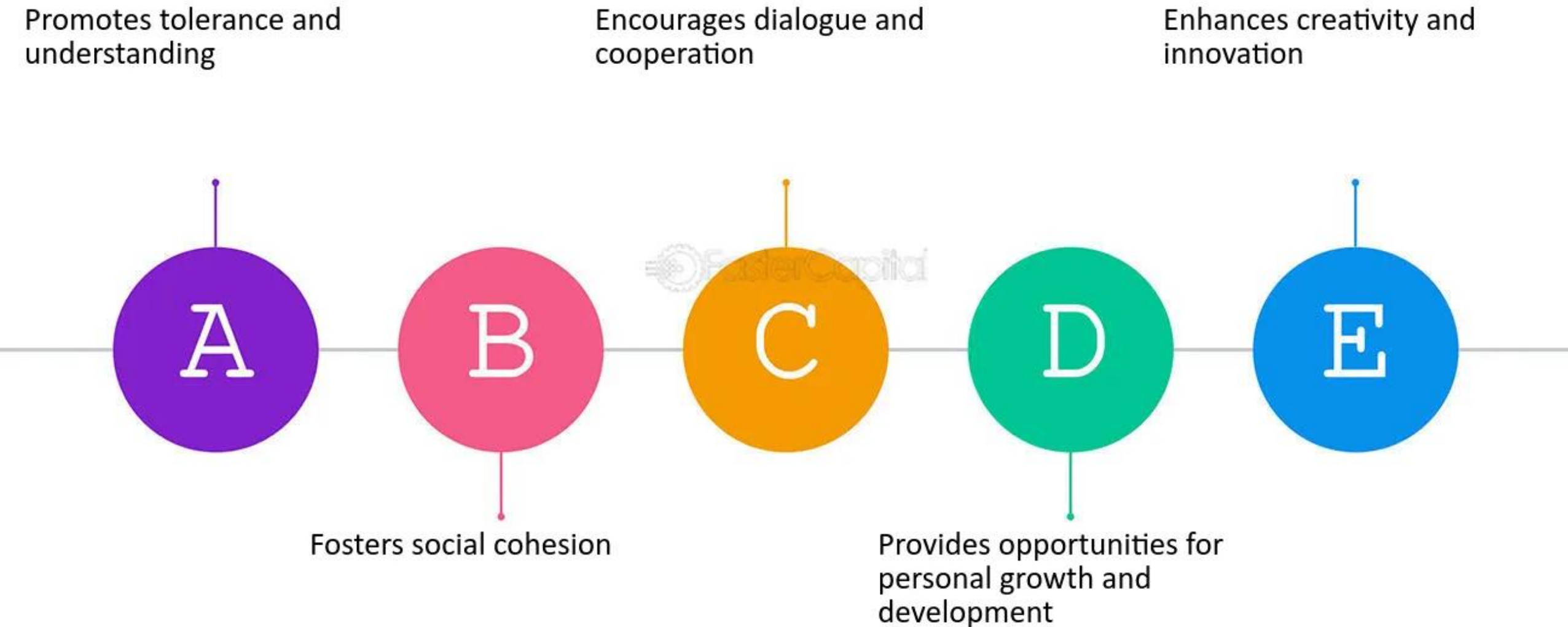
## Philosophical perspectives

- **Pluralistic:** The idea that all religions are equally good, within certain limits
- **Exclusivist:** The idea that only one religion is uniquely valuable
- **Epistemic obligation:** Whether people who hold exclusive beliefs have an obligation to consider their beliefs in the face of diversity
- **Justified belief:** Whether assessing beliefs can resolve conflicts between people with different beliefs
- **Religious tolerance:** Whether acknowledging diversity can lead to greater tolerance

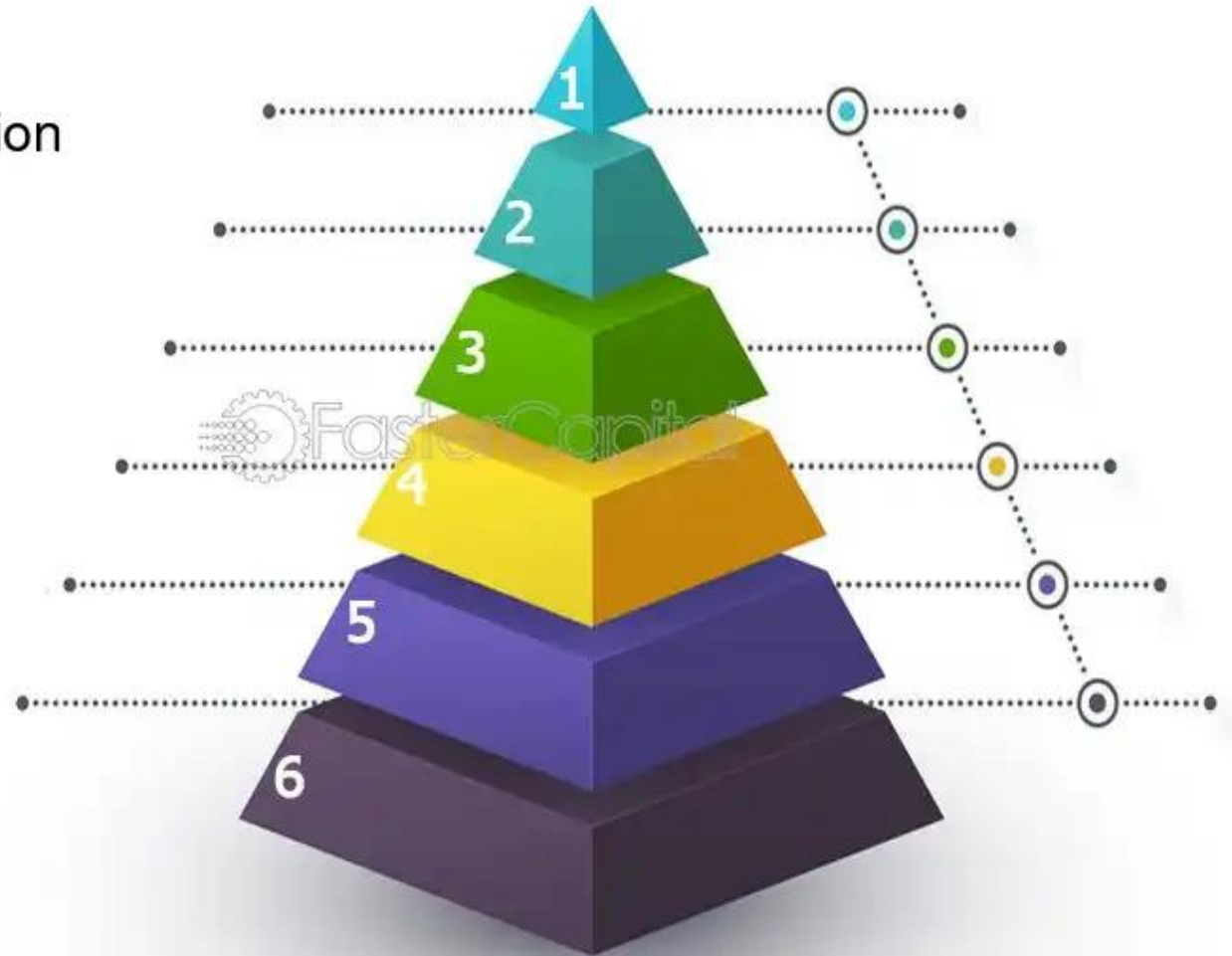
